

BAZETTA TOWNSHIP REGULAR MEETING MINUTES MARCH 20, 2006 7:00 PM

Present: Trustees Bill Glancy, Mike Piros, Jeff Bates and Mark Finamore, Legal Counsel.

Old Business:

Mr. Piros spoke on the gas brokerage firm that was discussed at length at the Ohio Township Association Meeting. This brokerage firm was hired by Howland Township. There are certain requirements and special pricing for townships.

Also discussed was updating our Township's Administrative Policy in the future. Mr. Piros is picking up the township's spring flyer from Howland Printing and will take them to Postal Mail Sort and hopefully by the end of this week, the residents will receive their flyers in the mail.

Mr. Bates had nothing to report.

Mr. Glancy made a notation about his telephone conversation with Frank Migliozzi of the Health Department regarding the 5' septic tank installation on Bazetta Road to resident, Tracey Gould, that the township has no legal recourse. Mr. Gould stated he wanted to have a meeting with Mr. Migliozzi not a telephone conversation. Mr. Gould said the owner saved \$1,200 by installing the septic tank that way and we, the neighbors, lost \$25,000 value off our property value.

Mr. Finamore said the best way to get this resolved would be for Mr. Gould and his neighbors to attend a Board of Health meeting. Mr. Glancy said he would draft a letter to Mr. Migliozzi requesting a meeting with Mr. Gould and his neighbors on this problem.

Public Participation:

Joe Billecki, 2456 Northview Drive, presented the Trustees with pictures of an abandoned home with garbage all over the yard at 2458 Northview Drive. Trustee Glancy asked Mr. Mauger to do an inspection and bring findings back to the board. Then the board would send a letter to the homeowner. Mr. Glancy mentioned that this won't be done overnight as we have to follow the proper procedures.

Don Sutliff, 2348 State Route 305, asked about the progress of the sewer projects for the township. Mr. Piros answered that through Issue II, a grant of \$300,000 was received for the feasibility study. He talked with Mr. Newbrough, Sanitation Engineer, about 3-4 weeks ago and possibly sometime in April, a meeting with the residents on the cost will be held and then it is up to the residents. If the residents say yes, we follow the process for bids, accept the bid and then hire a contractor. Bazetta Township doesn't meet the qualifications for more grant money.

Mr. Finamore said Issue II, now Issue I, is a capital fund improvement pool amount of money.

Mr. Sutliff asked about water and Mr. Glancy said it is not the township holding this up, it is the commissioners. They don't want private water companies coming into the county.

Mr. Finamore commented on the county and the MVSD. They do not want private water companies because after the private water companies place all the piping, they can at anytime increase the price of water to the residents and the residents do not have any say so. In Trumbull County alone, there are 17 different water rates. Mr. Finamore assured the residents that their Trustees are working very hard on the sewer and water projects.

Mr. Piros said some developers have fronted the money for water and sewer but re-coup their money when they sell the property.

Resident Robyn Hineman, 2408 Northview Drive, stated her displeasures with one of the Trustees for comments made about her husband and Delphi and also wanted to know how the road negotiations were progressing. She also stated she felt the Trustees should pay for their health care.

Mr. Finamore stated it was perfectly legal for the Trustees to take the insurance coverage offered by the township.

Mr. Glancy answered her concerns about the negotiations with the road department. Although progress has been made, the contract negotiations are continuing with a meeting on April 03rd.

Several residents questioned the fliers they received from the Teamsters stating that talks were stalled.

Mr. Piros said after the next round of negotiations a fact finder's hearing will be held. There are a lot of issues on the table and hopes to get these resolved before the fact-finding phase.

Mr. Glancy said their contract expired in May of 2004 and the reason it has taken this long is because the road department chose to be represented by the Teamsters. He said the township union had to be decertified when they went with the Teamsters Union and a whole new contract had to be written from scratch.

Rosie Stockton, 2658 McCleary Jacoby Road, asked what the lowest salary was for the full-time worker and Kris Parke answered it was \$14.44. Mr. Glancy said they have 100% paid insurance benefits plus holiday, vacation, sick and personal time.

John Lubianetzki, 2762 Tall Oaks Drive, asked why we are paying \$125 an hour for an attorney. Mr. Finamore answered that there is a pool of about nine legal firms who specialize in contract negotiations and Bazetta is using one of them, Clemans, Nelson & Associates.

John Morris, Durst Clagg Road, asked why the township didn't use the prosecutor's office as it is free. He has talked with Mr. Earnheart and he told him yes they represent Bazetta and they can use the prosecutor's office. Mr. Morris asked to have Jim Saker call him, but has not heard from Mr. Saker as of today. Mr. Finamore said the prosecutor's office is available to the townships on legal matters, but refrains from collective bargaining problems.

Joe Billecki, Northview Drive, asked about the brick wall at Saddlebrook. Kris Parke said after review, it is okay as it is off our road right-of-way. Condos have a new set of rules as they are private roads.

Ken Flask, State Route 5, asked if anything is going to be done about the visibility problem at McCleary Jacoby Road and Cadwallader-Sonk Road. Mr. Piros said a letter dated December 27, 2005 from Mr. Finamore was sent to the owner, Rose Mackey, 2210 Cadwallader-Sonk Road asking her to trim back the branches in question to alleviate the obstruction and to provide a clear view of all traffic to avoid a potential accident.

At this time, Bob Kubiak, of the Children's Services spoke about the wide range of services his agency provides and passed out flyers to everyone present and asked their support in the renewal levy on the May 02nd ballot. It was originated in 1986 and is for 2M. This being a renewal will not increase the property owner's tax amount.

Public Participation:

Pearlene and Tom Lyman, 2440 Westview Drive, requested a sewer petition for their street and asked about water. Mr. Piros gave them both a sewer and water petition and explained they need to get 80% of the residents to sign each form, then it is sent to the sanitary engineer who gives it to the commissioners and they do a feasible study on the costs, then the sanitary engineer sets up a public meeting with the residents to find out their costs per foot which can be accessed to their taxes for 20 years. At the public meeting the residents can either say yes or no. If yes, the sanitary engineer can start the process. Mr. Glancy mentioned this is not a quick process.

Mrs. Lyman told the Trustees she appreciated the spring flyer and to keep up the good work.

Fred Grinnell, 2408 Westview Drive, asked where the new development on McCleary Jacoby Road will get their water and sewer. Mr. Mauger said the water will be furnished by Trumbull County and will come along the frontage of the Ross' house and the sewer will some from the rear of the development along the creek and it will also come from Trumbull County. The developer will pay for these upfront and will recoup his money by selling the lots.

Mr. Glancy spoke of the letter he wrote to the Board of Health on the sewage system that was put in the front yard of a house on Bazetta Road and sticks up at least 5' above the ground. He said the nearby homeowners requested a meeting with the township Trustees and the Board of Health. Mr. Glancy said the Trustees supports the homeowners' concerns that the value of their home decreased \$25,000 and suggested everyone to attend the Health Board meetings, as there is power in numbers.

Mr. Grinnell suggested that Mr. Mauger get more involved and put this in the Zoning Book. For example, issue permits for septic systems in the township and then inspect them.

Mr. Glancy said the township has no legal recourse on septic tanks and like the gas well drilling; this is regulated by the state, not the township.

Mr. Piros interjected that his board is on top of what we can do legally.

Mr. Piros also mentioned the Lakeshore Drive area where the homeowners signed a sewer petition and then was sent a letter from the Health Department requiring them to upgrade their system. This Board met with the Health Department and got a reprieve as their petition was already in the works but any new petitions, this Board can't say the Health Department will do the same.

Mr. Grinnell asked Mr. Glancy where the water would be purchased from and the reply was from the City of Warren or Trumbull County, even though the body of water sits in our township as well as the treatment plant.

Steve Perhach, 2417 Northview Drive, asked where the water pilot will be placed. Mr. Glancy did not know for sure. Mr. Perhach asked if it is the same policy, if you don't tap in, you don't pay. Mr. Glancy said yes.

Janet Perhach, 2417 Northview Drive, asked if both lines could be dug at the same time and Mr. Piros said no because of the unions involved plus the water would be a private company and the sewer would be the county.

Mrs. Lyman, 2440 Westview Drive, asked after the new development is done, would the developer turn the sewer over to the county. Mr. Piros said he believed it would be turned over to the county.

Kris Parke said that the county has the say so as to what size pipe is put in according to the number of homes being built. Mrs. Lyman asked if the developer could put in a larger size pipe so Westview could benefit from it. Mr. Piros said that would be up to the developer and the county sanitary engineer.

Fred Grinnell, 2408 Westview Drive, asked if there is a map of places requesting sewer. Mr. Piros asked about that himself and was told the sewer district was developed in the late 1950's or early 1960's and requested they develop a new sewer district as things have changed since the 1960's.

Mr. Glancy said there is a sewage plant by the fairgrounds and the residents of Lakeshore Drive can't tap in. They will need to upgrade Sterling Drive sewage plant and eventually tap into Sterling Drive sewage plant. Now the State Park wants to tap in too so the study has to be reengineered.

Mr. Grinnell continued by asking if there is a standard septic tank and if a soil test is done as there is no more off lot systems anymore.

Mr. Piros answered that he felt the residents who are forced to put in new systems and then a sewage system is put in, that the Health Department and the county should see that the residents recoup some of their monies. He has written letters to the local and state representatives about his concerns.

Chief Sayers presented a paper to the Trustees on phone solicitation starting in late April through July from the Cortland-Bazetta Fraternal Order of Police. This is legitimate in case any residents should call the township officials or offices. The solicitation is for various civic functions and causes but will primarily go towards our "Bats, Balls, and Badges" program that allows the organization to take 100 under privileged children to an Indians baseball game in July.

He also mentioned he will have extra radar on Bazetta Road along with two or three DUI checkpoints in the township.

Safety Committee:

There was nothing to report, but the safety programs are working.

Mr. Piros' concern is that when these residents put new septic tanks in and then a few years down the road, sewer comes along; he wants something in writing form the EPA or Board of Health stating they will get a moratorium for at least ten (10) years.

Mr. Glancy mentioned, the County Commissioners are voted in by the cities but do not represent them.

Mr. Piros wants the public to know that this Board is very active in our water and sewer problems within the township and will continue to work on these.

Mr. Piros mentioned that we received three (3) statements of professional design services for the addition to the police station to house the administrative offices, Jakubick/Sexton of Cortland, BIE out of Akron and MKC of New Philadelphia, OH. The board decided to go with Jakubick/Sexton as Ed Jakubick with the original architect.

Mr. Glancy welcomed the government students from Lakeview High School.

Old business:

Mr. Bates had nothing to report.

Mr. Piros had a call from resident Art Racco, 4018 Lakeshore Drive, regarding a water problem. Mr. Bates and Mr. Piros will go to Mr. Racco's resident on Wednesday, May 17th at 9:00 AM.

Mr. Piros met with Ohio Edison representative, Janet Kitch, Dave Rockman and Mr. Parke to discuss electricity to the township park gazebo. The existing incoming electrical line is not sufficient for the load. It doesn't meet standards. Ohio Edison will give us a quote for a new transformer, 40% our cost. Mr. Piros will have more specifics at the next meeting.

Resident Evelyn Coe, 2677 McCleary Jacoby Road, asked if the park fund will pay for the transformer. Mr. Piros answered we will look at the cost when it comes in.

There was a discussion on the Baseball Academy for a baseball camp at our township park in June, which was originally turned down. Mr. Glancy talked with Jeff Rinck the day he was leaving for vacation and Mr. Glancy suggested he call Mr. Piros. Mr. Piros never received a call from Mr. Rinck and yet there were flyers left in our meeting room stating this camp was taking

place at our township park in June. Mr. Piros asked the Fiscal Officer to fax Mr. Finamore the letter from Mr. Rinck requesting permission to use the park and our denial letter to Mr. Rinck.

It was brought to our attention about transient vendors and Mr. Piros asked Mr. Mauger and the response was that both vendors came in and paid for a permit. Mr. Mauger asked about the gentlemen selling vegetables and flowers at the corner of Bazetta Road and State Route 305 and stated that the owner is selling these items and the property is zoned commercial. Mr. Glancy replied we cannot charge for a permit if the owner is selling on his commercial property.

Mr. Piros was contacted by Gary Newbrough, Sanitary Engineer, about the east side sewer project. He asked if Candlelite Knolls could be used for this meeting and Mr. Glancy will check into it and get back to the Fiscal Officer who in turn will notify Mr. Newbrough so mailings can go out to the homeowners from the Sanitary Engineer's Office.

Mr. Glancy met with a representative from Aqua Water about a proposed pilot project to bring water to the township. Five areas have been identified as possible locations and the project is waiting approval by the commissioners.

Pearlene Lyman, 2440 Westview Drive, asked if the water will be county or private water. Mr. Glancy responded the contractor will pay up front and county puts the lines in and takes ownership. The county charges and them they pay the contractor.

Mrs. Lyman also asked if the sewer to Stonegate will be county and Mr. Piros said both water and sewer will be county. The commissioners need to approve and then it goes to the Sanitary Engineer.

Mr. Piros had a conversation with Mr. Mahoney from the Conservation Club who had concerns with homeowners who have property adjacent to the club's property that they are using and building on the club's property. Mr. Mahoney had the property surveyed and these documents were turned over to Mr. Mauger to inspect.

Mr. Mauger stated when they sign the zoning permit with the information on their property lines, we can't determine if they are true. Mr. Glancy suggested that to prevent any future problems, Mr. Mauger should inspect them before they are actually built.

Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Mauger about the three trailers on Bazetta Road that are tied into one septic tank. The neighbors are complaining and when Mr. Glancy brings this complaint before a Trustee meeting, Mr. Glancy is accused of picking on that particular neighbor.

Fred Boughner, 3190 Morrow Drive, read a letter he received from the Board of Health telling him he has 60 days to do a band-aid fix on his septic system and the 60 days is up on Tuesday,

The June meeting will let the east side residents find out about their assessment figures which can be paid up front or accessed on their taxes. If the residents vote yes to go ahead, the target date should be the end of 2006.

Fred Hoover, 2282 State Route 305, said the residents might see a higher price tag on sewers and some may not be able to afford them.

TIRED OF THOSE JUNK CARS?

One of the most frequently asked questions I receive as township legal counsel is "how do we get rid of junk motor vehicles?" and what is the "fastest and cheapest way to get rid of them?".

Well, you may be surprised, but this is one problem that the state legislature has given townships a lot of effective options and they do work if you are willing to take action.

Under current state statutes, the state legislature has provided four separate means to either prohibit, regulate or provide for the removal of junk motor vehicles in the township. The four legal means of dealing with junk motor vehicles available to townships are:

1. Township Zoning Regulation

The township can adopt a zoning resolution prohibiting the storage of unlicensed and/or inoperable junk motor vehicles and automobile parts in the township. Enforcement of the violation of the zoning resolution requires the following procedures: (i) the filing of a minor misdemeanor zoning complaint in the municipal court or county court in the jurisdiction of the township which would provide for up to a \$500.00 a day fine for each and every day of violation of the zoning resolution; (ii) the filing of an injunction pursuant to Section 519.24ORC in the Court of Common Pleas, which if not complied with would subject the property owner sanctions from the court by way of fine and/or jail sentence.

2. Section 4513.65 ORC State Motor Vehicle Regulations

Section 4513.65 ORC authorizes the township board of trustees to send a certified mail notice, to the person having the ownership or right of possession of the property on which a junk motor vehicle is stored, requiring the junk motor vehicle to be covered by

being housed in a garage or other suitable enclosure or removing the vehicle from the property.

Failure to comply with the notice and for each subsequent period of 30 days the junk motor vehicle continues to be left constitutes a separate offense under Section 4513.65. A violation of Section 4513.65 is a minor misdemeanor on a first offense, punishable by a fine of up to \$100.00 only; and on a second offense is classified as a misdemeanor of the fourth degree, punishable by up to a \$250.00 fine and/or 30-day jail sentence; and on a subsequent offense is a misdemeanor of the third degree, punishable by up to a \$500.00 fine and/ or a 90-day jail sentence. However, in order to meet the criteria for a junk motor vehicle under the statute, the motor vehicle has to meet all of the following requirements: (a) three years old or older; (b) extensively damaged, said damage including but not limited to any of the following: missing wheels. tires, motor or transmission; (c) apparently inoperable; and (d) having a fair market value of \$1,500.00 or less. The problem with using this statute to remove junk motor vehicles from property is that the threshold value of the automobile in the \$1,500.00 or less range would exclude a lot of automobiles which, although having a higher value. would still be considered junk motor vehicles in appearance to most individuals, and although unsightly, would not be prohibited under this statute.

3. Section 505.87 ORC Nuisance Abatement

Section 505.87 ORC provides the township with the authority to provide for the abatement, control or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris from land in the township if the

board determines that the owner's maintenance of such vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris constitutes a nuisance. In order to invoke this statute, the township must use the following procedure: (i) The township zoning inspector or other township official must make an inspection of the property and take pictures of the junk automobiles to be removed. (ii) The township zoning inspector must then appear at a township regular meeting or special meeting held for the purpose of addressing the junk motor vehicles and provide the township with a written inspection report along with the pictures and recommend to the township board of trustees to declare the property a nuisance. (iii) If the township trustees concur that the junk motor vehicles constitute a nuisance, they must pass a resolution declaring the property a nuisance and ordering the abatement and removal of the junk motor vehicles.. (iv) The zoning inspector would then do a record search at the County Auditor's office and/or County Recorder's office to determine the legal owner of the premises and/or any other lien holder and serve them a written notice that unless the property owner removes or abates the junk motor vehicles within 7 days of the notice, the township would enter upon the property, provid: for the removal of the junk motor les, and the cost of doing so would be placed as a tax lien on the property to be collected by the County Auditor and returned to the general fund of the township treasury. This written notice must be served in one of the following ways: (i) If the owner is a resident of the township or is a nonresident w address is known, the township and notice by certified mail, return receipt requested. (ii) If the owner is a resident of the township or is a nonresident whose address is known, the board may give notice to the owner by causing any of its agents or employees to post the notice

on the principal structure on the land and to photograph the posted notice with a camera capable of recording the date of the photograph on it. (iii) If the owner's address is unknown and cannot be reasonably obtained, it is sufficient to publish the notice once in a newspaper of general circulation in the township.

If within 7 days after notice is given, the owner of the land fails to remove the junk motor vehicles, the board of trustees can then provide for the removal by employing the necessary labor, materials and equipment to perform the task, and the expenses incurred by the township shall be certified to the County Auditor for collection with other property taxes and returned to the general fund of the township.

* The Ohio Attorney General in Opinion 90-020 has determined that junk automobiles may be included as "refuse" or "other" debris for purposes of 505.87 ORC.

4. Section 505.173 ORC Township Regulation of Junk Motor Vehicle Storage

Section 505.173 ORC authorizes township trustees by resolution to regulate the storage of junk motor vehicles on private property, a violation of which would constitute a minor misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$100.00 a day fine. Under this section of the law, a junk motor vehicle is defined as a motor vehicle which is (a) 3 model years old or older; (b) apparently inoperable; and (c) extensively damaged, including but not limited to any of the following: missing wheels, tires, engine or transmission. As you can see, the definition of a junk

motor vehicle under this section is far more liberal than the definition of a junk motor vehicle contained in Section 4513.65 GRC and therefore would entitle you to provide for prohibition of unsightly vehicles which under the other statute would not meet the \$1,500.00 or less qualification. However, this statute does not authorize the township to take action on its own to cause the removal of the motor vehicles and to tax the property owner for the cost if the property owner does not remove the motor vehicles to avoid the payment of fines. That is, under this statute the only penalty that can be imposed is a fine for the violation and not an order to remove the motor vehicles.

In my experience with these provisions of the law, it is my opinion and advice that the most effective manner to eliminate the storage of junk motor vehicles on properties is by the township nuisance abatement authority under 505.87 ORC. It is by far the fastest way to eliminate junk motor vehicles without the necessity of going through a court proceeding Also in my experiences, I have found that many towing companies, junkyards and salvage yards are willing to provide the removal service free of charge for the right to obtain an abandoned certificate of title to the vehicles so that they keep or sell them for the salvage value.

Now, get rid of those junk cars.

Present: Bill Glancy, Mike Piros, Jeff Bates, and Martha Urchek.

Martha handed out to the Trustees the following reports: Appropriation Status Report dated June 01, 2006, along with the tax rate from the Trumbull County Auditor listing the amount of revenue that will be generated due to the passing of the two levies in November of 2005 and the three levies in May of 2006, the Township Amended Certificate of Estimated Resources dated January 27, 2006 showing each department's fund budget for 2006, the Valuation and Resources dated January 2006 showing the estimated tax revenues for 2006 and Receipt Account Status Report dated June 01, 2006 showing all the up-to-date receipts posted, and the Cash Journal dated June 01, 2006 showing the balance in our checking and investment accounts.

Martha explained we are doing okay, but will continue to watch the monies coming in and going out.

BAZETTA TOWNSHIP REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, JUNE 05, 2006 AT 9:00 AM

Present: Bill Glancy, Mike Piros, and Jeff Bates.

Mr. Glancy opened the meeting by stating we are going to vary from the agenda due to one of the Trustees needing to leave for work.

Mr. Glancy commented on the last meeting's minutes saying not everything is recorded in the minutes. He apologized that maybe we go too fast and that Martha needs to tell us to slow down so every word goes in the minutes. He suggested the board should consider a tape recorder. Mr. Piros said he has no problem with a tape recorder, but you have to watch what you say. Mr. Bates has no problem with a tape recorder.

Mr. Parke asked if we can use the one that is used for zoning meetings and Mr. Piros said we could. We will have to keep the tapes in the safe.

129-06 Motion by Mr. Piros, seconded by Mr. Glancy to approve the minutes of the May 15th meeting.

Vote on Motion: Mr. Bates YES, Mr. Glancy YES and Mr. Piros YES.

YES <u>3</u> NAY <u>0</u> Motion Carried.

It was rumored that the State Park had a grant and was planning to blacktop the driveway. Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Parke to call Rocco Greco at the State Park.

Pearlene Lyman, 2440 Westview Drive, asked how can they get a grant and we don't know about grants. Mr. Piros said you have to request grants.

Mr. Parke will attempt to fill the holes again at the park.

Mr. Glancy asked about the roadside mowing and Mr. Parke replied that the mechanic is working on the road ground mower. Mr. Bates asked why this wasn't done over the winter months. Mr. Parke replied because we use the tractor for different jobs such as working in the park which requires different attachments.

Mr. Parke said he will be doing the mowing and it will take about a week mowing the bottom of the ditch to the edge of the road and he will begin mowing this week, probably Thursday.

Mr. Bates left the meeting at 9:45 AM.

Mr. Parke stated he received a call and then a fax from a Danny Armstrong, 3835 Durst Clagg Road, about a letter he received from the board on May 15, 2006 stating the effluent must be discharged into a tiled ditch. If an open ditch exists, it must be tiled at the property owner's expense and in accordance with township ditching requirements. His ditch is not tiled. Mr. Armstrong wants to know if we dig and install the pipe and if we backfill the ditch after the tile is put in. Mr. Parke says he has never done this before. The form dated May 15th has a clause #5 added. Mr. Glancy suggested Mr. Parke to contact out legal counsel, as he is the one who put the new #5 clause in the letter in 2004. Mr. Parke will inform the Trustees what he finds out from Mr. Finamore.

Old Business:

Mr. Piros said that according to the union contract, work sessions are scheduled periodically. A work session with the Firefighters Local 3703 will be at the township hall on Monday, June 26, 2006 at 8:00 AM. Mr. Piros asked Martha to send a letter to Mike Mannella, President of Local 3703, along with the same letter to union members Tom Rink and Mike White informing them of this meeting and also to advertise in the newspaper.

Earlier today, Mr. Jakubick of Jakubick-Sexton Architects met with the Trustees to discuss the architectural design and fee proposal for the addition to the existing police station encompassing the township administrative functions. With the uncertainty of General Motors and Delphi, and delinquent taxes could affect the budget, the board decided to table this at the present time.

Mr. Piros received a letter from the Trumbull Soil and Water Conservation District dated May 18, 2006 addressed to Mr. Larry Robinson of Broad Meadows Estates stating all work is to stop due to monies not being received in the amount of \$1,297 from January 2005 for fees and outstanding balances along with the submittal of the application. Mr. Piros asked Martha to copy this letter to Mr. Mauger, our Zoning Inspector and Police Chief Sayers to watch this property so no activity goes on there.

Evelyn Coe, 2677 McCleary Jacoby Road, asked about the gas well road by the Conservation League on McCleary Jacoby Road as to what they are dumping on the open field. Mr. Piros said that was ceased long ago. She saw them three days ago.

Mr. Glancy said it is grease from restaurants being dumped in the open field and it is legal. He has talked with the Health Department on this. Mr. Lawson of Warren Sanitary Company, who owns the property, is dumping the grease.

Mrs. Coe asked how many acres and Chief Sayers thought it was between 80 and 100 acres. Mr. Glancy said the EPA has been involved and the Trustees as well as Mr. Parke have been there a dozen times. Chief Sayers said this has been going on for 20 years.

Mr. Glancy said they used to dump brine on the fairgrounds, but that isn't allowed anymore.

Mr. Parke said he met with Calhoun Concrete and Mr. Rockman, Architectural Services and Mr. Tom Gladd of the Trumbull County Building Department and the handicap ramp has been approved. Mr. Piros suggested that Mr. Parke take the signs and the roping down and have Jack Governor pressure wash the gazebo.

Mr. Piros mentioned he received his invitation to the Trumbull Township Association Lamb and Chicken Roast on June 15th in Vienna Township's Four Seasons Trailer Park. He asked everyone to make sure they turn in their reservation to Martha as soon as possible.

Mr. Glancy mentioned the BWC Drug Free Work Place mandatory refresher training for all fulltime and part-time employees is scheduled for June at the police station. Please turn in your day and time to Martha as soon as possible.

Mr. Glancy said he received a complaint about high grass at 2126 Wilmar Drive and Mr. Piros will contact the property owner since this is in his neighborhood.

Mr. Piros mentioned he had met with Janet Kitch of First Energy on the transformer for the township park. The cost of the 25 KVA Transformer on a pole is \$1,710.41. The township would be required to pay 40% or \$684.16 before construction. An additional ½% of the total cost of construction (\$8.55) would be added to the new meter's electric bill each month through

December of 2007. Additional costs would be a new pole, a new box plus labor to put the pole in. Mr. Parke said he could contact Brent Westbay to drill the hole for the pole. This is not a simple task. After the engineering study, there are permits and then it would go out to bid.

Evelyn Coe, 2477 McCleary Jacoby Road, asked where the money would come from and Mr. Piros said it would come from the Park's upgrade fund.

Pearlene Lyman, 2440 Westview Drive, asked about the work stoppage on Robinson's Broad Meadows and if there is also a stoppage on Stonegate. Mr. Glancy said no and the reason there hasn't been any activity is because of the rain. She stated she contacted Gary Newbrough about the Westview Sewer Project and Mr. Newbrough told her it was in the design stage for the summer of 2007.

Mr. Piros attended a meeting on Lakeshore and Westlake Sewer and Water Project with the Commissioners to weeks ago and the Westview project was discussed and is in the engineering stage. The East side project which is the biggest is in the design stage. Mr. Piros will call Mr. Newbrough and get back to Mrs. Lyman.

Mr. Piros said there is a meeting for the East side sewer project involving sections of Route 5, 305, and 46 along with Williams, Morrow, parts of McCleary Jacoby, Wilmar, Circle and Northview on Tuesday, June 20th at Candlelite Knolls on Bazetta Road at 7:00 PM. There will be representatives from the commissioner's office, Sanitary Engineer, EPA, Board of Health as well as the auditor's office. This is one project and if the residents say yes, it will go out for bids and should begin in September of 2006. The auditor's office will be able to explain how it can be assessed on property owner's taxes.

Mr. Klamut, 2800 Niles-Cortland Road, wanted to know how much of Route 46 in involved. Mr. Piros said it will go down Route 46 involving three or four houses and Mr. Richard Musick of 3283 Niles-Cortland Road will pay for his own.

The West side consisting of Lakeshore and Westlake Drives will have a meeting in July of 2006.

Mr. Klamut, 2800 Niles-Cortland Road, asked how he can get water and sewer and Mr. Piros said there are petitions here that need to be signed by all residents in your area who are interested in water and sewer and there needs to be 80%. These petitions are then taken to the Sanitary Engineer's Office. Mr. Piros said you aren't committed until the final stages.

Mr. Piros shared some new regulations from the State of Ohio that go into effect July 01^{st} of this year. A new septic system now would cost approximately \$12-15,000, after July 01^{st} , a new septic system would cost approximately \$20-25,000 with a yearly update. Mr. Piros was interrupted by Mr. Glancy, but Mr. Glancy let Mr. Piros continue as Mr. Glancy said "you are

cheaper than Mark Finamore."

Residents are asking about grants and Mr. Piros said that would be explained at the June 20th meeting.

Bud Bowen, 2452 State Route 5, asked about the Sidley sewer project.

Mr. Piros said that particular property on State Route #5 was being considered for purchase by Kundle Industries if sewer could be obtained. The property would have to be rezoned Industrial as it is zoned Commercial and since Kundle Industries had to purchase the property to do this and Kundle needed to move quickly, they lost interest. Since they didn't purchase the property, one can get a grant for anticipating to purchase.

Mr. Piros said then another prospect was a car dealer and Mr. Glancy said it was a Chevrolet dealer and they didn't need sewers. Mr. Glancy said there hasn't been anything further on that piece of property.

Mr. Glancy said there is money lying out there. Look at sewers to Braceville.

Mr. Bowen mentioned the Golden Triangle and said some of the businesses near him would like to see sewer come down Route 5.

Mrs. Lyman wanted to know about the hold-off on septic tanks by the health department.

Mr. Piros said the East side project has a band-aid fix as well as the Lakeshore project. The health department indicates they are in the works, engineering, first of the year. Anything after that, who knows. Mr. Piros suggested Mrs. Lyman call the health department to get more information.

Mr. Piros said the health department doesn't know what they are doing.

Mr. Glancy mentioned he received a call about garbage on Perkins-Jones Road and for Mr. Mauger's benefit, I didn't get shot at. He talked with the tenant as well as the landlady and as of yesterday, Sunday, the garbage was gone.

Mr. Glancy mentioned that State Transportation District #4 is closing Route 46 between 5 and 87 starting on June 05th and ending on July 31st. The length of the detour is 12 miles. The detour route is Route 5 to Route 11 to Route 87. They will be replacing a culvert.

Mr. Glancy read portion of the Grassroots newsletter from the Ohio Township Association on the TEL (Tax Expenditure Limitation) proposal. It has been rejected and they are trying to get if off

the November ballot.

Mr. Glancy said this board will be cracking down on junk cars and neglected buildings to improve our townships appearance and increase property values. Attorney Finamore is working closely with the Trustees on a resolution to effectively deal with these issues.

Mr. Klamut asked if there are any regulations on newspapers being thrown in resident's yards. He stated they are placed in the Tribune or Vindicator boxes and then the Tribune and Vindicator newspaper carriers take them out of the boxes and throw them on the ground. These then are blown in yards or ditches. There are so many blue bags lying on the ground in this township. Mr. Glancy said he is aware of this and there is nothing the township can do at this time.

Evelyn Coe questioned the Impact Baseball Academy Camp at the park in June. Mr. Glancy said this organization met all the criteria requirements. She asked if it will interfere with the LAC games and practices and Mr. Glancy said no as they are having the camp from 8:00 AM to noon June 12th through the 15th.

Evelyn Coe questioned Chief Sayers about who is shooting behind the Conservation League as a bullet came in her backyard. Chief Sayers will look into this.

Fire Chief McKenzie:

Chief McKenzie stated he received our Commercial Equipment Direct Assistance Program award letter telling us we will receive an AMKUS Rescue Tools, Gas Operated System. This is free with no grant fund matching fee. Once received, he will notify the Trustees.

Mr. Glancy complimented Captain Dennis Lewis on a job well done. He is the best grant writer.

Roger Coe, 2677 McCleary Jacoby Road, asked Chief McKenzie about demonstrations of this new tool and Chief McKenzie said he is planning a demonstration for the public to view.

Evelyn Coe, going back to the Impact Baseball Academy Camp asked if there would be any money returned to us from this camp. Mr. Glancy said they are non-profit. Nothing to us just like the Lakeview Athletic Club, they charge the kids for registration and give them some equipment and we receive no money from them. She asked if this camp was for Cortland kids only and Mr. Glancy said it is for all kids just like the Valley Extreme Baseball Club doesn't consist of just Cortland girls.

Police Chief Sayers:

Chief Sayers turned in his monthly report for May.

He stated he and the Corp of Army Engineers have a contract again this year to work together with the State park Rangers in policing around the lake.

The speed trailer is on Bazetta Road and he will move it to Durst Clagg later this week.

Everything has been set for a booth at the Trumbull County Fair from July 09th through July 16th.

Fireworks at the lake by Grant Oakes will be Monday night, July 03rd, one day earlier than last year.

Joe Sofchek attended the Mahoning Valley Safety Council last week in place of Chief Sayers.

The emergency exercise conducted at the airbase on April 14th was successful with the county passing with 13 objectives.

Also, he reported that the township met the 2006 requirements for the BWC, which makes us eligible for a 4% rebate later this year in October.

Mr. Klamut asked Chief Sayers and Mr. Parke if theft had been done at the cemeteries. He stated the Veterans placed over 1,600 flags at All Souls Cemetery to find that quite a few aluminum and bronze sticks had been stolen. Mr. Park said some had been stolen from our cemeteries. Mr. Glancy asked if a police report was made out and he said no, he thought it was better to get it low profile. Mr. Glancy further stated that keeping it quiet doesn't solve the problem

Safety Committee:

Chief Sayers said the quarterly Safety Committee Meeting will be on Tuesday, June 06th at 9:00 AM at the police station. Evelyn Coe asked what this committee was for and Chief Sayers explained its purpose.

Road Superintendent Parke:

Mr. Parke turned in his monthly report.

He also mentioned the department truck got a flat tire after crossing the railroad crossing on Route 305. Mr. Glancy said the railroad crossing on Bazetta Road is just as bad. Mr. Parke asked Chief McKenzie if any of his vehicles had any damage and the reply was no, but agreed the crossings are bad.

TIMBER CREEK HEIGHTS LIGHTING DISTRICT PUBLIC HEARING HELD AT TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATION BUILDING MONDAY, JUNE 19, 2006 AT 6:00 PM

Present: Bill Glancy, Mike Piros, Jeff Bates and Robyn Metheny.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Glancy then turned over to Mr. Piros.

The purpose of this hearing was to discuss Timber Creek Heights Lighting District which involves Bianca Lane, Keystone Trail and Corner Stone Drive.

Those in the audience consisted of Frank O'Brian and LuAnn Koch from Ohio Edison and three residents of Timber Creek Heights.

Mr. Piros introduced the representatives from Ohio Edison and explained the process which started back in September/October of 2005 at which time there was no commitment. Mr. Piros noted that the township would need 80% of the homeowners to say yes to move the project forward and the township would also need a commitment from the residents by their meeting on July 17, 2006.

Mr. Piros explained that the district consisted of 31 homes and the estimated cost for 13 lights and installation would total \$18,723.64. He also stated that Bazetta Township pays the up front cost and through a tax assessment the money is returned to the township over a two year period.

Mr. Piros asked if there were any questions.

One resident questioned the time limit. Mr. Piros replied the bids were good for 90 days.

There was a concern of who is responsible for the maintenance. Mr. O'Brian stated that Ohio Edison takes care of the maintenance.

It was questioned if Saddle Brook was included in this district. Mr. Piros stated that Saddle Brook was not part of this petition.

Public Participation:

Kathy and Al Parana, 2430 Andrews Drive, were present concerning sewers.

Mrs. Parana stated that 40 years ago when their house was built they were promised by Mr. Yount to have sewers in two years. She stated they do have sewers, but they just need to connect.

She questioned if there were any plans for sewers and if so when. Mr. Glancy stated the county is going to have the East Side Sewer meeting tomorrow night at Candlelite Knolls and mentioned they could attend and would have a chance to speak.

Mrs. Parana also complained about the appearance in front yards when new septic tanks are put in when you want to sell your house. Mr. Parke said per Attorney Finamore when the township took over the roads for this development, they took over everything with it.

Mr. Glancy said the commissioners could care less about the township.

Mr. Piros informed Mrs. Parana that we had sewer petitions at our office and that she should get signatures to get the process started because it would take at least two years. There is no commitment to sign petitions. The Ohio Revised Code must be followed. Petitions were given to her at the meeting.

Mr. Piros noted to Mr. Glancy that Mr. Newbrough had called him to set the room up at Candlelite Knolls for the meeting on Tuesday.

Ronald Snell, 3719 Hoagland Blackstub Road, spoke about his problems with his neighbor Mr. Medzie. He has several junk cars, is burning garbage, high grass, and four wheeler problems.

Mr. Bates questioned the Administrative Search Warrant.

Mr. Glancy replied that pictures were taken the first time and why pay for a warrant when everything should have been taken care of the first time by our zoning inspector and police chief.

Chief Sayers stated that under Code 50587, Nuisance, the search warrant would allow him to enter onto the property and take pictures and check out the property. This is the legal process you must go through.

Mr. Glancy disagreed with Chief Sayers.

Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Mauger how many times he has been there and Mr. Mauger replied 3-4 times.

Chief Sayers stated several times that it was outside the scope of my authority to go and remove the vehicles.

Mr. Glancy disagreed and said we should drop the whole system and turn the township into a junk yard.

Chief Sayers stated that if there was a zoning violation, the zoning board must go to the Trustees to make a ruling.

Mr. Glancy replied then why do we need a zoning inspector?

Mr. Glancy repeated the statement that was made at a previous meeting which was when Chief Sayers was asked if the cars were in Timber Creek would they be gone and his reply was yes.

Mr. Glancy again disagreed with Chief Sayers.

Chief Sayers replied that the legal counsel does agree with me.

Chief Sayers was told to proceed with the warrant.

They were told it has been tabled due to lack of funds.


Informed of repairs needed for stations 11 and 13.

We are to complete a survey detailing our priorities of areas of evaluation. When all the surveys are complete, the committee will look at hiring a consultant for a feasibility study. The cost of the consultant needs to be worked on, as it is not fair for all townships involved to split the cost down the middle because of the different budgets and population. For example, Howland population and budget is 2 ½ times larger then ours. We have 6,300 residents.

Mr. Glancy met with Mike Seyers, our Road Negotiations Representative along with the other two Trustees on June 19th at 8:00 AM. He also attended the Timber Creek Heights Street Lighting Project meeting on June 19th at 6:00 PM. Only three residents showed up.

He also attended with the other Trustees the Eastside Sewer Project at Candlelite Knolls at 7:00 PM on June 20th. Mr. Glancy attended the work session with the fire department at 8:00 AM on Monday, June 26th. Trustee Glancy and Piros attended the Regional Fire and EMS Service meeting at Howland on June 27th. On Wednesday, June 28th Mr. Glancy met with a Trustee from Springfield on their road negotiations as their union is requesting the Teamsters to represent them.

Mr. Piros said Trumbull County Commissioners Dan Polivka called him saying the commissioners should take action on the East Side Sewer Project in two weeks. Large sewer project 1.7 million. The commissioners gave \$160,000 to an engineering company to do the study. Mr. Glancy interjected by saying this Bazetta Board of Trustees are working on sewers every week.

Fire Chief McKenzie:

Chief McKenzie reported that he would be attending the Ohio Fire Chief's Conference in Columbus on July 19th through the 25th. He will be a candidate for Second Vice President of the Ohio Fire Chief's Organization for 2007. If elected, he will be First Vice President in 2008 and President in 2009. Mr. Piros asked if this was for the whole state of Ohio and the reply was yes. To run for Second Vice President, he will give up his Sergeant at Arms position,

Mr. Glancy asked when the new ambulance would be here and the reply was July 18th.

Chief McKenzie said we are borrowing a vehicle from Brookfield Township as a spare to get us through the fair, which is July 09th through the 16th. The fair board agreed to pay \$200 per day for one man from the hours of 1:00 PM to 8:00 PM inside the fairgrounds to stand by in case of an emergency. That person will contact the station for assistance. The evening events will be contracted out by the fair board for a private company.

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Due to a medical emergency for his wife, Road Superintendent Frank Parke was unable to attend the meeting.

Zoning Inspector Mauger:

Mr. Mauger gave his monthly report and said he is working on abandoned houses and working with the Trumbull County Health Department as their representative quit a few months ago.

Mr. Mauger informed the Trustees he sent out two certified letter on property at 466 Wilson-Sharpsville Road and 3723 Bazetta Road. These property owners have 30 days from the date of the letter to clean up their property.

Mr. Glancy asked about the high grass at 3723 Bazetta Road, as it is 10' from his house. Mr. Piros said each incident has to be declared a nuisance per legal counsel. We can not do a blanket motion. Each time requires a new resolution. The cost of the township to do this will go o the property owner's taxes with money returned to the township once the property is sold or property taxes are paid.

Mr. Glancy said the fire department took a census and there are 27 vacant houses in the township.

Per the auditor, Mr. Mauger said Trumbull County has 800 foreclosures and the sheriff sale is two years behind.

Mr. Mauger said there is property with 4' grass, garage falling in and a car jacked up with no tires on and no one knows where the property owners are.

Mr. Piros said the problem is the mortgage companies are difficult to locate as they are out of state.

Chief McKenzie asked Mr. Mauger about the property at 460 North Park and the reply was there is a lien filed against it and nothing can be done at the present time.

Mr. Glancy said most people have liens or mortgages on their houses.

Mr. Mauger asked the Trustees if some community organization, the Boy Scouts, could mow the high grass in the township and Mr. Glancy said no as they can't operate any motorized equipment and could get bitten by something. Then the township would be liable.

Chief Sayers had nothing to report.

Administration:

Mr. Piros reminded everyone of the July 14th deadline for the Fall Newsletter. He thanked Chief McKenzie for his report.

Mr. Mauger asked the Trustees to write a letter to the Zoning Board regarding House Bill #23 which expands the authority of local governments to regulate adult entertainment establishments. Mr. Piros will try to attend the July 05th zoning meeting.

Mr. Piros reminded everyone of the following meetings:

Mr. Piros said he has received several calls on why we cannot get a grant for the sewer projects. The township doesn't quality. Mr. Bates introduced Brain Prunty of the Soil and Water Conservation District who will address any flooding concerns.

Old Business:

Mr. Piros reported he checked with the office of the Trumbull County Commissioners and was told that the Eastside Sewer Project was not on their last week meeting agenda. It should be in a couple of weeks.

Mr. Piros contacted Gary Newbrough on Issue I grant money of \$300,000, which was rejected. Gary will re-submit this request for Issue I grant money of \$300,000 again next week.

Mr. John Campolita, 2280 Cornerstone submitted a petition with 28 signatures on it for the approval to install streetlights in Timber Creek Heights. There are 31 homes affected, 2 said no and one was not home.

Mr. Glancy said he received many phone calls on water problems and cemetery problems. After taking a ride through Hillside Cemetery, he stated the cemetery looks terrible.

Mr. Bates said he received a sewer petition for Andrews Drive Development and will take it to the Sanitary Engineer's Office.

Public Participation:

Mr. Tom Hyde, 2660 McCleary Jacoby Road, had concerns about his neighbor's pond draining onto his property. He thanked Mr. Glancy who came out last week to look at this problem. Mr. Prunty was also at this site and suggested three options for the owner of the pond. Mr. Hyde is concerned about if the property owner does not abide by these recommendations.

Mr. Finamore stated it is a civil suit between the neighbors and to get a legal junction after the water flow is unreasonable. The township trustees do not have any jurisdiction in this matter. Mr. Finamore told Mr. Hyde to re-inspect the pond and give this information to his lawyer for him to take action.

Mr. Hyde wanted to know in the future if there is anything in the zoning regulations about building ponds like this one which is right on the property lines. Mr. Finamore said water problems are outside of zoning regulations.

Mr. Glancy suggested to Mr. Hyde that he attend the next zoning meeting with his concerns.

Mr. John Tomko, McCleary Jacoby Road, also voiced his concerns on the same pond problems.

There being no further questions, Mr. Prunty left the meeting at 7:45 PM.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, asked about moving the township administrative offices to the police station. Mr. Glancy said this was tabled at the present time due to the budget. She informed the trustees they cannot move this office without the consent of the voters per ORC511-01.

She also asked how long the Deputy Clerk from Howland is going to be helping Martha. Martha replied she comes out once a month to make sure we will have a clean audit in 2007. Martha attended OTA Winter Conference in February, 2006 and attended workshops that were available earning credits of 6.25 hours. Mrs. Tennant said there are classes in Warren that Martha can take and will get her the information.

Mrs. Tennant had copies of the township's cell phone bill and usage of each employee that she handed to the trustees, Martha and Mr. Mauger. She said there were many personal calls made from the township issued cell phones. She wanted to know if we had a cell phone policy and the reply was no. You can't use public property for personal use. She also wanted to know who voted to have cell phones as she didn't have one when she was a trustee. Mr. Glancy said everyone has a cell phone.

Mr. Governor, McCleary Jacoby Road, works in the township park and said he was told his cell phone was for business calls only.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, wanted to know who has cell phones. We issued 24 cell phones to include the Road, Police, Zoning, Trustees, Martha and Robyn.

Mr. Finamore said most townships issued cell phone to officials and the department heads. The State Auditor gives government entities three options for cell phone policies. One is a reimbursement option where the employee uses his or her personal cell phone for business and gets reimbursed. Second is township paid cell phones which the employee uses a township-issued phone, but can use it for business. The third option allows the employee to use the phone for business and personal use, but the employee pays a set percentage of the bill for their personal usage.

Mrs. Tennant said that is fine for the future, but questioned who will pay these charges back to the township.

Mr. Piros said the trustees would look over these bills. The minutes are purchased as a pool and divided among all users.

Mrs. Hineman suggested to the board that they re-look at who should get a cell phone.

Mr. Bowen, State Route 5, said we have changed phone companies so many times in the past.

Mrs. Tennant re-emphasized, "Do not use public property for personal use".

Mr. Hineman asked Mrs. Tennant how many personal calls were made on company time and the reply was quite a few.

Mr. Finamore suggested again that the trustees should look at who really needs a cell phone.

Mr. Finamore told the public that the township is in the process of establishing a cell phone policy.

Mr. Bob Rozycki presented his case about his son, Ryan's, car being stolen twice. The first time was on July 13th at the Speedway Gas Station on Market Street in Warren, and the second time was on July 14th at Perkins Restaurant in Bazetta.

Ryan was on his way to work when he noticed his car parked at Perkins Restaurant on July 14th. He called 9-1-1 and was told that a police officer from Bazetta would be there shortly. Chief Sayers responded and told Ryan to go home (which is only 15 minutes away on Perkinswood) to get his second set of keys and Chief Sayers would stay with the car until his return. In the meantime, Chief Sayers receives another call of an apparent break in and goes to that call leaving Ryan's car unattended. Ryan returns from home and both his car and Chief Sayers are gone. Mr. Rozycki told the public to not vote for any police levies, as they aren't doing their job. He suggested to Chief Sayers he should have called for assistance on his cell phone. Mr. Rozycki asked Mr. Finamore "if that guy in Perkins had a gun, where would I be tonight? After no response, Mr. Rozycki emotionally left the meeting.

Mrs. Hineman interjected that when she needed the police, they weren't there for her either.

Mr. Bowen stated we are told there are always two on duty for every shift.

Mrs. Hineman said she was trying to teach her son auto safety and told him not to use his cell phone while driving. While she was out for a drive with her son, she noticed Bazetta police officers talking on their cell phones while driving. They should set the example for our young people.

Mr. Bates mentioned Ryan Rozycki called him on Friday and he told him to write down everything that happened so the board could review the situation and take disciplinary action, if necessary.

Mr. Bates said that at the last meeting, the board and Chief Sayers discussed coverage at the fair and we were told road patrols would not be affected. But now I hear the Chief was the only one on duty that day.

A work session was scheduled for Wednesday, July 26th at 8:00 PM at the administration building with the police department.

Bill Tomsich, 3071 Bazetta Road, suggested that the trustees get active and impose a Clean Water Tax for all the sewer problems in the county. He has had conversation with Commissioner Heltzel and State Representative Law on this. He says everyone should pay for sewers - \$50 per year for residents without septic tanks and \$150 per year for residents with septic tanks, which would be put on their tax duplicate. In 30 years we can see progress. The money spent now is costly and it is still a septic tank. There will be upgrades on a yearly basis plus pumping and the filter beds have to be cleaned. Mr. Tomsich doesn't think the Commissioners and the Board of Health are being considerate in this matter. He gave an example of his former employer, Grant Oaks, who had to drill twice for water. We are ruining our water supply. He further stated that the upgrade of Sterling Drive Plant for the Lakeshore Allotment is about 1.5 million. He suggested to the trustees that they get together with other townships and work at getting something done countywide.

Mr. Finamore said he is the Vice President of the Trumbull Township Association and we have sent resolutions to the state requesting money for our county's sewer projects. The only problem is the money goes to the city first then the townships. Mr. Finamore said to get what Mr. Tomsich suggested would have to go on the ballot and the people with sewage systems would not vote for it.

Mr. Glancy said we have three powerful people, the commissioners, but whom all live in the city and they don't care. We have been fighting this for years.

Mr. Finamore said the state should pass a law.

Mr. Glancy said the septic tanks that are put in today might not be approved in a year.

Mr. Tomsich mentioned the septic tank on Bazetta Road, which was put in when the house was built about three years ago and had to be replaced recently. He wanted to know if everyone knew which septic tank he was talking about. The reply was yes.

Harley Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, said no one gave any money to him when he had to replace this septic tank at a cost of \$15,000.

Pearlene Lyman, Westview Drive, said their street sewer project is in the engineering stage now and asked whey does it take so long for a simple project.

Mr. Finamore said the Sanitary Engineer outsources to an independent engineering firm so there is no conflict of interest.

Mrs. Hineman said at their meeting on June 20th no one stood up to say anything against the sewer project.

Mr. Finamore said the commissioners and health board are forcing us to bite the bullet.

Mrs. Hineman said we can't sell our houses because of the septic issue.

Mrs. Lyman referred to the lost \$300,000 grant money. Who applies for this? Mr. Finamore said the county does, as the township has no authority and said there are no grants for sewer projects. Issue I money can only be used for sewers. Mr. Finamore pointed out that the county put up \$800,000 for the Vienna Airport sewer project.

Mr. Piros said the Ohio Department of Development is for industrial not residential.

Mr. Finamore suggested to Mrs. Lyman that she go to a Commissioner's meeting.

Mr. Tennant said Yount put in sewers on Perkins Jones Road up to the apartments so he could sell off his property lots. He tied in and paid for his own. Yount paid for the sewers and the money from homeowners that tied in is just sitting here and will have to go to Yount's estate as he just recently passed away. He said the estate should get the money, not the county.

Mr. Bowen asked about the sinkhole on Bazetta Road that Yount put a pipe underneath the garage many years ago. The trustees along with the Road Superintendent, Police Chief and Fire Chief were at the scene and since this comes from a private drive, Harvest Drive, under a county road, the trustees have not jurisdiction.

Mr. Piros said the distribution is not equal. Mahoning gets double what Trumbull gets.

Mr. Finamore said there is an application you must fill out to certify 10 years of infrastructure. Seems it all goes to Mahoning County, Youngstown and then Trumbull. Townships go into small government units and the township with the most population gets the most points and city and county with the big projects like sewer and water.

Old Business:

Mr. Piros received a call from a resident regarding the railroad crossing at Route 305. The trustees wrote a letter on June 20th to Norfolk-Southern Railroad Company regarding concerns on three crossings; namely Route 305, Phillips Rice Road and Bazetta Road. We are waiting for a follow-up.

Mr. Glancy reported he attended a meeting at Howland on the consolidation of fire services from five townships. The feasibility study cost is between \$7,000 and \$8,000 per township. He felt this would have no advantage to our township. He also stated the Fire Chiefs will go over the areas to be evaluated such as dispatch, emergency/disaster management and community demographics. He said there were 15 people in attendance and 7 were from Howland.

Mr. Piros interjected that the distribution is not fair. Some townships have a higher population and some have bigger budgets.

Mr. Bates stated he would like to have a meeting with our BWC Employer Service Representative and asked Martha to set up a date and time to discuss our 10-Step Plan of Action which is due by September 30th.

He is signing up for a training class in September with BWC for a 6-hour credit.

Mr. Bates stated he and the other two trustees met with our representative from Alltel and Mr. Glancy and Mr. Piros will be taken off the national plan with the township, which will reduce the monthly cost. Mr. Bates said Robyn Metheny, Administrative Secretary, and Jerry Mauger, Zoning Inspector, will turn in their phones as well. One of the items to consider in a future work session will be to put restrictions on some employee's phones.

Mr. Bud Bowen, State Route 5, made a comment that he thought the township cell phones were issued only for township business.

Mr. Piros said we have a cell phone policy and the trustees are working with our legal counsel on this and will look at having it completed at the next meeting.

Public Participation:

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins-Jones Road, read the cell phone policy, which was dated March 07, 2005 and suggested we add to the present policy and define casual use and not pay Mr. Finamore.

Janet Perhach, Northview Drive, asked if any other employees pay for their insurance. Mr. Piros answered that due to the union contracts, Fire has a \$1,100 cap and the Police have a \$1,000. Martha stated that not all fire and police employees pay the same amount as the family coverage is more expensive then the single coverage. Mr. Piros felt that a straight percentage would be a fair amount for all employees to pay.

William Calhoun, 1089 Prince Drive, had some concerns on the easement on Prince Drive that needs cleaned. His garage gets flooded which make his basement wet. The tile hasn't been cleaned for 20-25 years and asked to have it cleaned. A 12" pipe was put in and a 16" pipe should have been put in. Mr. Parke said he was there and has contacted Soil and Water.

Mr. Glancy asked if people are dumping something in the ditch and Mr. Calhoun said that could be. Mr. Glancy asked if this was on private property and the answer was yes. Mr. Parke says the catch basin overflows and floods the road. Mr. Parke asked that each property owner sign an easement paper.

Mr. Piros authorized Mr. Parke to proceed with the easement form and bring it back to us. Mr. Piros also authorized him to do the necessary work.

Mr. Glancy told both Mr. Parke and Mr. Calhoun that he will help in getting the easement papers signed by the property owners.

Ken Flack, State Route 5, has concerns about the low-hanging tree branch at the intersection of Cadwallader-Sonk and McCleary Jacoby Road that is obstructing the view of trucks and other large vehicles.

Mr. Piros said this is out of our jurisdiction and we had our legal counsel write the homeowners a letter some time ago. He will have this put on the agenda for the next meeting, as Mr. Finamore will be present.

Mr. Flack also mentioned a bush at the corner of State Route 46, McCleary Jacoby Road and Cadwallader-Sonk Roads. The bush is so overgrown that his mirrors have been damaged. Mr. Piros said if this is in the right-of-way, we can trim them.

industrial properties with access to major roads and rail. To use the grant money, we need a buyer.

Mr. Piros received a call from Greenwood regarding the Sidley property so there is still interest out there.

Mr. Glancy said that Diane Sauer's Chevrolet was looking at this property at one time, but General Motors has a regulation that dealerships can only be within so many miles of each other.

Mr. Parke made a comment that Harmon Motors Car Lot is empty and for sale along with the batting cages on State Route 5.

Mr. Glancy made a comment he can't convince the Lodge Committee that cabins make more sense then a lodge. They have spent some \$80,000 for a feasibility study. Mr. Piros agreed that cabins would be better for the community.

Mr. Glancy said he goes to Pymatuning Lake and the cabins there are always full at a low cost and the people are out shopping in the area for food, gas, etc. Cabins here would be a big boost to the State Park and our community.

Mr. Bud Bowen, State Route 5, said look at the fairgrounds. Mr. Piros said don't go there as that is a sore subject with me.

BAZETTA TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, AUGUST 21, 2006 AT 7:00 PM

Old Business:

Mr. Piros stated he met with a resident on Lakeshore Drive about a water problem. Mr. Smith from the Trumbull County Engineer's Office was called out and will do a study of the problem.

Mr. Piros received the first draft of the township newsletter from Howland Printing and after making some modifications the newsletter should go out to all registered voters sometime during the first week of September.

Mr. Piros met with residents in Timber Creek regarding a water problem

This board has many sewer projects going on. The Trumbull County Commissioners approved the East Side Sewer Project and the West Side Sewer Project is in progress. He stressed these sewer projects are county projects not the township. The county has to go for any grant money. He researched a total of 95 grants trying to get some assistance for our residents and found maybe one that could apply, but it would be a short term loan at 4% and most residents couldn't afford it. That is why the county went for a bond for 20 years. He will turn this information over to Gary Newbrough. Low income and EPA grants do not apply. We would like to go on record that this board is actively involved with sewer problems.

Mr. Glancy went with Mr. Parke to Prince Drive regarding some draining and easement problems.

Mr. Glancy along with the other two trustees attended work sessions with the road and fire departments and attended a 5-hour negotiation meeting with the road department.

Mr. Bates and Martha will meet on September 06^{th} with Mary Betts from the BWC on our 10-Step Program that is due on September 30^{th} .

Mr. Bates expressed his gratitude to all the department heads and their employees in the reduction of BWC claims as we received over \$23,000 credit on our premium for the last half of 2005.

Public Participation:

August Fauvie, 2491 Andrews Drive, said his development has about 40 homes in it and wants to know what the trustees are going to do about sewer lines at the street. The sewer lines are in, but we still have septic systems. Mr. Bates said that he personally took a sewer petition to the Trumbull County Engineer's Office and is waiting for a response from Mr. Newbrough.

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Mr. Fauvie said the tile was put in some 20 years ago. Mr. Piros said we have no jurisdiction for sewer lines.

Mr. Finamore, Legal Counsel, stated sewer lines do not belong to the township they belong to the Trumbull County Commissioners, Sanitary Engineer and the Board of Health.

Mr. Glancy said a few years back we stepped over and did help out the residents there, but we do not maintain sewers.

Mr. Bates said the process takes about two years after the petition is received.

Mr. Fauvie said the sewers were put in by Andy Yount. His house is plumbed for city sewers. Mr. Piros said the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer has to do a study.

Art Kreller, 2366 Andrews Drive, asked how the procedure works. Mr. Piros explained a petition has to be submitted with at least 80% of interested residents for the Commissioners to approve the engineering study. Then a public hearing is held letting the residents know the cost and how it can be funded. The residents have a waive period and if the majority say yes, then the project is awarded for a construction bid. It does take 1 ½ to 2 years after the petition is submitted.

He agreed with Mr. Glancy that we did try to unplug the sewer on Andrews Drive a few years ago, but then Mr. Parke had to call the county out and we paid the county.

Mr. Finamore said it is a dedicated sewer and belongs to the county. Draining ditch belongs to the township and anything under the road belongs to the township as we are obligated to maintain the township roads.

Mr. Kreller went into the woods when the loggers were cutting down trees by the railroad tracks and found 10' square with a manhole cover in the woods with the words "sanitary sewer" written on top of the manhole cover. He called the county and they said it was a "dummy", the township said it was not.

Carolyn Wolanzyk, 2460 Andrews Drive, asked if sewers are put in, then where does the waste go? Mr. Piros said there would have to be a lift pump station and treatment plant.

Mr. Glancy said there is a waste water treatment plant on the south side of Warren. The engineering study will determine if one is necessary and where it will go. Mr. Glancy said Lakeshore Allotment will have one and will be put at the end of Lakeshore Drive.

Mr. Finamore said the lift station pump will send it to the plant for treatment.

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Mr. Kreller asked if it would be possible to tie in with the new Super Wal-Mart and Mr. Finamore said that could be a possibility if Wal-Mart would pay for it.

Mr. Fauvie stated the blacktop has 1/4" cracks through it and asked if it could be filled in so the cracks don't erode over the winter. The board will point this out to Mr. Parke as we could use tire grant money for that project.

Mr. Kreller asked about the driveway entrances chipping away.

Mr. Glancy said it was called to the board's attention about the gas well trucks, but the fire trucks and school buses weigh the same.

Mary Beth Hayer, 2962 Ivy Circle, asked about dog control. Mr. Finamore said dogs should be on a leash when not on their property and under control while on their property. She asked about cats running loose. Mr. Finamore said nothing under the law says anything about cats. If there is an issue, contact the neighbor. Mr. Sayers said if there are any problems with animals, call the police department. Mary Beth said she lives in a private community and Mr. Sayers stated it is still in the township.

Carolyn Wolanzyk, Andrews Drive, asked about trapping in the woods behind her. Mr. Bates said hunters are required to get permission to hunt on private property and the township has no jurisdiction on private property and she should call the State Park for the game warden's phone number. He thought it was 1-800-POACHER.

Mrs. Fauvie, Andrews Drive, said Andy and Margaret Yount wouldn't let anyone on their property.





The Board of Appeals recently met on Stonegate and only approved 20 lots. A new Notice of Appeal request will need to be re-applied for the additional 11 lots.

Mr. Glancy who also attended the Board of Appeals meeting felt the Chairman, Mr. Koper, did not treat Mr. Hope, the engineer, fairly. Mr. Glancy thought he was very rude to Mr. Hope.

Mr. Glancy further stated that due to tonight's meeting, he was unable to attend a meeting that State Representative Tim Grendell of Geauga County was hosting on the new septic tank rules and regulations. Mr. Glancy will get in touch with Mr. Grendell's office in hopes of setting up a meeting here.

Mr. Bates said he received a complaint regarding a basketball hoop that is located in the township's right-of-way on Timber Way Drive in Timber Creek. A letter was sent to the resident and as of this date the basketball hoop is still there. School buses have hit the basketball hoop as well as our snowplow last year. Mr. Glancy asked that this has been a problem that long that it involved our snowplows last year.

Mr. Bates said if it is not removed, we are permitting children to play in the streets. He suggested it be moved back 18'. Mr. Parke said they are willing to move it back. He will contact them again as the 14 days from the date of the letter is October 19th.

Tom Miller, Bazetta Road and also a township police officer, said a bus could hit it.

Mr. Finamore said to have it moved, as it is a law.

OCTOBER 16, 2006

Public Participation:

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins-Jones Road, asked the board if anyone has paid their personal use of the township issued cell phone. The reply was no. At this time, Mark Finamore explained the cell phone policy and the revised cell phone policy. He said there was no extra cost to the township because the personal minutes used were within the plan. He said because of the amount of work involved in going over past cell phone statements to determine a reimbursement amount, he suggested to the board that they take no action unless a finding recovery was issued by the auditor when the township has its annual audit.

Mrs. Tennant further stated they you are the trustees and you used then illegally, so you should be checking everyone else's to make sure they aren't making personal calls.

Mr. Finamore further stated that there is a distinction between the trustees' phones and employees' phones. Trustees can pass a resolution allowing employees to use them for personal calls and get reimbursed as trustees have done with their revised policy.

Mr. Bates turned in his township issued cell phone and purchased a personal cell phone because he does not have a home phone. He is reimbursing the township \$20 a month for every month he used the township phone for personal use.

Mr. Glancy read off his phone bill that says zero for long distance and Mrs. Tennant said the bill may say zero but you still used it for personal use. After some discussion between Mr. Glancy and Mrs. Tennant, Mrs. Tennant said she is not done with that issue with Mr. Glancy and referred to the Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI).

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, said if you make a personal call on the township issued cell phone, pay for it.

Mr. Piros said he will get with the department heads and discuss pro-rating the bills. Mrs. Tennant said the trustees should enforce the policy for themselves as well as the employees.

Mr. Bowen said cell phones should be banned.

Mrs. Tennant asked the board about the \$10,000 landscaping bid for the township park and asked how many bids did you receive? Mr. Bates said only one bid was received from the park board.

Jack Governor, McCleary Jacoby Road, said several bids were sent out, but Jeff Mauger was the only one that responded.

Mr. Bowen said he works for Adgates and does bidding for them. Mr. Bates said he is doing the landscaping on his own, not with Adgates.

Mrs. Tennant asked the board about the opt-out for insurance benefits to employees, Mr. Finamore explained if the employee elected to go with their spouse's health care and there was a cost for the spouse's health care, the township would reimburse the employee once a year 20% of what it would have cost the township to have that employee covered under the health care package. She asked if anyone took advantage of that and only one this year and possible two employees for next year.

Mr. Finamore suggested Resolution #232-04 passed on September 20, 2004 should be revised to include the following:

"Move to amend Resolution #232-04 which established a group health insurance opt-out plan pursuant to Section 505-063 (ORC) to set the cash payment in lieu of group health care insurance benefits to a monthly cash payment equal to 20% of the average monthly health insurance premium of covered officials and employees."

Dr. David Brice, Timber Creek North, had a concern about street lights not working, damaged and leaning. He lives on the corner and would like to have another light put in. Mr. Piros asked if he could get him the number on the pole or the nearest address where the light is burned out and he could contact Ohio Edison. As far as putting in another light, that is part of the lighting district and the property owners have to pay for that. Seventy-eight lights were put in and the cost was divided by the homeowners. Mr. Piros gave a summary of the Timber Creek Heights streetlight project that was put on hold because the homeowners had planted shrubs or mulched around the tap-in boxes. Mr. Piros told Dr. Brice he would come down and look at the streetlights.

Safety Committee:

Chief Sayers reported the next meeting will be Wednesday, December 06th at 9:00 AM at the police station. Mr. Bates asked if the walk thru was done yet and Chief McKenzie said it will be completed by the end of the month. Chief Sayers said the township was reimbursed around \$4,500 because of our participation in the National Safety Council.

Mr. Bates said that while we are on the subject of safety, we should look at changing our Third Party Administrator (TPA) as our present one can't get us in a group rating for next year. This is something the Board should consider next year.

WITNESSETH

CLIENT and UCB in consideration of this agreement agree as follows:

SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED

2. **TERM**
