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# REGULAR MEETING HELD JANUARY 20, 2004

Meeting in regular session with members Bates, Glancy and Piros present.

Mr. Glancy asked for old business.

Mr. Bates said he had met with union representatives about adopting policies for a drug free workplace and light duty following on the job injuries. Both policies would help reduce Workers' Compensation premiums.

Mr. Piros said he had been investigating the cost of sending out a township newsletter or flyer. He said he would proceed with more specific costs if everyone was agreed they were interested in publishing a newsletter.

He also said he had investigated a complaint about water drainage on Larchmont. He had invited the two property owners involved in the dispute to attend the Trustees' meeting.

Gus Polychronis, Larchmont Avenue, told Trustees that Mr. Bowman's assertion that he had built up his property so that it drained on Mr. Bowman's property was not true.

Donald Bowman, Larchmont Avenue, told Trustees that he constantly has water lying on his property and he did not have the problem prior to Mr. Polychronis' construction of storage building next door.

Shirley Pease, Larchmont Avenue, told Trustees that she was a neighbor, and she agreed that Mr. Bowman had not previously had water drainage problems.

Bud Bowen, Elm Road, told Mr. Bowman he had been involved in a similar drainage dispute and civil court was the only solution.

Legal Counsel Finamore told Mr. Bowman his drainage problem was not the township's responsibility.

Mr. Glancy said he had scheduled a meeting with the Trumbull County Commissioners, but the meeting did not take place.

He also announced the Trumbull County Board of Health would hold their regular monthly meetings at the Bazetta Township Administration Building on February 18<sup>th</sup> and March 17<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Piros announced Trustees will meet with Northview Drive residents and Sanitary Engineer Tom Holloway on February 25<sup>th</sup> to discuss the cost analysis of sewer installation on that street.

Bud Bowen asked about the status of Mr. Glancy's investigation of misfiled tax accounts.

Zoning Inspector Jerry Mauger told Trustees that he had allowed a permit for an addition to Clyde Cole Pontiac, but he said the newspaper recorded it under Howland Township.

Mr. Glancy said he believed Clyde Cole's tax account was correctly filed in Bazetta.

The minutes of the January 05<sup>th</sup> and January 15<sup>th</sup> meetings were presented for approval.



First step would be to get the present property appraised and then accept bids.

Mr. Glancy reminded everyone about the baseball game between the Amish and the Police and Fire Departments on Saturday, June 12<sup>th</sup> at 11:30 AM at the township park.

# NOISE CONTROL RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Bazetta Township (the Board) have received complaints regarding noise in Bazetta Township; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code, Section 505.17 Authorized the Board to make such regulations and orders as are necessary to control passenger cars, motorcycle and internal combustion engine noise as permitted under Revised Code Section 4513.22.1; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 4513.22.1(E)(1)(2)(3) Authorizes the Board to regulate noise from passenger cars, motorcycles and internal combustion engines in the unincorporated area of the township by requiring engines to be equipped and operated with a factory installed or equivalent muffler; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 4513.22.1(E)(4) Authorizes the Board to regulate noise from passenger cars, motorcycles and internal combustion engines in the unincorporated area of the township by prohibiting racing the motor of any vehicle using an internal combustion engine in such a manner that the exhaust system emits a loud, cracking or chattering noise unusual to its normal operation; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 505.17.2 Authorizes the Board to regulate noise within the unincorporated territory of the township that is generated at any premises to which a D permit has been issued by the Ohio Division of Liquor Control and/or also to regulate noise that is generated within any area zoned for residential use; and

WHEREAS, The board finds and declares that it is in the best interest of Bazetta Township and the residents of Bazetta Township and consistent with public health and safety to provide standards for noise in the unincorporated areas of Bazetta Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Board of Trustees of Bazetta Township, Trumbull County, Ohio by authority of Chapter 505 of the Ohio Revised Code, as follows:
