RE: Legal Opinion 05-01 / Illegal Interest in Public Contract

Dear Trustees:

You have requested my legal opinion regarding the legality of purchasing merchandise from one of your township employee's brother's business. I will address the issue as follows:

DOES THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES FROM A TOWNSHIP EMPLOYEE'S BROTHER CONSTITUTE AN ILLEGAL INTEREST IN A PUBLIC CONTRACT PURSUANT TO ORC 511.13 AND 2921.42?

No, the purchase of goods and services from a township employee's brother does not constitute an illegal interest in a public contract pursuant to statute if the employee does not reside with his brother, did not use his influence to obtain the contract for his brother, does not work for his brother, and does not have an ownership interest in the business of his brother.

LEGAL RESEARCH AND AUTHORITY

No member of the board of township trustees or any officer or employee thereof shall be interested in any contract entered into by such board. Ohio Rev. Code Ann. Sec. 511.13 (Baldwin 2005).

Public officials are prevented from having an unlawful interest in a public contract. Pursuant to O.R.C. 2921.42:

1

(A) No public official shall knowingly do any of the following:

- (1) Authorize, or employ the authority or influence of his office to secure authorization of any public contract in which he, a member of his family, or any of his business associates has an interest;...
- (4) Have an interest in the profits or benefits of a public contract entered into by or for the use of the political subdivision or governmental agency or instrumentality with which he is connected;...
- (5) Have an interest in the profits or benefits of a public contract that is not let by competitive bidding if required by law and that involves more than one hundred fifty dollars.
- (G) As used in this section:
 - (1) "Public contract" means any of the following:
 - (a) The purchase or acquisition, or a contract for the purchase or acquisition, of property or services by or for the use of the state, any of its political subdivisions, or any agency or instrumentality of either, including the employment of an individual by the state, any of its political subdivisions, or any agency or instrumentality of either;
 - (b) A contract for the design, construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance of any public property...Ohio Rev. Code Sec. 2921.42 (Baldwin 2005).

"The difference between R.C. 511.13 and R.C. 2921.42 may be explained by the differing nature and purpose of the two statutes. R.C. 2921.42 is part of the Criminal Code. The legislature did not wish to impose penal sanctions under R.C. 2921.42 for dealings in which the public officials' personal interest would be very remote or clearly aboveboard. In contrast, R.C. 511.13 is a remedial statute. Like other statutes which forbid public officers to have an interest in public contracts, R.C. 511.13 is intended to introduce a regulation which will safeguard the public interest. Thus, it appears that R.C. 511.13 provides a broader prohibition than R.C. 2921.42, although it provides no criminal sanctions." 1999 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 99-023, citing, 1982 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 82-008.

In Ohio Attorney General Opinion Number 2000-015, the basic reason for prohibiting a public official from having an interest in a contract was stated as follows:

To permit those holding offices of trust or profit to become interested in contracts for the purchase of property for the use of the state, county, or municipality of which they are officers, might encourage favoritism, and fraudulent combinations and practices, not easily detected, and thus make such officers, charged with the duty of protecting those whose interests are confided to them, instruments of harm. The surest means of preventing this was to prohibit all such contracts; and the legislature having employed language sufficiently clear

and comprehensive for this purpose, there is no authority in the courts under the pretext of construction to render nugatory the positive provisions of the statute. 2000 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 2000-015.

While the term "interest" is not statutorily defined, the Ohio Ethics Commission has found that "an employee is considered to have an interest in his employer's contracts if: (1) the employee takes part in contract negotiations; (2) his salary is based on the proceeds of the contract; (3) he receives a share of the contract's proceeds in the form of a commission or fee; (4) his employment responsibilities include participation in the administration or execution of the contract; or (5) where the employee's tenure is dependent upon his employer receiving the award of such contract." State v. Urbin, 148 Ohio App.3d 293, 298 (2002), citing.Ohio Ethics Commission, Advisory Opinion No. 89-008.

In 1992, the Ohio Ethics Commission clarified its definition of "interest" by stating that "an employee of a firm will be deemed to have an 'interest' in a public contract entered into by her employer if any of the following circumstances apply: (1) the employee has an ownership interest in, or is a director, trustee, or officer of, her employer; (2) she takes part, as a firm employee, in contract negotiations or the application process; (3) her salary is based or dependent upon, or is paid from, the proceeds of the contract; (4) she receives a share of the contract's proceeds in the form of a commission or fee; (5) her responsibilities as an employee include participation in the administration or execution of the contract or she has the responsibility to oversee execution or administration of the contract; (6) the employing agency receives most or all of its funding from the contract, such that the establishment or operation of her employing agency is dependent upon receipt of the contract; or, (7) the creation or continuation of her employment is dependent upon her employer receiving the award of the contract." State v. Urbin. 148 Ohio App.3d 293, 298 (2002), citing Ohio Ethics Commission, Advisory Opinion No. 92-002.

For purposes of interpretation of O.R.C. 2921, 42, the Ohio Ethics Commission defined family member as including, but not limited to "a) grandparents; b) parents; c) spouse; d) children, whether dependent or not; e) grandchildren; f) brothers and sisters; and g) any person related by blood or marriage and residing in the same household." Walsh v. Bollas, 82 Ohio App.3d 588, 591 (1992), citing 1980 Ohio Ethics Commission Ops. No. 80-001, at 1.

The primary purpose of R.C. 2921.42 (A)(4) was to prevent any <u>personal profit</u> or benefit from a public contract. <u>Warren v. Bd. Of County Com'rs of Portage Ctv.</u>, 95-LW-1729 (11th Dist. June 2, 1995).

In determining what is prohibited behavior, the attorney general has held that a township trustee may not participate in the hiring of an employee for the township when one of the applicants is a member of that trustee's family; 1986 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 86-059; a township trustee may not participate in decisions concerning the compensation of a township employee who is a family member; <u>Id</u>; and a member of the legislative authority of a village may not participate in discussions or votes on any matter that concerns or affects his spouse's compensation as employee of the village; 1994 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 94-039.

One case was found with a fact pattern aiding in the analysis of the present situation. In Baynard v. Oakwood Village. Barbara J. Francis was appointed Finance Director for the Village of Oakwood. Baynard v. Oakwood Village. No. 71711, 97-LW-4193 (8th Dist. October 16, 1997). Ms. Francis' sister, Cassandra, was married to the plaintiff, whom Ms. Francis hired to perform computer work for the Village. Id. She claimed she advised the Mayor that plaintiff was her brother-in-law. Id. The Mayor denied authorizing the hiring of plaintiff or knowing he was Ms. Francis' brother-in-law. Id. One issue for the court was whether Ms. Francis violated R.C. 2921.42 (A)(1). Id.

The evidence showed plaintiff worked for the Village under the name BBF Business Systems, a sole proprietorship. <u>Id.</u> Cassandra Baynard, plaintiff's wife and the finance director's sister, was on BBF invoice/letterheads as vice-president/treasurer. <u>Id.</u> However, plaintiff testified that he performed the accounting and computer services for BBF and that he was the only employee, agent or representative. <u>Id.</u> He claimed he only placed his wife's name on the letterhead to make the company look larger. <u>Id.</u>

On November 13, 1996, the trial court held that R.C. 2921.42 did not void the contract for plaintiff's work because Ms. Francis was not barred from contracting with her brother-in-law since she did not live with him; that Ms. Francis was not the plaintiff's business partner or associate in BBF Business Systems; and that Ms. Francis did not profit from plaintiffs contract with the Village. Id.

This Court, in reviewing the lower court, upheld the decision. <u>Id.</u> It held that, while undisputed that Ms. Francis was a public official, none of the other requirements of the statute were met based on the evidence at trial. <u>Id.</u> No evidence was introduced which demonstrated that Ms. Francis or her sister were part of or had an interest in BBF Business Systems. <u>Id.</u> Neither participated in the contract plaintiff had with the Village nor did the Village produced evidence that Ms. Francis was receiving kickbacks from either her sister or the plaintiff. <u>Id.</u>

The law of Ohio does not prohibit public officials from hiring a brother-in-law unless such relative resides with the public official in question. <u>Id., citing, 1980 Ohio Ethics Commen. Ops. Nos. 80-001, 90-010; Walsh v. Bollas (1993), 82 Ohio App.3d 588, 591; Jones v. Rookfield Twp. Trustees (June 30, 1995), Trumbull App. No. 92-T-4692, unreported at 8.</u>

The present fact pattern involves a fireman employed by the township whose brother owns and operates a tire store in the township. It appears that the township has in the past purchased tires

appear that the fireman in question authorized, or used his influence to obtain this contract for his brother, as it has been ongoing. Not enough information is given to complete the analysis of this situation, but if the fireman in question does not reside with his brother, has no ownership interest in his brother's business, does not work for his brother, and did not participate in contract

and other products from the brother, and would like to continue to do so in the future. It does not

negotiations between the township and his brother, he does not have an interest in the contract.

There is no conflict with the board both employing the fireman and continuing to use his brother's business to obtain needed automotive services and supplies.

Accordingly, it is my opinion that Bazetta Township 's purchase of merchandise from an employee's brother who is not a member of the employee's household does not constitute an illegal interest in a public contract.

His complaint was about the house that burnt and now the roof is exposed, terrible odor and the weeds are at least 3' high again. BAZETTA TOWNSHIP REGULAR MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 07, 2005 9:00 AM

Kalina Braun of 2467 Northview Drive asked about water coming to her area. She handed a news article to the Trustees from the Tribune dated November 03, 2005. This news article said the commissioners authorized a consultant of Youngstown to proceed with \$174,417 in technical services. This money will be paid through an Ohio Public Works Grant. A waterline will be extended between Niles and Brookfield to allow the four townships, Brookfield and Hubbard to get MVSD water from Niles. She asked the Trustees to seek alternative water companies and not Aqua Water of Ohio.

Mr. Glancy mentioned that Aqua Water approached him and in January of this year he called a meeting for all local government officials and the county said no to Aqua Water supplying water to the townships. He said we can't do anything until the people who are concerned about water bring us a petition so we can move forward on it. He has given out water petitions to residents, but they have not returned them to the office.

Mr. Piros said it is harder to recoup funds for water, as not everyone is interested in tapping in at the time the lines are laid. Sewer on the other hand is easier as it will be mandatory. There are three areas that are tapped for sewage in the new few years.

George Braun of 2467 Northview Drive asked if there will be alternative ways to pay for sewage. He said he is retired. Mr. Piros said the format is to get a cost study from the Trumbull County Engineer's Office and then have a public meeting for all residents involved and let them know the cost. At this time they will be able to say yes or no for the sewage. If yes, he hopes he can get a grant to offset some of the cost or the costs can be accessed on residents' taxes or residents could secure a small interest loan.

If no, if that particular residence is targeted, it will be mandatory at a cost of \$12 to \$15,000. Mrs. Braun suggested the Auditor's Office be invited to this meeting as well as the Health Department and the Sanitation Engineer.

Mr. Braun asked about the vacant house on Northview Drive. It has been over a year. Mr. Mauger responded that it is in the hands of the bank and we can't move forward on it right now.

Mr. Piros added that there was a house on McCleary Jacoby Road that was scheduled for demolition and someone purchased it with the understanding that within one year of purchase date, to get the house in fit condition. And at that time it should be worked out between the buyer and seller to put a band-aid fix on the septic tank.
