RESOLUTION NO. 118-23 Fire Department Additional Levy 2.0 Mills

**RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF
THE TEN MILL LIMITATION FOR FIRE PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of Bazetta Township Trumbull County, Ohio and it is necessary to levy taxes in excess of the limitation; and

WHEREAS, a Resolution declaring the necessity of levying a tax outside the ten-mill limitation must be passed by the Board of Trustees and certified to the County Auditor under R.C. R.C. §505.37, R.C. 5705.19(I) and R.C. 5705.191 in order to permit the Board to consider the levy of such a tax and must request that the County Auditor certify to the Board of Trustees the information required under R.C. §5705.03; therefore;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Bazetta Township, Trumbull County, Ohio, all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy an additional tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the benefit of Bazetta Township for Fire Purposes. As provided in R.C. §5703.03(B)(1) the Board states as follows:

(a) The proposed rate of the tax shall be 2.0 mills for each one dollar of taxable value.

(b) The purpose of the tax shall be:

For providing and maintaining fire apparatus, mechanical resuscitators, underwater rescue and recovery equipment, or other fire equipment and appliances, buildings and sites therefor, or sources of water supply and materials therefor, for the establishment and maintenance of lines of fire-alarm communications, for the payment of firefighting companies or permanent, part-time, or volunteer firefighting, emergency medical service, administrative, or communications personnel to operate the same, including the payment of any employer contributions required for such personnel under section 145.48 or 742.34 of the Revised Code, for the purchase of ambulance equipment, for the provision of ambulance, paramedic, or other emergency medical services operated by a fire department or firefighting company, or for the payment of other related costs.

(c) The tax is an additional levy.

(d) The sections of the Revised Code authorizing submission of the question of the tax are:
R.C. §505.37, R.C. §5705.19(I) and R.C. §5705.191.

(e) The tax is for a continuing period of time.

(f) The tax is to be levied upon the entire territory of Bazetta Township.

(g) The date of the election at which the question of the tax shall appear on the ballot is
May 2, 2023.

(h) The ballot measure shall be submitted to the entire territory of Bazetta Township.

(i) The tax year in which the tax will first be levied is 2023 and the calendar year in which
the tax will first be collected is 2024.

(j) Bazetta Township is wholly located in Trumbull County, Ohio.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fiscal Officer shall certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor with the request that said County Auditor certify to this Board of Trustees pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §5705.03(B)(2) the following:

- (a) The total current tax valuation of Bazetta Township.
- (b) The following, calculated using the tax list for the current year, and if this is not determined, the estimated amount submitted by the auditor to the county budget commission:
 - (i) The levy's rate, 2.0 mills, expressed in dollars, rounded to the nearest dollar, for each one hundred thousand dollars of the county auditor's appraised value.
- (c) The dollar amount of revenue, rounded to the nearest dollar, that would be generated by a levy of 2.0 mills for each one dollar of taxable value.
- (d) An estimate of the levy's annual collections, rounded to the nearest one thousand dollars, which shall be calculated assuming that the amount of the tax list of the taxing authority remains throughout the life of the levy the same as the amount of the tax list for the current year, and if this is not determined, the estimated amount submitted by the auditor to the county budget commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED upon certification of the County Auditor and adoption of a Resolution to Proceed by the Board of Trustees that the provisions of said tax levy be submitted under the authority of Ohio Revised Code §5705.03, §5705.19(I) and §5705.191 to the electors of the entire territory of said Bazetta Township, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §5705.25, in the special election to be held on the 2nd day of May, 2023.

**RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF

(h) The ballot measure shall be submitted to the entire territory of Bazetta Township.

(i) The tax year in which the tax will first be levied is 2023 and the calendar year in which the tax will first be collected is 2024.

(j) Bazetta Township is wholly located in Trumbull County, Ohio.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fiscal Officer shall certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor with the request that said County Auditor certify to this Board of Trustees pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §5705.03(B)(2) the following:

- (a) The total current tax valuation of Bazetta Township.
- (b) The following, calculated using the tax list for the current year, and if this is not determined, the estimated amount submitted by the auditor to the county budget commission:
 - (i) The levy's rate, 2.0 mills, expressed in dollars, rounded to the nearest dollar, for each one hundred thousand dollars of the county auditor's appraised value.
- (c) The dollar amount of revenue, rounded to the nearest dollar, that would be generated by a levy of 2.0 mills for each one dollar of taxable value.
- (d) An estimate of the levy's annual collections, rounded to the nearest one thousand dollars, which shall be calculated assuming that the amount of the tax list of the taxing authority remains throughout the life of the levy the same as the amount of the tax list for the current year, and if this is not determined, the estimated amount submitted by the auditor to the county budget commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED upon certification of the County Auditor and adoption of a Resolution to Proceed by the Board of Trustees that the provisions of said tax levy be submitted under the authority of Ohio Revised Code §5705.03, §5705.19(I) and §5705.191 to the electors of the entire territory of said Bazetta Township, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §5705.25, in the special election to be held on the 2nd day of May, 2023.

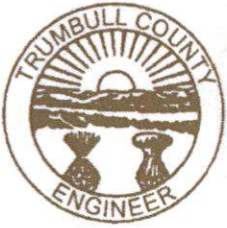

As utilized last year, ODOT is once again using the Location Based Response System (LBRS) data which has been provided by Digital Data Technologies Incorporated (DDTI) with annual redrives. This LBRS data has provided and will continue to provide a current, countywide, spatially accurate, and accessible street centerline system for every roadway in our county.

The attached annual mileage certification forms verify the total road mileage for the 2022 year. ODOT uses this verified mileage to calculate the amount of road tax money to be paid to each township. Your verified mileage as of December 31, 2022 is **20.408** miles and ODOT records show no adjustment for this year.
