TORNADO SAFETY TIPS

- Sirens are tested the FIRST SATURDAY of the month at 12:00 noon for 3 minutes
- During a Tornado WARNING the sirens will sound for 3 minutes every 7 minutes for the duration of the WARNING

TORNADO WATCH WHAT IT MEANS AND WHAT TO DO:

• Tornadoes, thunderstorms or both are possible. Listen to radio and television for weather reports and watch for changing weather

TORNADO WARNING WHAT IT MEANS AND WHAT TO DO:

 A tornado has been sighted and may be headed your way. Seek shelter right away.

WHAT TO DO AT HOME:

Have tornado drills. Pick a safe place where your family can meet in an emergency. Keep an emergency supply kit nearby containing flashlight, battery operated radio, extra batteries, canned food, water, and a first aid kit. KEEP CALM. Stay in your shelter until the storm is over and the danger has passed. After the tornado, keep away from damaged areas and fallen power lines.

WHERE TO TAKE SHELTER:

- **Basement or storm cellar.** Stay away from windows, doors and walls that face the outside.
- Smallest room, closet or hallway near the middle of your house on the lowest level possible.
- **Bathtub.** Cover yourself with a blanket or cushions from the couch.
- Under a heavy table, bed or stairs. They are safer and sturdier
