





Mr. Glancy then pinned a badge on Mr. Wasser.

#### **Old Business:**

No report from Mr. Piros.

Mr. Bates spoke on our BWC group rating and that he had contacted Sheakley Uniservice, Inc. to do a study of group ratings hoping that the township can again get into a group rating as our experience has been low. He explained that we pay BWC approximately \$80,000 - \$ 100,000 yearly and would like to see this amount lowered.

Had a meeting with Brain Prunty, Trumbull County Soil and Water, on the Timber Creek Heights flooding problems involving the Conservation League. This problem has been resolved.

Mr. Bates asked Mr. Parke about the incident to a township truck in the cemetery. He also asked if the insurance carrier had been contacted. Mr. Parke said he has contacted the insurance carrier and depending on the amount of the damage with our deductible, it might be better to repair it ourselves.

Mr. Glancy stated we have someone in the audience that our township can call anytime and ask for assistance in fixing a pothole, taking care of a tree, etc. and his name is Randy Smith, Deputy Engineer for Trumbull County and is also a Hartford Township Trustee.

Mr. Smith spoke of the concerns of ODOT District 4 and the Trumbull County Engineer's Office LPA status on the Bazetta Road Safety Project. John Latell, Trumbull County Engineer wrote an email to ODOT stating their concerns with the status of the Bazetta Road Project, which was identified as the number one safety project in Trumbull County. And with the construction of Wal-Mart at State Route 5 and Bazetta Road has heightened the concerns of completing this project in a timely manner. Trumbull County Engineer's Office participated in numerous meetings with ODOT and Eastgate and has followed through with all requests from appropriating a 10% local matching fund to completing the plans and specs to completing the clearing and grubbing in house. ODOT delayed this project because of namely, vacations and finding the time to get around to it. The Trumbull County Engineer's office was troubled by this information and it is their desire to complete this safety project as soon as possible and as economical as possible. Mr. Smith asked the Board for their support as most of this road is in their township by writing to ODOT expressing their concerns to have the Number One Safety Project finished in a timely manner.



### **Old Business:**

Mr. Bates stated he is still trying to get in touch with the Shakley Group regarding our BWC rating. We need to get in another group rating but might need to sit out a year.

Mr. Piros reported he attended a July 27<sup>th</sup> sewer meeting with the Trumbull County Commissioners and the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer on the Lakeshore Drive and the East Central Sanitary Sewer Projects. Some issues were brought up on the road cuts with the projects design consultant, ES & C Engineering Company.

Pertaining to the road cuts, the township will pave Northview, McCleary-Jacoby, Wilmar, and Circle while the engineering firm will pave Williams, Morrow, Lakeshore, and Westlake.

The Commissioners will go out for bids for 16-20 days and the awarded bidder has 150 days to complete the projects.

The trustees were asked to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the Commissioners and the trustees on these two sewer projects that should start in the fall of 2007.

Mr. Piros also stated he attended a July meeting with the Trumbull County Commissioners and Trumbull County Soil and Water on a utility tax being proposed that every resident would be charged \$30 with the township receiving half or \$15 dollars back. More details to follow at their next meeting at the end of August.

He noted that he had received a request from the Bazetta-Cortland Historical Society for help with the cost to place a decorative wrought iron fence at the Casterline Cemetery. He and Chief Sayers wrote a grant application asking the Wean Foundation for \$5,000. The estimated cost of the fence was \$10,000. If the grant is not approved, the project will likely die as the township cannot afford to assist the society at this time from the General Fund.

He showed a metal "Lakeview Bulldog Country" sign that Kathy Moody had given to him asking if these signs, which will be donated by the Lakeview Athletic Association, can be placed on our "Welcome to Bazetta Township" signs. Mr. Parke said permission will have to be received from the State and County as some of these signs are on their roadways. Mr. Piros asked him to get this permission and to let him know how many signs the township needs from the Lakeview Athletic Association.

Regarding the Timber Creek Heights Lighting Project, Mr. Piros sent letters out to local electrical contractors and has not received any as of this date. He did speak with one representative and his company will be forwarding their quotes in the next week or so.

Mr. Piros showed pictures of two nuisance properties-one on North Park and one on Warren-Meadville to the trustees and asked the Zoning Inspector to investigate these.

Relating to issues with our cell phone contract with Alltel and their representative who hasn't returned our many calls and/or cannot produce a copy of a contact between us, Mr. Piros asked Chief Sayers to get some quotes on various cell phone carriers for a total of four phones. Chief Sayers gave the Board a copy of the cellular plan analysis involving three carriers-AT&T, Cellular One, and Sprint. After much discussion, the board decided to go with Cellular One for 900 shared minutes at a monthly cost of \$74.68 plus taxes for four phones.

He does not want to have to lay off any full time firefighters. The reason the station on Everett-Hull can't be closed is because that is where the department's data goes. He told the Board that his staff is very cooperative and understanding as we try to get through this difficult time.

He invited the Board to come to a meeting on Thursday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> with the local and union personnel to promote the 2.0M new levy and the 1.5M renewal levy that will be on the November 6<sup>th</sup> ballot. Mr. Piros said he will be in attendance at this meeting.

Janet Perhach, Northview Drive, asked about the resident's insurance rate and Chief McKenzie said this would not impact that since the station is only being closed every third day.

Mr. Piros said that McCleary-Jacoby Road station will not be closed every day-just every third day.

# Road Superintendent Parke:

Road Department Superintendent Frank Parke gave the Board the proper documents to be signed by the board on Township Highway 199-B (TH-199-B) Durst-Clagg Road Improvement. This project was previously approved at the July 16<sup>th</sup> meeting with Resolution #126-07. Mr. Glancy said he wanted to look at these documents before signing them. Mr. Parke said he and Martha will get together to place the legal ad in the Tribune for bids for August 24<sup>th</sup> and again for August 31<sup>st</sup> with a deadline of Monday, September 10<sup>th</sup>.

The county said they had a problem with their machine and would sand blast the road and re-do the striping. Mrs. Tennant than asked him why he called home 14 times in September, 37 times in October, 22 times in November, 25 times in January, 23 times in February, 23 times in March, 24 times in April, and 21 times in May.

She asked if anyone in the room calls home 37 times in a month. Mr. Glancy said he is out of town a lot.

She said this was unacceptable and thinks this is a misuse of township money.

Mr. Glancy said he made a mistake. Mrs. Tennant said you called Las Vegas 8 times and it's a mistake.

She then asked Mr. Piros for his opinion and he replied that he had asked Mr. Glancy if he could justify that amount and the reply was yes.

This is illegal and Mrs. Tennant asked Mr. Glancy to give us a check in the amount of \$439.68 and went on to say this is the second time she has questioned the use of cell phones for the township.

Mr. Glancy said if he made a mistake, he will reimburse the township.

Jack Governor, McCleary-Jacoby Road, stated that Elliott Metheny had put 12 hours of service in at the Park and thought his picture should be placed in the newsletter we send out.

He also stated that something has to be done about garbage being left in the pavilion after parties.

Mr. Piros asked how can we solve this? Mr. Governor said that if reservations could be taken with a fee and the fee be reimbursed if they clean up.

Mr. Piros used the example if a party was from 10:00 AM until noon and another party was from 1:00 PM-3:00 PM, how would we know who didn't clean up the garbage. Mr. Governor said that the police go in the park several times during the day. Mr. Piros said the Board will give this some thought.

Mr. Governor asked if a truckload of mulch could be delivered and Mr. Piros said we have already appropriated some money for this and to go ahead and order the mulch.

Mr. Piros wanted to bring up the statement that was made at the last meeting about the trustees spending an expenditure of \$12,000 on a study to add on to the present Police Station to house the administrative offices. There was no contract or money spent. This was stated in our June 5, 2006 minutes. The board has tabled the moving at the present time.

Mr. Piros also expressed his concerns from residents complaining about the loud noise from the Fair Grounds during the weekend of August 24<sup>th</sup> that went on beyond midnight and could be heard as far away as two miles.

He called Mr. Roscoe of the Fair Board and stated that we have a Noise Control Resolution put in place since November of 2004 and also a zoning regulation Section 29 of our Zoning Book on Regulation of Temporary Mass Gatherings. Mr. Roscoe said he was unaware of these regulations. Mr. Piros asked the Board for permission to write a letter to the Fair Board and to develop a permit that must be completed 30 days prior to any event of more than 2,000 persons not sponsored by the state or any of its political subdivision. This mass gathering will not affect the fair. Both Mr. Glancy and Mr. Bates agreed that a letter should be sent to the fair board along with a permit for them to complete in the future when they rent or lease out the fairgrounds.

Mark Finamore agreed they need to comply with the township regulations.

Mr. Piros will see that Mr. Bednar gets a copy of the letter and permit form as well as the Fire Chief and Police Chief.

Mr. Glancy said he read in the newspaper today about an increase of 9-1-1 service and also the increases of water and sewer that have been put in place recently.

Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Parke about the location of the new salt storage building. He wanted to know if we get a lot of rain, would the salt be washed down the creek. Mr. Parke stated no that there will be a six foot cement wall to prevent this.

Mr. Glancy said he received a meeting on Trumbull County Metro Parks and asked if one of the other trustees could attend, as he will be on vacation. Mr. Bates took the information.

Mr. Glancy said he also received phone calls at home about the noise at the fairgrounds. Some of the noise was still going on at 3:30 AM and could be heard in Mecca. He contacted the Prosecutor's Office, but has not heard back from them regarding our enforcement of the fairgrounds.

Mr. Piros said that the Mass Gathering regulation and permit should take care of this. The Zoning Inspector can shut them down without a permit and our police will back him on this decision.

#### Fire Chief McKenzie:

Fire Chief McKenzie handed the Board a plan that the two fire stations will be closed some days beginning on September 24<sup>th</sup>. He said that by keeping both stations staffed only 11-12 days a month, the department would save \$35,000.

Mr. Piros asked if the coverage will be the same and the reply was yes.

Mr. Bates said that by pulling the part-time monies only extended you by four weeks. He stated that the regular two week fire payroll is \$23,000 and the past pay was only \$18,000.

Chief McKenzie said the local and union personnel met on August 23<sup>rd</sup> to promote the new 2.0 mill new levy and the 1.5 mill renewal levy that will be placed on the November 6<sup>th</sup> ballot.

Mr. Piros said the taxpayers determine the level of service we can give to the community. If the levies do not pass, it will limit the service residents will receive. Due to the increase of health care, gas and other expenditures, these two levies are necessary.

Mr. Piros further stated in March, we scheduled meetings with the fire department regarding the short falls of anticipated funding. We changed third party billing companies, as the third party was not netting us the monies we should have received. We are now charging for rolling out equipment.

Mr. Bates asked the Fire Chief since the plan he proposed is only for the month of September, will the Board receive an up to date one and the reply was yes as soon as the new schedule is posted, a new plan will be given to the Board.

Chief McKenzie wanted to state for the record on the Tribune's write up on regionalization of the fire and EMS service. In November of 2006 the Board wrote a letter to Howland Township stating the current talks and expectations are too expansive in scope and they questioned the need of hiring a consultant. The Board felt we had experts in our Fire Department with experience that could accomplish the same thing without spending extra money. At that time, the Board stated they were no longer a participant.

Mr. Piros said this county gives money to do all kinds of studies that never go anywhere.

Mr. Finamore said other townships such as Vienna pulled out also. Bazetta wasn't the only one.

Mr. Glancy said we tried this with City of Cortland and the Mayor, then Mr. Linville, dismissed it, not us.

Mr. Bates said that editorial was written by someone and asked the Tribune to publish it.

Chief McKenzie said if we did stay with the regionalization, it would take at least two years to get it off the ground and when we were first involved, we were discussing BWC rates, health care and purchasing.

Mr. Piros said the committee looked at the whole picture and not at individual issues such as union contracts, health care providers. They should look at one issue at a time. Walk before you run.

Mr. Finamore said sometimes it is political. He gave the example of too many schools. We should consolidate, can't solve any problems right now.

Mr. Piros said he is not opposed to regionalization, but that they should think it out. Again he said this county is great for studies whereas this money could be used for other things.

Mr. Glancy said he questioned where it was going. He also agreed he is not against it.

#### **Road Superintendent Parke:**

Frank Parke has not heard from ConCord on the salt spreader and plow for the one-ton dump. He will table this for now.

He asked Mr. Finamore about the cement driveway on Fallehn Drive and the reply from Mr. Finamore was the letter was sent out on September 14<sup>th</sup> to the homeowner.

Mr. Glancy asked what the problem was and Mr. Parke replied he violated township driveway specs.

Mr. Piros said he is working with Chief Sayers on putting the entire zoning book on the web page. This should be done within two weeks.

Mr. Bates asked Mr. Parke if he could be more specific about the 218 hours letting water off roadways, storm damage, checking roads, etc. Mr. Parke said he would comply with this request in next month's report.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, asked Mr. Finamore if she had to leave the meeting if Mr. and Mrs. Lang were going to discuss their zoning variance application with the Trustees, since she is a member of the Board of Zoning Appeals which will be hearing the Lang's appeal. Mr. Finamore stated Mrs. Hineman did not have to leave the meeting and that her presence at the meeting did not constitute a conflict of interest, ethical consideration or appearance of impropriety.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, stated she had looked at several zoning permits and they were not figured correctly. She went back to January of 2007 and there is a difference of about \$836 that is due the township. Some permits were issued for residential and should have been issued for commercial. She wants a letter drafted to these residents informing them the formula used was wrong and to reimburse the township in a reasonable time period. Mr. Finamore stated he could prepare a letter requesting payment of the correct zoning permit fees from previously issued permit holders.

She called Jerry Mauger and asked him and he told her how he figured permits and they were wrong also. This is the taxpayer's money and should be reimbursed.

She also questioned the trustees on their selection of the Zoning Inspector as he had no prior experience but chose Mr. Bednar over another applicant who was qualified to be the Zoning Inspector who knew the rules and regulations of zoning. Has he had any training and the reply was yes he is going to seminars and he was getting trained by Mr. Glancy. Mrs. Hineman stated that she did not believe Mr. Bednar had yet attended any seminars.

Why would the trustees throw someone in a position without the proper qualifications?

She asked with Mr. Bednar if he had ever been to a township meeting and he informed her only when he was building his house.

Mr. Glancy said he was chosen and would have on the job training.

Mr. Finamore said the North East Planning has continuous education for Zoning Inspectors and advised Mr. Bednar to locate a seminar and if funds are available, to attend.

Mrs. Hineman said the previous zoning inspector's permits were worst, but Mr. Bednar's was a little better.

Mr. Finamore said he is available for any questions and has advised Mr. Bednar to contact him upon any situation that arises that is questionable.

Mr. Finamore also stated there is a Trumbull County Zoning Inspector Association that meets once a month and he referred them to Mr. Bednar.

Mrs. Hineman said she looked at the applications and why pick someone with no experience. This is not in the best interest of the township.

Mr. Glancy said he did not train Mr. Bednar, but did take him around the township showing him several problems. He tried to help him, but he was learning himself after Mr. Mauger left.

Mr. Glancy said he received 100 calls a month asking about commercial and non-commercial properties. Thanks to Wal-Mart zoning permit money, we have ordered through the Trumbull County Planning Commission a zoning map that will show all the properties in our township and will outline the different categories of each property. This map will be updated on a yearly basis and will take a year to complete.

Mr. Glancy said we hired Mr. Bednar as he was the best person to learn the job.

Jack Hineman, Northview Drive, asked why one signed permit was pulled and was it corrected?

Mr. Finamore said Mr. Bednar is to review and call him if necessary, as he is available to Mr. Bednar for any questions he needs answered.

Pat Mariano, Howland Wilson Road, said he was the low bidder for the salt storage building. He did everything correct and bid on the bid proposal/specifications that was given to all bidders. If he had a question, he either called the engineering firm or Mr. Parke for an answer. After

another bidder sent the township's legal counsel a letter stating the specifications were defective, my bid was rejected. Why wasn't the bid proposal/specifications reviewed by the legal counsel prior to awarding the bid. Mr. Mariano said the specifications were not defective. Once the township was challenged, they threw out the bid. Mr. Mariano said he didn't know if he was going to sue the legal counsel or the township.

Mr. Finamore said if the threat to sue him or the township by Mr. Mariano is true, he could not legally discuss this matter.

Mr. Finamore did say the township has the right to reject any and all bids.

Mr. Finamore said he was not asked to review the documents as Mr. Parke relied on the county engineer. My recommendation whether we get sued or not is that we reject the bid and re-bid the salt storage building. Not everyone was on the same page.

Mark Lang, Beaver Trail, stated he is the homeowner with the addition that is in question. He asked if a meeting of the Zoning Appeals Board has been set and Mrs. Hineman said it would be on Thursday, November 01, 2007 at 7 PM here at the township hall. Mr. Lang said he has not been notified and what if he can't attend.

Mr. Finamore said he would have to request a continuance.

Rose Stockton, McCleary Jacoby Road, submitted to the Board as well as to the Zoning Inspector a request for zoning change in regards to ponds. She reminded the Board of the problems that exist with a pond near her.

Mr. Bates asked if Soil and Water had been notified and the reply was yes and they were out, but cannot do anything about it.

Mrs. Hineman excused herself from the meeting at this time and exited the building.

Jerry Porter, McCleary Jacoby Road, asked about the Beaver Trail addition and why it was not stopped. It is not just a garage, it is a major renovation. Why wasn't it stopped before it was under roof and asked when they were notified?

Mr. Bednar said they applied for the permit he reviewed it and not being experienced, thought the drawings were okay with the setback lines but, was not aware of the road right-of-way.

He was notified by Mr. Parke that it was in the right-of-way and not in compliance with the township.

It was an honest mistake and other options were to undo or revoke the permit.

He contacted Mr. Finamore who drew up a revocation of Zoning Permit, which Mr. Bednar delivered to the property owners, Mark and Pamela Lang. At this time, most of the construction was complete.

Mr. Lang came to the township office and applied for a variance and that is the stage where they are today.

Mr. Parke was asked when he noticed it was not in compliance with the township, how far was the construction and the reply was the footer was poured with two blocks high.

The permit was revoked and the residents are in a bind.

Mrs. Hineman said the permit should have been revoked no matter what and if the Langs proceeded with construction it was at their own risk. Mr. Hineman asked what does it means when a permit is revoked. Mr. Finamore replied, if they proceed with construction they would be taking a risk that they might be required to remove their construction at their own expense and loss.

Mrs. Hineman requested that Mr. Finamore comment and advise as to when ethical consideration would require a Zoning Board of Appeals Member excuse themselves from hearing and deciding a case. Mr. Finamore stated that a Zoning Board of Appeals Member has a right to vote on all cases that come before the board, unless the member has a pecuniary interest in the case, or if because of personal bias, predisposition or prejudice the voting member felt that they could not make a fair and impartial judgment on the evidence in the case. Mr. Finamore stated that Mrs. Hineman would have to make that decision for herself on the date of the meeting.

Mrs. Stockton asked how far over and the reply was 14'.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, said it was Larry's mistake and he should read ORC 519-01 and should take a few hours every night and read the zoning manual

Mr. Lang asked that since a Zoning Appeals Board member was present at this meeting, but not at this time should she be able to vote on this variance?

Mr. Finamore said in proper ethics to make a good decision, she should refuse to vote or to give a fair opinion. Mrs. Hineman will have to decide that call on November 01<sup>st</sup>.

Mrs. Tennant said she did a good investigation for both parties.

Mr. Hineman said to Mr. Bednar that this is not personal, but do you know the zoning process. His reply was he is learning.

Pearlene Lyman, Westview Drive, asked about the Westview sewers and Mr. Piros said it is at the engineering study right now and then a public hearing will be held. She asked about grants and Mr. Piros said there are limited grants namely for low to moderate income, less than \$30 - \$40 thousand home value and fixed income of \$525 a month or less. We don't have anyone in the township that would qualify for these grants.

Mr. Glancy said Mr. Piros has looked at over 90 grants.

Thomas Lyman, Westview Drive, asked the trustees about the natural gas at lower rates that other townships are offering their residents. Mr. Piros said some townships found it cost more as they are locked into a fixed rate for 2 years.

Mr. Glancy said there are individual companies out there that are contacting residents for a lower natural gas rate.

Mrs. Lyman asked if the township would assist Upland Street as it needs attention. Everyone turns around there including the garbage truck and school buses and are tearing up the roads. The storm sewer drains have been knocked out and the road is sinking. We should get this fixed to protect the public.

Mr. Parke said he could take a load of grindings, but it is not a dedicated road.

Mrs. Lyman says she has a document from the Trumbull County Engineers accepting it is a public road.

Mr. Finamore said there are three ways a road can be accepted; private, public accepted or non-accepted. If the Commissioners accepted it as a public road, they should maintain it.

Mr. Glancy, Mr. Piros and Mr. Parke will look into this matter.

Mrs. Tennant asked about the cell phones that are not being used from Alltel and if we are paying for them.

Mr. Glancy said we are fighting with them right now as we have requested a copy of the contract and they can't produce one, but stated we are under contract until February 2008. We wrote them a letter in September canceling all phones. They want us to pay \$200 for 19 lines.

Mr. Finamore will draft a letter to Alltel.

Mrs. Tennant asked the Board to turn to page 125, paragraph 3, of last month's minutes. She stated Resolution #54-06 in February 2006 minutes it was approved to solicit a proposal from Jakubick and Associates for a feasibility study not to exceed \$25,000. Mr. Piros said we have not spent any money on this proposal.

Mrs. Tennant asked who drew up the plans and Mr. Piros said he did and that it was a rough hand sketch.

Mrs. Hineman said in 2006, 49 gallons of gas was used for the zoning inspector and in nine months to date only 18 gallons of gas was used. I believe we should bump this up so Mr. Bednar can go out and measure before permits are granted.

Mr. Hineman stated to the zoning inspector he would like to make recommendation to update zoning.

Mr. Finamore said the Zoning Commission meets occasionally on a regular basis with feedback from Mr. Bednar.

Mr. Finamore agrees that zoning should be updated and gave an example of cell towers will become obsolete and satellites will replace them.

He suggested to Mr. Bednar and the Zoning Boards go through the zoning book and update material as it becomes aware to them.

Mr. Hineman asked about billboards in the township. Mr. Bednar said two have been applied for.

Mr. Finamore said Federal Commission expended the townships and they have to put them up.



Trustees discussed the relocation of the administrative officer to the police station sometime in January, 2008.

As taxes decrease, it would be cost effective to move the administrative office to the Police Station. The township lost approximately \$100,000 in taxes for 2007. And could lose more in 2008.

Administration Building was erected in 1974 and has 1,600 sq. ft. with no access for handicap residents to go to the office. The meeting room is on the ground level.

Police Building was erected in 1998 and has 5,335 sq. ft. and is handicap accessible. Has up to date glass block windows and steel doors.

Administration Building has a gravel parking area of 140' X 153' whereas the Police Station has a paved 147' X 72' parking area with handicap ramps.

Administration Building has a 10' x 5' storage area and the Police Station has a 10' X 19' area for storage. We could order larger quantity of supplies at a lesser cost rather than order as we need them.

The archive files are stored in the basement of the Administration Building unsecured.

Administration Building has a panic button security system and many times there is only one employee in the building. The Police Building has a security system and the presence of police cars/patrolmen there at all times could deter any problems.

Both offices could be opened longer hours and the secretaries could help one another when there is a large volume of workload.

The Administration Office has a full time secretary and a fiscal officer.

The Police Department has two part-time secretaries. In an emergency situation, both offices would be open and manned.

Would eliminate a fax machine and the purchase of a new copier for the Administration Building and would combine the utilities.

Cost to move would be:

\$1,200 - Professional Mover

\$2,000 - Furniture

Savings would be approximately \$22,000 annually plus the sale or lease of the Administration Building and the sale of the unused furniture or equipment that would be sold.

There is sufficient space to move the Administrative Offices to the Police Station.

The move would promote accurate use of the township resources. Plus we would have a Police – Fire – Administration Complex all rolled into one area.

Only downfall is the location but the residents could be educated and new citizens could follow signs to the new location.

Mr. Piros asked Mr. Finamore if the administration building could be leased to a private company and the reply was yes. Mr. Glancy said any money from the leasing or sale of this property would be put in a special fund to update all township buildings. Mr. Piros said we could realize a total of \$50 or \$60,000 a year if we leased the building.

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, asked how the utilities would be divided here as some are shared With the road department and the reply was we would separate them at that time.

Mr. Piros stated we would keep this building available until after the March 04<sup>th</sup> primary. He has talked with the Board of Elections and was told we can move the polling places anywhere in the township. We could have the polls at the police station. After the March 04<sup>th</sup> primary election, we have so many days to notify the Board of Elections.

Mr. Sayers said the EMA office is interested in this building. Mr. Glancy said they have a grant and grant money can only be used to purchase and not lease. Mr. Sayers said that is correct. Mr. Glancy said we will consult with our legal council and will do what is most profitable for the township. Mr. Glancy would like to keep it owned by the township.

Mr. Piros said the board will take action after the first of the year. Hopefully we can be moved in before the first of February.

At this time, Mr. Finamore presided over the swearing in ceremonies for our new Trustee, Paul Hovis.

#### **Public Participation:**

Janet Perhach of Northview Drive asked what the criteria for sending out the snowplows are. Mr. Glancy suggested that Mr. Parke answer that question as he is on the front line. Mr. Parke said since our police officers are on the road and feel it is necessary for snow removal, they call 9-1-1 who their dispatcher calls Mr. Parke who in turn calls his department out. She asked if we have a problem we should call the police department.

Mr. Finamore said if you feel your street needs plowed and no one else has done it in a Reasonable time, then yes you are to call the police department, the non emergency number 330-675-2730 and they will call 9-1-1.

Art Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked Mr. Finamore why did we break away from Cortland and why can't we get back together with them. Mr. Finamore said this is a township policy question.

Mr. Glancy will answer the first question and there is someone in the room that was on the board at that time. He has a letter at home stating that Cortland wanted out, not Bazetta.

Mr. Finamore at this time asked Mrs. Tennant what year was the joint fire department formed and she stated it was probably 1987 – 88.

Mr. Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked if we would save money if we went back with Cortland and Mr. Glancy said we would have to look at it.

Mr. Glancy said he went to many meetings on consolidations and he heard many times that it would look nice to see our ladder truck in Champion.

Mr. Piros said there were three things that happened in resolving the joint fire board. The west side was not included and the east said of Bazetta was paying 66% and the east side station was not open. They would come and wash the trucks and then close the station. He said talks started with regionalization with Fowler, Vienna, Howland, Champion, Cortland and Bazetta. They talked that there could be Bazetta trucks in Howland or Champion. It encompassed a large area and you had contractual issues. Moving forward with regionalization, it would be better to go with the City of Cortland and I think this board would be willing to look at this in the future. We are open to those kinds of issues.

Mr. Glancy said we have not been closed out of those meetings. We have been talking now and then.

Mr. Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked for the total per household with the 2.0 Mill Fire/EMS Levy. Chief McKenzie stated it will be \$70 a year based on a \$100,000 home or 19 cents a day.

Mr. Glancy said that is very reasonable insurance.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, said that is reasonable, but most of the homes in Bazetta are more than \$100,000. Mr. Glancy said if you go to the hospital one time and are not charged, you made out.

Art Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked if the new Wal-Mart will help the safety forces. Mr. Finamore said the general property taxes go to the General Fund. The personal property taxes are being phased out and in a few years, you won't get that at all. Mr. Kreller asked if the new Wal-Mart is all in the township where the present Wal-Mart is half in Bazetta and half in Warren. Mr. Glancy said the present Wal-Mart and the new Wal-Mart are in the township. Mr. Kreller asked who purchased the old Wal-Mart and Mr. Glancy said they have told him it is sold, but won't say to who.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, said the voters voiced their opinion in November, why are you putting the levy back on in March?

Mr. Glancy said he is a resident also and pays taxes like everyone else and said we can't afford not to approve the levy. We had to lay off all our part-time firefighters and if it doesn't pass this time, we are going to lay off full-time firefighters. He said the fire department in 2007 operated on a 1998 budget.

Mr. Lance, State Route 305, asked if there were any government loans available.

Mr. Finamore explained the main revenues for townships are property tax which is divided between schools, townships and Fairhaven School, etc. Also, they get gasoline tax, liquor licenses that are approved and the local government fund is on hold as it is being phased out. The problem is new businesses coming into the area wanting tax abatement therefore, no new money comes in. State of Ohio had to cut their budget. Therefore, passing on the cuts to the townships, loss of revenues, wage freezes for employees, concessions by employees are also budget cuts. According to Ohio Law, safety forces are not permitted to go on strike. To resolve their grievances, an arbitrator is assigned who listens to both sides and issues an award. The residents decide on what level of protection they want.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, said Ohio is first in foreclosures and people are losing their jobs. It seems that the group that is paying is getting smaller and smaller. Where does it stop?

Mr. Glancy said when you call for a police officer or an ambulance, they are there for you.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, said she needs to say something. That has nothing to do with whether that ambulance is there or not. Nobody likes these gentlemen more than me, but they aren't going to like me very well as I am going to set up a committee to fight these levies. Our senior citizens cannot pay any more. Where is it written that everyone gets a raise every year? You have to say no.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, stated if I ran my household like you run the township, I can't come to you and ask for money because I over run my expenses. You have to run the township like a business. You have to cut back.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, hopes that Mr. Hovis learns to read a budget. I will teach him how. There are things in that budget that you guys are missing. If I brought in to you right now, would you know how to read it? I am talking to you two sitting up there running this township. If you could, you wouldn't be asking for that levy right now.

Mr. Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked how we keep that levy going on the ballot. Mr. Finamore said there are several things that need to be done. First the board looks at why they need the money, they pass two resolutions and then go to the prosecutor's office and then the Board of Elections for final approval for the wording. Secondly the township has to do an assessment of

what their resources are and what the cost of services are and what the township people can afford. If the levy doesn't pass, the Trustees will have to cut services, lay people off or run the government more efficiently from other areas.

Mr. Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked if there is a limit to the number of times a levy can be put on the ballot. Mr. Finamore said that is a good question and he doesn't think there is.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, wants to know why they ignored the voters. I wanted to come to your other meeting on December 10<sup>th</sup> that was cancelled. Mr. Glancy said it was not cancelled. The Tribune cancelled it, not us. Mr. Lance said he doesn't understand. It the voters said no, why are you putting it back on?

Mr. Finamore said you have to look at how the vote went. If you feel there was a fair amount of supporters and the difference would be to educate/explain to the no voters to convince them to change their minds.

Mr. Glancy said we had 4 meetings. Two were held on the east side and two were held on the West side and only a handful of residents showed up.

Bud Bowen said it is like the number of people you have at your meetings.

Jack Hineman, Northview Drive, asked Police Chief Sayers what and how you acquired these unbid items to be disposed of. The un-bid items are used printers, ride helmets, gas mask, etc. Since they are public property, you just can't throw them away; you need to go through bidding process and then dispose of items that did not receive a bid or that are unwanted.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, went back to his original question why is the levy going back on. Mr. Finamore said that the board felt the vote was close enough that more education and explanation could change some of the "no" voters and they would feel this is necessary.

Mr. Finamore said it comes down to the residents as to how much money they are willing to spend for the level of service they want.

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, said most of the people in the township are on social security and get no raises, but nobody cares about them. They just keep putting the levies on.

Mr. Finamore said the study show that 75% of the richest people are senior citizens. Mr. Bowen said look where they are, not in this township. Mr. Bowen said people in this township received a letter that their social security is going to be cut.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, asked Mr. Finamore about a letter that zoning money can't be

collected. We could recoup thousands of dollars. She can't understand why we can't collect some of that money. Mr. Finamore said to go back to these people and ask for more money because we changed our formula.

Mrs. Hineman talked about a statement that was read at the November meeting and why it wasn't included in the minutes? She spoke with Mr. Piros and Mr. Finamore to go to Martha with the corrections for the October meeting. Martha asked her if she was referring to the statement Mr. Glancy read and the reply was yes. Martha said she does not have a copy of that statement.

Mr. Finamore said what Mr. Glancy read at that meeting should be in the minutes. Mrs. Hineman said they weren't. Mr. Finamore advised Mr. Glancy to give Martha a copy and she will include in the minutes and give Mrs. Hineman a copy of the minutes as to township minutes.

Mrs. Hineman asked Mr. Finamore what Mr. Glancy did was legal and the reply was yes.

Tom Lance asked Mr. Finamore is it illegal to override the majority vote. Mr. Finamore said the trustees have the authority to put any levy on at any time they want.

Jack Hineman said he is talking as a private citizen. Most people can't afford to pay taxes. I have to say in my Delphi paycheck in the federal and state taxes, but I do have a say so in the township taxes. These taxes stay here. What controls my livelihood in this township are the taxes, the police, fire and road. We have lost control of this money. I would love to protest my local and federal taxes. I don't want to learn the hard way about our police and fire. The schools and roads were here when I moved to the township, which were paid by someone else.

Tom Lance said to Mr. Hineman, we both have good jobs. I work for Ohio Edison, but what about the people on social security and fixed incomes. It is not about me, it is about those people who voted and now it is going back on.

Mr. Finamore said what you said is true, but look around. If those people were concerned they would be here tonight. We have a handful of residents that show up for these monthly meetings.

Art Kreller said his taxes went up \$500 and now you want \$70 more. Mr. Glancy said most of the tax money goes to the school.

Mr. Finamore said most of the residents 65 and older get a homestead exemption. They will get a \$400 refund in 2008. State of Ohio reduces your taxes 10% for a rollback, but the township still gets the full amount.

Mr. Bowen said they told him at the court house you only get \$200. Mr. Finamore said that was for a half.

Dave Lutz, Woodland Trails, moved into this township in 1962 and was a volunteer fireman for three departments for 24 years. They didn't have ambulances then, they came from the funeral homes. I can't understand why the residents don't want to give these guys 19 cents a day. They do a "hell of a job".

Mr. Glancy said one good thing is you don't have to tap into the water line, but you do if a sewer line is put on your property.

Mr. Perhach asked about Aqua Water and Mr. Glancy said the county won't let them in. The well that Southington Township drilled hit gas and had to be filled in.

Mr. Glancy said this board is fighting to get water in this township.

Mr. Glancy said the sewer line being put in on Bazetta Road is by a private contractor. He said he inquired about getting water to the Optimist Club and the contractor said he would have to hire an engineer and go from there.
