Mr. Glancy said he will take the police department since he know more about that then the other two departments and would like to have a discussion about this later.

Mr. Piros explained the purpose and procedure of department liaisons. It is a direct communication between the trustee and the department and if there is an issue, the trustee is the first one they call and you visit the department on a routine basis and report back to the board.

Mr. Hovis will take the road department and Mr. Piros will take the fire department.

Relocating the administrative offices was discussed.

Attorney Ned Bold of Harrington, Hoppe & Mitchell Law Firm approached the board saying he represents some of the neighboring residents as the Coe's and the Stockton's, who live near the fire and police stations on McCleary Jacoby Road. He mentioned he has only been involved in the last few days. He has taken the time to look at the zoning and other issues pertaining to this move. I look at the zoning book and particular at page 5 pertaining to classifications about buildings being included in R-2 District. It looks like you never changed the classification from what is there now and you want to increase that activity. He said the township is violating our own zoning ordinances. It also states it should be on a major thoroughfare and McCleary Jacoby Road is not. Also, it talked about 3 acres and that is only 1.8 acres. He has checked this with the Auditor's Office. At this time he showed pictures of when the Coe's moved in. He said when the property was originally given to the township by the Conservation League it was for a volunteer fire department. It has now blossoms into a full-time fire department and police department. There is a lot more activity going on. Lights are disturbing to the neighbors and he will discuss that at a later time. He then showed a picture of what it looks like today. You can see how crowded it looks and does not meet with zoning ordinances. He showed a larger photograph of the neighborhood. He asked the board how many of you would like that in your neighborhood. Would not be a comfortable situation. We ask that you not expand your uses any further then what you have now, because it is going to bring in more traffic, crowded street and you have children on that street and it is a narrow road. It is already a problem for the neighbors when the fire and police go roaring out of there as certainly they have to do that as that is their duty. It is not the best location for a government building and certainly bringing more is going to bring a bigger crowd. Mr. Piros, we decided to show you with this picture what it would look like next to your house. Mr. Glancy said he wished you would have done that to my house so I could get rid of that junk house next to me,

Another thing that is bothersome to the Coe's in particular is what was promised and not done by ordinance or any particular than done by the trustees. It was somewhat of a moral promise to put some kind of landscaping down along the fence which doesn't go far enough along the back of the property. And the lighting shines right into their living room, kitchen and bedroom. That's not comfortable or appropriate. What kind of neighbors would we have if the offices were moved there? We feel these things need to be looked at before you make a decision. You claim you will save money by leaving this office and here you are on a main thoroughfare easily accessible by anybody and everyone knows where this office is and simple to drive down the road and get in and get out but not on McCleary Jacoby Road. We wonder if you are really going to save money by going down there so we are asking that you not approve this at all. If not spend a little bit of time with the neighbors and let them offer their concerns before you take final action on this matter today.

Evelyn Coe mentioned about a block watch meeting at the police station when she noticed kids throwing rocks over the fence and hitting her car. Also, she has been in the back yard and people will come over and ask the hours of the police station. These really aren't issues, but are things I really shouldn't have to deal with. Her concerns are when there is a meeting for the ball fields, there will to be a lot of cars and people.

Roger Coe mentioned that the parking lot is only 50' from his house.

Attorney Gold also said he failed to mention the parking situation. He would like to have more time to study the parking issue. He noticed that this building occupancy is 75 and said he is not sure on the parking ordinance and asked the board not to take action at this time.

Rose Stockton referred to the lease for the fire station only and when they wanted to build the police station, they said it was for convenience only and would not be a lot of traffic. They also said there would be no siren and there is a siren there. I understand we have an empty building down there and now we are going to have an empty building here. She asked what is going to happen with this building. Mr. Piros said this building was going to be leased and he could not reveal the names of the two interested parties.

Mr. Glancy said they have looked at it. We have to stay here until March after the primary election. We could move, but we have to keep this building open until after the election. We have lost about \$300,000 in the last two years. Mr. Piros said we lost \$101,000 this past year and going into this year, that will probably increase. Mr. Piros said the move was more of an economic situation and not having to go to the residents for a tax increase for the general fund.

Mr. Glancy said we went to a lot of work by Mr. Parke to get the parking area enlarged as we only had parking for 20 cars. There was a 100' roadway here. We traded the state some land we had up at the cemetery and the state gave us more parking area here. This parking just now became available.

Attorney Gold said now you have the opportunity to use the expanded parking area. He asked the board permission to look further into this and to talk with Mr. Finamore and get some input from him and the reply was yes.

Mr. Glancy said he feels the rest of the board agrees that we don't want to move before everything is right. Mr. Piros and Mr. Hovis agreed.

Attorney Gold said we appreciate that.

Mr. Piros said you brought up some vital issues and will take those into consideration.

Evelyn Coe said this issue came before Chief Sayers was chief. They were having something at the house and asked if additional parking of cars at the back of the parking area out of the way and the comment was made that could be a risk factor for emergency vehicles obstructed by citizens vehicles could create a problem. If you get a meeting going on and that could be a risk factor and cause problems.

Mr. Glancy said if we know we are going to have a large crowd at our meeting, we have contacted various organizations that we could move our meeting to a church, the school or Candlelight Knolls. It is all township and they are happy to help us out.

Evelyn Coe said people come in the parking area and spin their tires and throw gravel. In fact she said she has been sprayed with gravel just walking to the mailbox.

Mr. Piros said we definitely will take all these things into consideration. He suggested to the board that we further discuss this and let our legal counsel and Mr. Gold get together to make sure all the issues are addressed.

Rose Stockton said we have a lot of zoning problems and will probably have more. She said a few meetings ago she asked for some zoning on ponds. Mr. Piros said that is on the agenda for the Zoning Commission's meeting tonight. Mr. Bednar said there are several items on the agenda such as tent-type buildings.

Evelyn Coe asked if the board could do something about the lighting. Chief McKenzie explained what has already been done and Mrs. Coe said it has not helped. The lights around the police station are good. Chief McKenzie said he doesn't know what else to do except take them down.

Mr. Coe asked if there is cut off lighting with shaded shields. Chief McKenzie said he could look into this.

Mr. Piros suggested that Chief McKenzie get together with the Coe's and address those concerns and see what can be done.

Mr. Coe invited the chief to come anytime after dark to see how the lights shine in his house.

Mr. and Mrs. Coe appreciate all the work done by Fire Chief McKenzie.

Also, she asked at a previous meeting if the trustees were reimbursed for prescriptions and they stated no. After looking at township reports, she stated that Mr. Piros received \$1,450 and Mr. Glancy received \$994 in 2007 for prescription reimbursements.

She stated that the fire budget in January of 2007 was \$11,942.90 with receipts of \$1,117,637.40 and expenditures of \$1,155,191.31 for a minus of \$25,611. The general fund in January of 2008 had a carry over of \$273,777.22. Why couldn't you transfer some money to the fire department and not lay off the two firemen and why do we need a levy?

General fund monies can be transferred to any account.

The trustees will look into that and advise.

Mr. Finamore replied on the cell phones. Alltel could not produce a contract and I advised the township not to pay the bill. I have been in contact with Alltel on this and they cannot charge termination fees when you are out of contract. The monthly bills are not in question. Mr. Finamore sent letters to Alltel stating we were canceling. Alltel sent the township a bill for termination fees. At the present time, this is in litigation.

Rose Stockton, McCleary Jacoby Road, asked the trustees if they have full health coverage with the township and the reply was yes from Mr. Glancy and Mr. Piros. Are you on Medicare and the reply was yes from Mr. Glancy and Mr. Piros. Does the new insurance provider recognize pre-existing health care conditions and the reply was yes.

She also stated that the township should not drain the General Fund for any department. She doesn't want anyone to lose their jobs. She wants the fire department to be there when she needs them.

Dave Lutz, Eagle Loft, voiced his concern on the Tribune box on Burnett Drive. It is a traffic hazard. Mr. Finamore says the township has the right to take it down, but the township should contact the Tribune and if they don't remove it within ten days, the township can take it down.

Kenny Flack, Niles-Cortland Road, said the township can bring leaves and brush to his greenery as most of the items are from the township. He had some concerns with the police department on four highway cement barriers that belonged to him. No restitution from the police department. Police Chief Sayers said this is a civil matter and suggested that he come to the station and file a complaint.

Carol Braden, Wilmar Drive, asked why we are paying \$38,000 a year for two trustees for salary and insurance. Mr. Finamore stated that compensation is set by the State of Ohio. A uniform benefit plan is made available to all employees and the public officials and they can elect or not to take these benefits.

Mrs. Braden said they also get another perk of 50.5 cents a mile when they leave the township. Mr. Finamore said it is when they travel outside of the county, not the township.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, asked if the trustees get prescription reimbursement plus the health care and the reply was yes.

She asked Paul and Martha if they get health care and Mr. Hovis said no and Martha said no, but does get a reimbursement for not taking the health care as she has to pay for health care through her previous employer.

Mr. Finamore said the law states any public official or employee who does not elect health care can get a yearly cash payment of 20% of premium paid by the township.

Cheryl Tennant said even though it is a law, the trustees have a right to change it. Mr. Finamore agreed.

At this time Rose Stockton and Cheryl Tennant had a discussion on the township's budget.

August Fauvie, Andrews Drive, asked why his insurance carrier was billed when he was transported by ambulance. Mr. Lewis explained that the trustees passed a resolution a few years back to go with a third party billing company to bill the residents' insurance carrier and if there was a balance, the resident would not be charged. A non-resident would be charged the difference.

Tom Lance, State Route 305, asked if Johnson Plank Extension was a township road and the reply was no, it is a county road.

Rita Benoit, Andrews Drive, mentioned it was not fair to the residents that the board always schedule piggy back meetings. The residents should not be cut off. Mr. Piros replied we will take that into consideration in the future, but he stated he attended over 25 meetings last month.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins-Jones Road, stated that 2008 audit figures are wrong; 2007 was added to 2008. Also stated she was upset with the letter the EMS Committee sent out to all residents on the fire levy. It stated that the residents' home insurance rates would increase. Insurance rates are based on the rating of the fire department's equipment and training. The levy only passed by 123 votes. She said there is \$200,000 owed to the fire department from the previous billing companies.

She also warned the Board about unpublished meetings. Mr. Piros said every effort on our part was done, a fax was sent to the Tribune, meeting notices posted on the windows of this building and also posted on our web page.

Mr. Hovis addressed Mrs. Tennant's concern on the uncollected EMS monies. He and several firemen, Mr. Glancy, Fire Chief McKenzie and Martha met with our present billing company. They are going back to try and collect this money, but stated 33% is written off due to adjusted rates from Medicare and Medicaid and BWC.

Our prior billing company never went after these collections:

We are in legal action with our previous billing company. Also, only one fireman knew how these were billed and now all the firemen will know. He stated we are the highest in Medicare and Medicaid in the county.

August Fauvie, Andrews Drive, asked about the gas aggregations that Champion has approved for their residents. Instead of always asking us for money, why not give us something back. He stated that Champion has a rate of 8.995 MCF and he is paying 12.909 MCF. Mr. Glancy said he has lowered his rate through various gas companies that contacted him and you have the same opportunity. Mr. Fauvie said not aggregation.

Art Kreller, Andrews Drive, asked about the washing of police cars and the reply was the officers are washing their own cars.

Rita Benoit asked Police Chief Sayers about the hiring of five part-time police officers. The reply was they will go through a training period and then will be placed on the road. Part-time officers aren't available every day. She asked how many shifts per day and the reply was three shifts per day. She asked about the special equipment for the new cruiser and reply was the cost will be \$4,550.

Mrs, Benoit had a question for Fire Chief McKenzie about grant money to buy personal training equipment. Chief McKenzie replied we apply every year and presently we have personal equipment at both the stations.

Carol Braden, Wilmar Circle, said she called Mr. Fee, Sanitary Engineer's Office, and Trumbull County Commissioner, Frank Fuda, about the ditches on her street and within an hour the ditches were cleaned up. She took down her "Free Swim" sign.

Rita Benoit asked when both fire stations will be open all the time. Mr. Hovis said the levy money will not be available until 2009.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, commended Mr. Hovis for the number of hours he has spent on different projects and hopes that the situation with zoning money not being collected correctly will cease. She also commented on being cut short at the last meeting because of the Park Board meeting being scheduled right after the regular meeting.

Mr. Hovis suggested residents call one of the trustees before the meeting on issues so we can work on them and be prepared to answer.

Mr. Piros said he has always returned phone calls.

Mrs. Hineman commented on the letter sent to residents the trustees signed on behalf of Randy Smith. She pointed out that Mike and Bill are both on the Democratic Committee and should not have endorsed a candidate that was not endorsed by the Democratic Committee. She said you shouldn't put signs in your yard either. Mr. Piros said Mr. Smith was endorsed by all the townships' trustees and by the Trumbull Township Association and that this letter was only signed by us, we did no pay to send this letter out. Mr. Smith paid for the letter as well as the postage. Mrs. Hineman said the trustees should remain neutral in case that candidate did not win.

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, said in the last election, signs were placed in my yard and during the night, they disappeared.

Mrs. Benoit asked what bills are being paid and Mr. Piros said a sheet showing the vendor, purpose of payment and amount will be included in the minutes in the future.

Janet Perhach, Northview Drive, asked about the Tribune Box on Burnett Drive and the reply was it has been removed by the township.

Howard Watson, Bazetta Road, asked about the sewer project on Bazetta Road. It was started and now no work is being done.

Dennis Mintus, Bazetta Road, said this is a private contractor and when the weather breaks, restoration to the property will be done.

George Braun, Northview Drive, stated he has a second lot with a driveway that Sugar Construction put a speed limit sign in the middle of this driveway, they damaged the storm sewer and the drain is missing. Mr. Piros said we are putting a punch list together and suggested he contact Kris Parke. Mr. Piros said he does not want this township to be railroaded and said the county is holding payment until a lot of these problems are solved. Mr. Piros said he is totally disgusted with this company.

Janet Perhach said they paid for a T and wants a T put back in. Mr. Parke said the county video tapped the storm sewer drains.

Cheryl Tennant thanked Mr. Hovis in trying to recover the EMS money and suggested that we do as much of the work on our own so we can recoup most of the money owed us and not let any legal action take away from the recovery of the uncollected money.

Robyn Hineman said the sewer plans were messed up. Sugar Construction was the cheapest bid. Not putting things back to the original way is the county's problems.

Mr. Hovis said that payment to Sugar has been stopped.

Mr. Glancy suggested the residents watch this company and report anything unusual.

Carol Braden complimented Mr. Piros about a complaint that he helped resolve in a speedy manner.

Public Comments:

Rex Pealer, Warren-Meadville Road, asked if the township ever considered a township-wide garbage collector for a better rate. Mr. Glancy said the Board has talked about it several times and suggested that any resident can change garbage collectors at any time. Mr. Finamore stated there are several townships looking into this. You would have to have bid specifications to get a better rate with only one garbage collector on the townships roads. One township is giving a

preferred hauler to the residents to get a better rate. This is good for some residents and not so good for others.

Art Kreller, Andrews Drive, addressed Mr. Finamore if a roll-out industrial site container in a residential area is violating the zoning rules. Mr. Bednar said there is no zoning policy on this. Mr. Finamore suggested he contact a Zoning Commission member on adopting a policy.

Mr. Glancy mentioned the meeting he had recently on sewers and development in the township. This Board is constantly working on water and sewer.

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins-Jones Road, asked why we continue to pay out of pocket expenses for prescriptions. This is an added benefit to the employees. This is a negotiated item. Mr. Hovis explained that he voted to eliminate the reimbursement for emergency room and immediate care to employees, but had to rescind that motion because we didn't follow proper procedure. This will be on next month's agenda.

Mrs. Tennant said that some people like Bill and Chuck are not in the union. This was never in the union contracts Trustees gave this as an added benefit when the township had money, now we don't have any extra money. Mr. Hovis said he will bring this up through proper channels.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, said she has been working on water and sewer for 30 years and that the EPA guidelines have forced the sewer projects. Mr. Glancy said that Mr. Fee of the Sanitary Engineer's Office has been very helpful working with us and is doing a good job.

Mr. Hovis said Tom Holloway who was the previous Sanitary Engineer admitted that he didn't give Neal Easton a big enough water line.

Jon Paul Bruno, Saddlebrook Lane, asked about the low water pressure in his area and what was the Board planning to do about it. Mr. Finamore stated the township does not run a water district. He should contact the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer's office to see if they would come out and evaluate the pressure. Mr. Finamore stated that the standard PSI is 24 and Mr. Bruno stated his PSI is 26.

Mr. Bruno also asked what the Board was going to do about the drag strip on State Route 46. He stated that Mr. Piros would have speed radar there, but that has not happened. Chief Sayers stated the speed radar is not operating and would see that a cruiser is on State Route 46.

John Loetscher, Saddlebrook Lane, asked if there is any zoning regulations on adequate water before a building permit is issued. Mr. Finamore said you can't deny someone to build on their property. The city sells the water and the county controls the water. Mr. Finamore suggested

that he see him after the meeting and he would give him the proper procedure to follow up on this concern.

Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Bruno and Mr. Loetscher to give him their addresses after the meeting as he has a meeting with the City of Warren Mayor in a few days.

Rita Benoit, Andrews Drive, asked why we have Time Warner and the response was they are our internet provider for the fire and police department. She asked about the \$20,000 to Medical Mutual and the reply was that was our monthly premium.

Chief Sayers said the Trustees are working very well with him and my job is to make sure you as residents have police protection.

Mrs. Benoit told Kris Parke the materials he used on Andrews Drive last year is not holding up. Mr. Parke replied that material was 10 years old and it only cost labor to put it down.

Carol Braden, Wilmar Drive, complimented the fire department on the recent car fires at Wal-Mart.

Mrs. Tennant asked the Board whether it is water pressure or not, you as elected officials should guide the residents on the right path to help solve the problems.

Chief McKenzie stated that he has had meetings with both gentlemen on the low water pressure and Mr. Piros and has taken readings. He will go back at 6:00 AM when there is a large usage of water. They do have a real problem.

Mrs. Benoit asked about the old Wal-Mart building and Mr. Glancy responded that it is for sale or rent through a company in Columbus.

I Catch Basins:

- a. All catch basins need to be noted prior to any construction.
- b. All catch basins must be returned to their original locations and condition.
- c. Contractor is responsible for maintenance of line of grade and flow.

II Storm Water Pipes:

- a. All storm water pipes, sizes and connectors must be noted and returned to their original locations and condition.
- b. All pipes from the owner's property connecting to the storm water Pipes must be reconnected to their original locations if disturbed.
- c. Contractor is responsible for maintenance of line of grade and flow

Ⅲ Field Tile:

- All pipes, sizes and connectors must be noted and returned to their original locations and condition if disturbed or altered and provide for continuous flow.
- b. Contractor is responsible for maintenance of line of grade if disturbed or altered and provide for continuous flow.

IV Restoration of Grounds:

a. Any ground disturbed or altered by the contractor must be restored to its original condition before completion of such project.

THIS INCLUDES UTILITY COMPANIES DOING NEW WORK OR RECONSTRUCTION.

ALL APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS MUST BE IN THE NAME OF THE PROPERTY OWNER (CONTRACTORS SIGNATURE NOT ACCEPTABLE).

PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FROM BAZETTA TOWNSHIP FOR ANY NEW DRIVEWAY APPROACHES OR IMPROVED DRIVEWAYS.

O.U.P.S. MUST BE CONTACTED PRIOR TO ANY EXCAVATIONS IN THE BAZETTA TOWNSHIP ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY. SEE ATTACHMENTS (OHIO LAW).

BAZETTA TOWNSHIP DETERMINES AND REGULATES LENGTH AND DIAMETER OF ANY PROPOSED DRAINAGE FACILITY AND WIDTH AND RADIUS OF RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL TYPE DRIVE APPROACHES. BAZETTA TOWNSHIP DOES NOT SUPPLY, BUT WILL INSTALL DRIVE STORM PIPES. DRIVE APPROACHES RADIUS MUST NOT ENCROACH ON ABUTTING PROPERTY. MINIMUM DRIVE RADIUS: RESIDENTIAL (20 FEET) COMMERCIAL (25 FEET).

NO ATTACHMENTS TO ANY TOWNSHIP ROAD SIGNS WILL BE ALLOWED.

NO BANNERS WILL BE PERMITTED TO OVERHANG THE TOWNSHIP ROAD PAVEMENT.

NO OIL OR GAS WELLS AND TANKS PERMITTED CLOSER THAN 50 FEET FROM THE TOWNSHIP ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY ON TOWNSHIP ROADS.

* PAVEMENT CUTS, WHEN ALLOWED, WILL REQUIRE LOW STRENGTH MORTAR BACKFILL AS PER BAZETTA TOWNSHIP SPECIFICATIONS ON TOWNSHIP ROADS.

SECTION 14 SETBACK BUILDING EINES

- A. No part of the ground area of any building or structure or any portion thereof, except steps and uncovered porches less than ten (10) feet in width, shall be erected within fifty (50) feet of the right-of-way side line of any road or street except in areas served by an approved sewage disposal plant where this distance may be forty (40) feet. If there is no established right-of-way for a road or street, said line shall be deemed to be thirty (30) feet from the center of the road.
- B. In areas where there is now existing a building line scheme of a different dimension than mentioned in Paragraph "A," the property owner will be required to conform to said existing building line scheme.
- C. Further, setback lines must conform to local, county, or state highway specifications.
- D. All private swimming pools shall be treated as accessory buildings for the purpose of the Bazetta Township Zoning Resolution and must conform to the building serback lines, as required by Section 14 through 18.

ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY REGULATIONS FOR CONTRACTORS

- 1. <u>DRIVEWAY CROSSINGS</u>: All driveways require a permit. The fee for such permit is \$5.00. All driveway crossings are to be installed by the Bazetta Township Highway Department. The owner of the land must furnish for the driveway a minimum of (20) feet of reinforced concrete pipe or double wall plastic in the size prescribed by the Bazetta Township Highway Department. The owner must furnish the slag to be used in the installation. The township will furnish the labor for the installation.
- 2. <u>CONCRETE DRIVEWAYS</u>: When concrete driveways are installed by the owner of the land or contractor, the concrete portion of the driveway must end at the road right-of-way line. All permanent driveways extending into the road right-of-way must be of asphalt or slag construction.
- 2A. <u>CONCRETE DRIVEWAYS</u>: When concrete driveways are installed on a street that has trough curb, the concrete portion may extend to the edge of said street, but no higher than the curb.
- 3. <u>LAWN TILE IN ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY DITCHES</u>: All tile placed in highway ditches must be of size and length prescribed by the Bazetta Township Highway Department. Catch basins and tile must be furnished by the land owner. The tile will be placed in the highway ditch by the Bazetta Township Highway Department and covered by dirt available on the site. All grading and planting must be done by the property owner. Grading to be as following: Fill dirt to be 1" per foot grade from edge of road to center of tile. The owner must furnish their own fill dirt!

NOTICE:

Due to problems involving driveway tile, it is <u>MANDATORY</u> to contact the Road Superintendent for information pertaining to such tile. The township provides the installation of such tile, only requiring the owner or builder to furnish or supply the tile and catch basins.



Mo femand resolved, and My fires seconded the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED: That a "Road Bond Resolution" of March 05, 1990 as amended be expunged and deleted from the minutes of Bazetta Township.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the following "ROAD CUT BOND RESOLUTION FOR BAZETTA TOWNSHIP" be resolved and placed in effect as of this date.

Pursuant to Section 5571.16 Ohio Revised Code, the Bazetta Township Board of Trustees hereby place the following into effect.

- 1. That it shall be the sole responsibility of any person, firm, corporation, municipal water or sewer organization or any other organization to obtain a permit before making an excavation or cut in a road, street or within the right-of-way in the Bazetta Township System Of Roads and prior to any work being started on such excavation or cut the person or persons involved shall deposit such monies or bond with the Township Clerk as required in this resolution.
- 2. These deposits shall be in the form approved by the Bazetta Township Board Of Trustees and shall be as follows:

For each excavation or cut across the right-of-way of any township road \$2,000.00 per cut

For each drilling or tunneling across the right-of-way of any township road \$500.00 per cut

For installation of water, gas or sewer lines, etc. installed within the right-of-way and parallel to the carriageway \$5.00 per lineal foot

A separate deposit shall be required for each excavation or cut unless a yearly bond satisfactory to the Bazetta Township Board Of Trustees, has been approved.

All deposits, other than approved bonds, shall be in the form of a bank check, cashiers check, certified check or money in escrow and made payable to the Bazetta Township Trustees.

The above requirements will not be applicable with the Trumbull County Engineer, County Sanitary Engineer or Highway Department provided all work in connection with the excavation or cut or tunneling is done by the County's own crew. However, if the work is done for the county by an independent contractor, this contractor must deposit bond or monies as outlined above.

CONDITIONS FOR OBTAINING A PERMIT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- Applicant shall submit information as to the type, size and duration of each excavation, cut, drilling or tunnel.
- Applicant shall furnish such warning devices as may be required or necessary to protect travelers on the highway.
- Applicant shall indemnify Bazetta Township Trustees of any liability or damage as the results of any excavation, cut, drilling or tunneling.

If it is deemed necessary that the road be closed during excavation, it will be the responsibility of the contractor to notify the Bazetta Township Police and Fire Departments of the road closing, and the length of time necessary to complete the job and reopen the road.

Posting of deposit as previously outlined.

The Bazella Township Road Superintendent shall be notified before any excavated or cut area of road, street or right-of-way is back filled. The backfilling shall be executed in the following manner:

- All backfilling shall be made according to the Typical Gut Repair Sketch to be furnished by the Township.
- 2. The proper maintenance of the excavation, cut, drilling or Lunneling shall be the responsibility of the contractor for a period of forty five (45) calendar days or until released by the Bazetta Township Road Department.
- No curbing shall be disturbed or disrupted in any manner.
- 4. If at the expiration of forty five (45) days from the date of deposit or start of excavation, cut, drilling or tunneling, the excavation, cut, drilling or tunneling has not be placed in it's original condition acceptable to the Road Department Superintendent or Road Inspector, the total cash deposit shall be forfeited to the Township. In the expenses incurred in the necessary work.
- 5. All service lines such as gas, water, etc. which are two (2) inches or less in diameter, shall be drilled or tunneled and pushed or driven under the road bed, street or road right-of-way wherever possible.

PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO OBSERVE ORDINANCE

Whoever violates this ordinance shall be fined not more than two hundred (200.00) dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days, or both.

EMERGENCY CLAUSE

In the case of emergency requiring immediate action to protect the public health, safety and welfare an excavation, cut, drilling or tunneling may be made without first making a deposit, if such deposit is made at the earliest possible opportunity.

Mr. Glancy:

- 1. The west side sewer project has started. The equipment is at the location ready to go. It's marked off.
- 2. The meeting with the County Water and Sewer Department on May 29, 2008 has been cancelled.
- 3. Water petitions for all of Elm Road will be filed tomorrow or the next day.

Mr. Parke had an item not on the agenda concerning the 2003 Bob Cat that is driven by a hydraulic motor. The mechanic has repaired it, but it continues to leak oil. Mr. Parke wants to

put the trustees on notice that this Bob Cat will need to be replaced in the near future. It would prove to be too costly as it would cost over \$900 for repairs. It will be six years old. Would the trustees make consideration to purchase a new one? Mr. Piros asked what the Bob Cat is used for. Mr. Parke explained it is used for cutting grass and is the oldest one. They replaced the other one last year. Mr. Parke stated that we need to send a letter to put the city on notice that soon we will be purchasing a new tractor. Mr. Piros stated that they haven't finalized the agreement with the City of Cortland yet and he will get with Mr. Parke to draft a letter.

Mr. Parke stated that they are still working in the cemetery on the foundations and they should be done by the end of the week.

Mr. Parke explained that the toys have been installed in the park and that two of them have been broken already probably by older children. They have made repairs to them and will see how they hold up.

Mr. Glancy asked about the fence that was down. Mr. Parke replied that they took care of it, along with Cortland.

Mr. Hovis asked Mr. Parke how much damage we have suffered because of the cuts in the roads. Mr. Parke explained that they had to replace one spring on the #2 Truck in the front and on the brand new truck they need two new trailing springs. He had a purchase signed for \$3,000. He doesn't know how much it will cost altogether. Both trucks run that route with the plows on and it adds 2 tons of weight and they hit the cuts and it breaks the springs from the weight. Mr. Hovis stated that there are school buses experiencing the same problems. They discussed that the contractor has been contacted with no results. Mr. Parke asked Mr. Finamore if we had the right to go and fill these holes in the road cuts. There is a question of if you can go intermittently and fill in. Mr. Parke stated that he was told that once we intervene, that releases the contractor from liability. Mr, Finamore stated that the appropriate way to proceed is to have the Trumbull County Engineer's Office write a letter to the Trumbull County Sanitary Department telling them what they need to do to maintain that road the right way. Then if they don't do it, they can be liable for it and you may have to sue the contractor thru the Trumbull County Engineer's office. Mr. Finamore gave recommendation; is that Mr. Parke identifies the problems. Ask the Trumbull County Engineer to verify the problems and have them send a letter to the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer stating the problems that they found and the actions needed to satisfy the problem. Mr. Glancy asked why we couldn't, in the meantime, fill in the holes before someone gets hurt. Mr. Finamore stated that in most places they are required to place metal covers to allow traffic to go through while they are working on this project. If they don't respond we will go from there. Mr. Piros stated they were supposed to be here this morning and weren't. He also said they brought in more equipment. Mr. Parke doesn't feel the base material is appropriate. Mr. Finamore said there are other ways to get them to do the repairs if they do not respond.

Police Chief Sayers:

Chief Sayers introduced Donald Utterback to the trustees. Chief Sayers requested authorization from the trustees to hire Mr. Utterback as a part-time officer at \$11.25 per hour. Mr. Glancy asked how long it would be until he went out on the road. Chief Sayers replied that during training he will be on the road with another officer. Mr. Glancy asked Mr. Utterback where he is from and he replied that he is from Niles, but now lives in Cortland.

Public Comments:

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins Jones Road, requested a change to the previous meeting minutes on page 77 third paragraph. The sentence (This is a negotiated item) should read: This is not a negotiated item. She also requested a copy of the motion that states that the township will pay out-of-pocket expenses for healthcare and prescriptions. She stated that the out-of-pocket expenses continue to be paid and that it is not a negotiated item and it was never intended to be.

Mr. Finamore explained that Mrs. Tennant wants a copy of the motion where the Board authorized the out-of-pocket for Officials or Employees. Mrs. Tennant agreed.

Mrs. Tennant referred to the audit of 2005-2006 on page 3, managers' report on insurance. She requests that the money for the insurance be paid back to the residents of Bazetta Township. Mr. Piros stated that he didn't believe that there was a finding. Mrs. Tennant stated that whether there was a finding or not the tax payers of Bazetta want that money paid back and that "she" received it in error. Mr. Piros suggested that Mrs. Tennant ask her for the money back when she is here. Mrs. Tennant stated that there is only one meeting a month and it keeps going on meeting after meeting. She feels the trustees should ask her because it also includes a violation of cell phones. Mr. Piros indicated that there was no finding on the cell phone usage.

Mr. Finamore suggested that at the request of Mrs. Tennant you could pass on the request to the clerk that a request was made by the tax payers that she repays the amount of money she was cited for. That would be up to her as she in an independently elected official.

Mrs. Tennant would like to talk about the 2008 appropriation of \$175,000. Mr. Hovis said about \$72,000 is collected right now. She asked if he could get all the information.

Rita Benoit asked if the list of vendors was in the minutes. Mr. Piros indicated that you can obtain the list of vendors from them and they don't have to be part of the minutes.

Art Krellar, Andrews Drive, addressed Mr. Finamore regarding an industrial trash receptacle being used for a business in a residential area. Mr. Finamore explained that businesses are not allowed in a residential area and that there is no rule for trash receptacles in residential areas. The house on the corner of Bazetta Road and Lynn Avenue has been vacant for three years or longer. Last year he contacted the real estate company and they cut the grass, and this year they said it is out of their hands that the house has gone into foreclosure. Whose responsibility is it to cut the grass? Mr. Finamore explained that it is always the owners' responsibility to cut the grass. Mr. Krellar explained that it is high and it is getting dangerous because of the dip in the road at the stop sign. Mr. Bednar added he had a call at 3:30 P.M. from a lady in the area and he will do investigating to see if the owner is a bank or institution. He also explained if the real estate company does not have a contract with the owner he will have them take the sign down.

Gloria Yocum, Lynn Drive, she had an incident with the house with the high grass as she could not see traffic. She said her elderly neighbors won't go that way; they go around Andrews and out Janet. She would like something done.

Terry Blann, Williams Drive, on your recommendation I met with Mr. Jones and he assured him that the company would start one week ago and they haven't. We continue to have drive in and out of there and he continues to have to cut his grass around that mess. What can we do to be more effect? Mr. Piros explained that Mr. Fuda took a ride with him throughout the area. He is aware of the concern we have with this company. He is also aware of the road cuts and restoration. That company was due back today and they aren't here although they moved equipment in. If they are not here again then he recommends that Mr. Blann call the Commissioners' Office and he will do the same. The company is under contract to complete the project by July 07th. Mr. Piros said they indicated that the company had multiple law suites against them and they indicated that the dealings they had with them were reputable. If they aren't back in the next day or two we will proceed to call. Mr. Hovis explained that he sent all the complaints to Mr. Jones.

Bud Bowen is concerned with the old Wal-Mart building being empty. Mr. Hovis stated that if you go down there you will see them doing construction work inside.

Robyn Hineman stated that people get money from the tax payers they aren't supposed to and they have the option whether they pay it back of not. We don't have an option to say how that money gets used. If it's not correct and it was found on an audit, why wasn't the money returned? She stated that she thinks it should be a joint effort if the money is owned back. Mr. Finamore explained that a township is audited on how it spends money correctly or incorrectly. The Auditor looks at three levels of violations: Recommendation – not doing anything wrong, but could do it better. Citation – when you violate some rule or policy they want you to correct. It doesn't result in a finding and anybody that was wrongly given any money. Finding – is when an Auditor finds the township money was spent unlawfully. They require the County Prosecutor

to seek recovery of that money. In this audit they have recommendations and citations, but no findings. Therefore, nobody has the authority to ask that person to give the money back. Someone can try to convince her that it would be the moral or right thing to do, but the trustees have no authority to demand that she give it back as she is an independently elected officer. They can express their concerns individually or as a board, but they can not force her to do it and you can do the same. Mrs. Hineman asked if this was going to continue to be done wrong. Mr. Finamore suggested that if the auditor told them it was improper they would stop it. The next time if they were doing the same thing then it would be a finding. The circumstances which led to the findings no longer exist. Mr. Hovis was asked what the amount was and it was \$2,223.00.

Mrs. Tennant stated that she may be entitled to the money now, however, only if the motion is made prior to the commencement of her term. That's the legal way to do it; she just can't take the money. The zoning inspector before Mr. Bednar took the same thing and he didn't even work 20 hours a week. How do they get full benefits from the trustees? Mr. Piros stated that he did not take the health insurance. Mrs. Tennant stated that he opted out. Mr. Piros explained that \$200 a month verses \$800 a month is a big difference.

Art Krellar, Andrews Drive, questioned the meetings with the safety forces, fire department. Mr. Glancy stated that they have had several good meetings and it is not going to happen over night.

Scott Pallett questioned if the complaints have been addressed on 542. Mr. Bednar stated that he spoke to the gentleman and that he is getting it cleaned up.

Robyn Hineman asked Mr. Bednar if he had any complaints on State Route 46. It looks like a junk pile. There is a motor home in the front yard. The address is 2379 State Route 46.

Mr. Piros asked if there were any more comments and there was none.

Mr. Glancy reported that two houses have been burned down near the fairgrounds with only one problem of a trampoline being damaged.

The trustees met with the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer on the condition of the east side sewer project. We went there to fight regarding the conditions of the east side sewer project. We all felt the county was defending Sugar Construction. We left a little upset.

I hand carried water petitions to the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer's office for Routes 5, 305 and 46. I also received a call saying that it is Warren City Water so we are taking another avenue.

Mr. Hovis said he would let Dennis Lewis explain where we are on our EMS Billing and Mr. Parke on the roads.

Police Chief Sayers:

Chief Sayers reported on the C.O.P.S. Grant and there are no solicitations available for us.

Chief Sayers mentioned the impact of the hiring of part-time police officers have helped to lower the cost of overtime by 56% over the past five months. Mr. Hovis had asked for a dollar figure on this cost savings and Chief Sayers will comply with the request.

He reported the new police cruiser is 98% highway ready. The radio and spot light needs installed. It is out in the parking lot for inspections by the board as well as any resident.

Fire Department:

Captain Dennis Lewis is present due to Fire Chief McKenzie absence. Captain Lewis reported that the damaged trampoline has been taken care of by Howland Training Service as they were the fire department that were in training for burning of the house on Bazetta Road on the fairground property at Gate A. The barn will be burned down within the next two weeks involving the whole county as a training session.

For 2008 we budgeted to collect \$175,000 and so far as of May 31st Ohio Billing collected \$88,793.94. He reported that L&D, our previous EMS billing company, collected \$2,796.70 for this year and we have collected from the Collection Agency a total of \$300. He has also made 21 calls to residents asking them to fill out the information sheet that Ohio Billing sent them. If the resident states no insurance, we accept that. We will write that off. Residents will not be charged if they do not have insurance and/or if their insurance carrier does not cover the entire EMS bill.

Klaira Martin, Andrews Drive, asked if a resident doesn't have insurance would the fire department transport them and the reply was yes. The residents have already paid once for this service and we do not believe in asking them twice if they do not have insurance. The average bill is \$1,000.

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, asked Captain Lewis if inspections are done on businesses and the reply was yes. The shifts are divided in three sections of the township. Mr. Bowen said the tank at Amerigas is all pitted and has been that way for the past four years and is a safety issue. Captain Lewis made a notation he will personally look at this.

Gloria Yokley, Lynn Drive, asked to have her last name corrected on last month's minutes on page 102. It was incorrectly reported as Yocum and should be Yokley.

Road Superintendent Parke:

Mr. Parke asked approval of the Board to purchase (10) 6' hemlock picnic tables at \$60 each to be taken out of Park Fund 01-F-02. These are Amish built.

He showed a 2" thick complaint list to the residents. Cost would be approximately \$250 a day for an 8 hour day. Mr. Parke had Randy Smith from the Trumbull County Engineer's Office come out and he agreed with Mr. Parke that the road needs to be put back the way it was.

Ken Flack, Niles Cortland Road, asked about the salt shed storage building. Mr. Piros sent Miller Builders a letter and they applied for the building permit last week and should be starting shortly.

Zoning Inspector Bednar:

Mr. Bednar reported he wrote five permits totaling \$1,547.55 and sent out certified letters to property owners on 460 Warren Meadville Road, 2760 Beaver Trail, 1187 Lynn Drive and 2348 Greenbriar. The grass has been cut on 460 Warren Meadville Road and 2760 Beaver Trail.

Mr. Bednar contacted the realtor company on 1187 Lynn Drive property and is now in the hands of Chase Bank and will try to mow the grass. The Greenbriar property is going up for Sheriff Sale and is pretty hopeless.

Klaira Martin, Andrews Drive, said she saw an individual twice dressed in a hooded sweatshirt trying to break in the house on Lynn Drive. She called the police. The grass needs to be cut as we are attracting those types of individuals in our neighborhood. Mr. Bednar has called Chase

Bank on numerous occasions with no success. There are major problems in both Mahoning and Trumbull Counties where people are going in these vacant houses and stealing the copper piping.

Gloria Yokley, Lynn Drive, asked if the Lynn Drive property was in foreclosure as she has a friend interested in purchasing the house. Mr. Bednar said the homeowners filed bankruptcy and turned it back over to Chase Bank. Mr. Bednar asked her to see him after the meeting and he will give her a phone number for her friend to call about the purchase of the house.

Rose Stockton, McCleary Jacoby Road, said there are two houses on her street. One front yard is being mowed and not the back. The other property nothing is being mowed. Mr. Bednar asked her for the addresses after the meeting and he will look into it.

Joe Bielecki, Northview Drive, asked if property taxes are being paid on these houses. Mr. Finamore explained the process if a homeowner files bankruptcy and gives up the house. Mortgage Company says they don't own it, a realtor who thinks the house is sellable will use his own money to make the house presentable for sale or the township goes in and mows the grass and puts it on the tax statement. The problem is that the mowing bill or lien doesn't get put on the taxes until the following year. Another problem is some townships can't afford to have that money out there for two years. If someone buys the house and the lien isn't on the tax statement and the new owners get their first tax statement with the lien on it, the court says the township can't get their money because the new owners didn't know about the lien when they purchased the property.

What Mr. Finamore is asking the township to do is to send him an affidavit on the lien and he will file it in the recorder's office so if a house is sold, the new owners will know about the lien.

Rose Stockton, McCleary Jacoby Road, asked if there was a bill in office and Mr. Finamore said no as the banking lobbyist are very strong.

He also talked with Amy from the Trumbull Soil and Water and she gave him some information which he passed onto Mr. Maycher.

Mr. Bednar complimented Rose for her efforts. He will contact her when a decision is made.

Art Krellar, Andrews Drive, asked about the article in the newspaper today. Could the Board comment on the e-coli found in Mosquito Lake. Mr. Glancy said it is from the geese.

Mr. Krellar said there is a house south of Lynn Drive on Bazetta Road that is in the same shape. No furniture, no lights on and high grass. It is a pink house. Mr. Bednar said he will look into it.

Mr. Glancy said he knows who lives there and heard he was sick. Has anyone checked on him? Mr. Krellar said he moved out.

Mr. Piros commended that he attended with Mr. Bednar a Trumbull County Planning meeting and are working on a comprehensive plan. We don't know about these vacant houses and foreclosures until they get to this stage and it is very noticeable. In the comprehensive plan, they will notify us about these before they get to this stage. We can go after these homeowners before the grass gets high.

Captain Lewis asked to be notified also so his department can do a quick entry and put a sign up. Mr. Piros said he would comply.

Safety Committee:

Chief Sayers had nothing to report.

At this time Chief Sayers mentioned that Millennium Boulevard is being approved by the county to become a township road. There is a stop bar on the road and he has asked Tom Gentis of the Trumbull County Engineer's office to contact Wal-Mart to have it removed and replaced with a stop sign. A stop bar is unenforceable and against ODOT regulations. Also, he requested to have a stop sign placed on the north bound of Millennium Boulevard so customers turning left in the parking area could flow more easily.

Mr. Piros said this concludes the business part of this meeting and will now open up the meeting for public participation.

Public Participation:

Cheryl Tennant, Perkins-Jones Road, had four issues. One in regard to the recent state audit; asked if Martha has corrected any of the citations. Number two; minutes and resolutions for out of pocket expenses, number three; if Martha paid back her opted out insurance and four; if Bill paid back his cell phone expenses.

1. Cheryl Tennant stated when you were transferring money it says that as of December 31, 2006, advances have not been paid in the fire fund. Martha stated it was cleared with the auditor that we had the fire department pay for their utilities the following year. Instead of the general fund putting in monies for their utilities at the beginning of the year, the fire department paid out of their budget for their utilities.

- 2. Martha stated she had copies of the resolutions for opted out health care and to see her after the meeting.
- 3. In regard to Martha receiving money for reimbursement for health care, Martha has talked with the Prosecuting Attorney's office and he stated he would not have an opinion until next week.
- 4. Mr. Glancy said he also contacted the Prosecuting Attorney's office and he did pay back money. Mrs. Tennant asked where the receipts are and the reply was they are in Martha's office. See Martha after the meeting to get a copy of the receipts.

On the cell phone policy, Mr. Piros stated he and Mr. Finamore are working on a revised cell phone policy.

Mr. Hovis said Dennis is working on the EMS Citations.

Art Krellar, Andrews Drive, asked if he could come to the next zoning commission meeting on July 02nd to request a zone change to get that garbage dumpster out of the neighborhood. Mr. Finamore stated you can go to the meeting and tell them you feel there is a zoning violation and the zoning board can take it under consideration and can schedule a public hearing if they feel there is a violation.

Albert Fauvie said that on this same property where the garbage dumpster is, this house sold two years ago, new septic system put in, and to the side of the house is a leach bed. This guy plants a garden, parks cares on it, sometimes 4 or 5, a truck and a boat. No one has ever been out there to look at it. The health department told me that when you put a leach bed in, it will be checked. No one has ever checked it and it stinks. Mr. Piros asked if any complaint has been registered with the health department and Mr. Fauvie said he doesn't know. Mr. Finamore stated the health department should be notified. Mr. Fauvie further stated he runs a business out of the garage and the property is an eye sore. Mr. Bednar said he has received calls on this property and will continue to over see it. The leach bed problem should be registered with the health department.

Jack Hineman, Northview Drive, has a concern on the traffic trip device signal at Warren-Meadville Road and Route 305. It needs fixed as his motorcycle isn't heavy enough to trip it. Not only motorcycles, but some cars. The sensor needs fixed. Last year, Mr. Piros said this Board sent a letter to ODOT on this. We have no jurisdiction over this as it is on a state highway even though it is in our township.

Joe Bielecki, Northview Drive, asked if the bushes could be trimmed at the corner of Cadwallader-Sonk Road and State Route 46 as it is a safety hazard. Mr. Bednar stated they have been trimmed and he also asked the storage place to cut their grass.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, had some concerns on the communication of the zoning commission board and the zoning appeals board. We should all work together. The trustees shouldn't be at any of the zoning meetings. Mr. Finamore said it is not illegal; they are going to hear it anyway. They just can't voice their opinions. Mr. Finamore said there is nothing wrong with board members going to each other's meetings. He encourages the zoning inspector and the zoning commission and the zoning appeals board to work together.

Mr. Piros asked Mr. Finamore if he as the Chairman of the Trustees could have a meeting with the chairman of the two zoning boards and not have it open to the public and the reply was yes.

Jack Hineman, Northview Drive, asked how the board was going to fill that vacancy. Mr. Piros said it would have to be advertised if there is no alternate on the board.

Mr. Piros read Anne Greenwald's resignation letter per request of Robyn Hineman.

Bud Bowen, State Route 5, asked Chief Sayers why we had to send the park ranger for a problem at Maffitt's Meadows. Chief Sayers will look into it. There was also a problem at Candlelite Knolls.

Several residents voiced their concerns and complaints about the East Side Sewer Project. Mr. Piros said this Board and Mr. Parke are meeting weekly on this project and were asked by the Sanitary Engineer "why are you involved, this is a county project not a township project". We told them the job is not being done right and we are sharing the complaints of our residents. We are and will continue to stick up for the rights of this township.

Mr. Hovis said after we have them run the cameras through and if things aren't right, we will have them extend the maintenance bond over a two year period.

If residents have problems later on, they are to call the trustees, who in turn will call the Sanitary Engineer who will take care of the problem. This is what the trustees were told.

Mr. Piros said the time frame is they should be done by July 07th. Shortly after that, there will be a walk-thru and at that time, we will point out the issues that are not correct. These will be corrected before it is turned over. The Sanitary Engineer's Office will send out a letter to the residents telling them what the next steps will be to tap in.

Mr. Piros welcomed new residents and business owners Sheila Fisher and Debbie Beltz who will be opening a winery on State Route 305 called the Country Porch Winery. It should be opening in a few weeks.

He also reported on the Trumbull County Fair which ran from July 08th through July 13th. The department had 29 calls of which 14 were in the fairgrounds. We had to call for mutual aid on three occasions, two from Champion and one from Cortland.

He asked if he could mail the vent system report that Mr. Finamore requested to him as he was absent tonight. The reply was yes.

He gave a summary report on the EMS billing as of June 30th. Collections from Ohio Billing \$20,679.72, United Collections Bureau \$1,000 and L&D Medical \$522.33. Total money collected to date is \$114,092.69. It looks like we could collect approximately \$230,000 for the year.

We wrote off \$29,654.76 due to Medicare and Medicaid and to residents not having insurance or their insurance only paying part of the bill. We accept whatever monies the residents' insurance pays us. We sent \$27,024.76 to United Collections Bureau and should receive approximately \$9,000.

Mr. Hovis asked if the department is down calls from last year and Captain Lewis said we have had 80 calls as of today.

Mr. Hovis asked about the hospital closing its emergency services on Elm Road and Captain Lewis said we could lose approximately \$50,000. Captain Lewis also mentioned that one emergency service is closing July 31st and another one is opening at the same address on August 01st. A group of doctors are going to run it.

Mr. Hovis asked if the new facility can sub contract their ambulance out and Captain Lewis said they can't, they have to dial 9-1-1. Captain Lewis said they had 224 calls in 2006 and 175 calls in 2007 at that facility.

Mr. Glancy complimented Captain Lewis on the new updated format.

Mr. Piros said we need to put someone in charge since Chief McKenzie is going to be off until October, 2008. After discussion, Mr. Glancy made the following motion:

Mr. Parke asked the Board for approval of a salt shed change order from 6' to 16' at a cost of \$2,125 from Miller Builders.

Engineer's Office and suggested the trustees have a work session on this. Mr. Parke is to get with Mr. Piros to set a date.

Since our blower was stolen at the park, Mr. Parke got a quote of \$319.95 from Cortland Tractor for a new Back Pac Blower, Model BR-550.

This is a requirement by the Trumbull County Health Department. Vivian McDowell, Howland, said she has a sample letter if we do not have one.

Police Chief Sayers:

Chief Sayers was absent. Therefore, no police report.

Zoning Inspector Bednar:

Larry Bednar reported he had seven permits totaling \$166.25 which included fences, decks, sheds, etc. He reported the road department mowed the properties on 2348 Greenbrier and 1189 Lynn and Martha mailed Mr. Finamore the necessary paperwork to place a lien on these two properties.

We are waiting on the title searches from Mr. Finamore on the properties of 894 Everett-Hull and 460 Wilson Sharpsville Road. When this is completed, we can take the next step to demolish these structures.

He reported a contractor came in for a permit to build in the Broad Meadows Development. Mr. Parke asked for an extra set of drawings for the road and fire departments. Every 500' a fire hydrant need to be put in plus the turning radius and for the divided highway. Mr. Bednar said the planning drawings have been approved and he is waiting o the soil and water.

The Alternative Tax Budget was tabled as the figures ere inaccurate. We contacted the auditor's office and they stated the new deadline would be Monday, July 28^{th} .

Cheryl Tennant mentioned that the township needs to advertise for a special meeting on the alternative tax budget.

Mr. Piros said a meeting has been set for 5:00 PM on Monday, August 18th prior to our regular meeting for several policy changes and updated recommendations by the zoning commission.

Regarding the Timber Creek Heights Street Lighting bid specs, the final count on the petitions were 36 homes involved with 27 signatures leaving 80% needed short by 2 signatures. Mr. Piros will draft a letter to the Timber Creek Heights residents for the trustees to sign.

Public Comments:

Cheryl Tennant stated that a motion to accept the new IRS mileage rate is necessary.

She asked Martha about the letter she mentioned in the work session from the Prosecutor's office on her opted-out insurance as it was not mentioned in the correspondence read tonight. Martha stated that Mr. Saker of the Prosecutor's Office advised that she received in-term increases in compensation

or overpayments for which I need to pay back to the township in the amount of \$2,478.29. I will pay this to the township within a year. This was mainly due to me being appointed and not elected until April 01, 2006.

Cheryl Tennant asked if that amount included interest and the reply was no.

Cheryl Tennant cites inaccuracies in the fire department deficit, financial statements, PERS for an employee, bank statement, and the gas and motor vehicle interest.

Mr. Piros said there will be an executive session following this meeting on these concerns.

Steve Perhach mentioned a concern on the traffic trip device signal on Route 305 and Warren Meadville Road. Mr. Parke has left messages for Mr. Alberini from ODOT for a sign and has had no reply from him.

Jack Hineman, Northview Drive, said it is not functioning correctly and that his motorcycle cannot trigger the signal.

Mr. Piros said he will draft a letter to ODOT.

Steve Perhach asked if Captain Lewis is willing to do the duties of the Chief, he should be compensated the difference between the salaries.

Mr. Piros will be talking with Captain Lewis on that issue.

Mr. Glancy said Captain Lewis makes more money than the Chief and that he would have to take a cut in pay.

Robyn Hineman, Northview Drive, asked Mr. Piros his thoughts on the meeting he had with the Chairman of each of the zoning boards. Mr. Piros said he thought it was very good and a lot of things were cleared up and they laid some ground work and rules of the chairman. Both boards will use Deanna Boggess, the Zoning Secretary.

Mr. Piros said in talking with Mr. Finamore, a court reporter along with the Zoning Secretary should be used and that is being discussed by this Board.

Robyn Hineman brought up a concern to Larry Bednar about him reading mail address to Ann Greenwald and herself. Mr. Piros said that issue has been solved.

Robyn Hineman stated she was surprised to learn that Ed Koper collected extra money to do the minutes and how did the Board come up with \$8.50 per hour. Mr. Piros said that is the rate for the

zoning secretary. The back to back meetings are legal, but not recommended.

Carol Braden, Wilmar Drive, had concerns about the sewer project on her street. Mr. Hovis said we are looking into the bond for Sugar and Mr. Piros said the trustees will be there for the walk through.

Fred Boughner, Wilmar Drive, asked if a petition from the residents would help in getting things done and Mr. Piros said that is not a bad idea.

Mr. Piros said the Board received a letter from Jim Jones of the Trumbull County Engineer's Office to Sugar Excavating Company notifying Mr. Sugar of the removal of workers associated with the East Central Sewer Project. There were numerous instances of disrespect to township residents.

Jack Hineman asked about Northview Drive that has no base. Are you going to rebuild like Wilmar Drive? Mr. Parke said he will remove the speed bumps and won't blacktop until next year.

Fred Boughner asked Mr. Bednar how is Morrow and Williams Zoned? The reply was single family dwellings.

Art Krellar, Andrews Drive, asked about the joint safety forces with the City of Cortland. Mr. Piros said we are talking with Cortland and this is 2-3 years down the road.

Bazetta Township recognizes the importance of prompt communication and availability of township Department Heads and/or other township employees as designated by the township trustees to efficiently and timely provide necessary township services for the health, safety and welfare of Bazetta Township residents. To facilitate prompt communication and availability of key township employees, the township may provide cellular phones to designated employees as deemed necessary. In providing cellular phones for this purpose, the following rules and regulations shall be followed:

- 1. The township may, at its option, to facilitate township business and the expeditious delivery of township services to its residents, issue and authorize the use of township-owned cellular phones to full-time Department Heads and employees. Every township employee issued a township cellilar phone for township business in the discharge of their employment duties shall read and become familiar with this policy and shall sign an acknowledgment that the employee has received and read a copy of this Cell Phone Policy.
- 2. Cellular phones that are purchased and provided by Bazetta Township are the sole property of Bazetta Township, and the primary use of the cellular phones is for township-related business. Township-issued cellular phones shall not be used as a replacement for a residential land-line phone. However, acknowledging that there may arise facts or circumstances which would make it reasonable and appropriate to use the township phone for limited personal usage, said personal usage will be permitted under the following guidelines:
- a. To contact family or household members regarding family emergencies and time sensitive matters for which an alternate phone is not readily available or practicable.
- b. Personal, financial and business matters which are time sensitive for which an alternative phone is not readily available or practicable.
- c. The township cellular phone should never be used for purely social and entertainment uses, and such are strictly prohibited.

Personal use of an assigned cellular phone shall be permitted to the extent that the personal use is reasonable and does not exceed the maximum usage time allocated to each phone under the cellular service contract so as not to incur additional usage charges to the phone in excess of the allotted minutes per billing period.

- 3. Township employees to whom cellular phones have been provided are responsible for the security and maintenance of the phones and must immediately report any damages, theft or vandalism to the Department Head/Supervisor or Trustees and must reimburse the township of any cost or expense for damage to the phone as a result of the negligence of the employee.
- 4. Safe use of the cellular phone is of the utmost importance. Precautionary measures should be taken if it is necessary to use the cellular phone while driving. It is suggested that the speakerphone feature be utilized or a hands-free device be used by the employee.

- 5. Ceilular phones may not be used to defame, harass, intimidate or threaten any other persons. Employees are prohibited from using their cellular phones in any illegal, illicit or offensive manner.
- 6. The township will not provide cellular phones to the township trustees. However, any township trustee using his personal cellular phone for township-related business shall be reimbursed by the township for the cost of the township business-related use of the personal cellular phone by submission of the trustee's cellular phone bill, designating or highlighting the phone calls that were made or received for township-related business and the itemized charge on the trustee's personal statement for that phone call. The trustee will be reimbursed the actual cost as indicated on the itemized billing statement per business call, calculated by dividing the total minutes incurred on the bill by the total charges on the bill to determine the cost per minute of the use of the phone and then reimbursing the township trustee for the minutes used at the charge per minute of the bill. If the business reimbursements minutes also include a long distance, roaming or premium service charge for the business minutes used, said charges will be reimbursed for that phone call.
- 7. If it is determined that a township employee violated this policy by incurring charges to the phone not authorized by this policy, the township employee shall be responsible for reimbursing the township for the cost of the unauthorized use of the phone in accordance with the formula prescribed in paragraph 6. If payment is not received within thirty (30) days of notice of the policy violation, the amount of the charge will be deducted from the employee's paycheck.
- 8. Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action against the township cellular phone user, including but not limited to reprimand, suspension or termination.
- 9. The township trustees or their designee shall review all township cellular phone billing statement at least quarterly to insure compliance with this policy and to identify any abuse.

Bazetta Township Trustees August 18, 2008 Zoning Change Hearing Minutes

A Zoning Change Hearing of the Bazetta Township Trustees was held on August 18, 2008 in the Township Hall at 5:00 PM. The purpose of this hearing was to address the proposed recommendations from the Bazetta Township Zoning Commission.

Members present: Michael Piros, Chairman

William Glancy, Vice Chairman

Paul Hovis, Member

Members absent: none

Also present: Larry Bednar, Zoning Inspector Deanna Boggess, Zoning Secretary

Members of the audience present: Barbara Rosier, ZBOA Member, Kenton Anderson, Darcie Loreno, Tribune, Michael Swiatwich, ZBOA Member, Theodore Webb, Roger Coe, Tom Schwartz.

Mr Piros called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM. He read the legal notice published in the Tribune Chronicle and the proposed amendments and adoptions. He then opened the Hearing for public testimony and swore in those wishing to speak.

Mr Piros called for all those wishing to testify FOR the proposed recommendations and there were none.

Mr Piros called for those wishing to testify AGAINST the proposed recommendations.

Roger Coe, 2677 McCleary-Jacoby Road. Mr Coe stated his name and address.

Theodore Webb, 1979 Timber Creek East. Mr Webb asked why are they raising the parking requirements for restaurants and feels will deter new businesses from considering Bazetta. He asked for clarification if it included restaurants. Mr Bednar read from the Zoning rules Section G restaurants, taverns etc..not including drive-in restaurants. One parking space for each hundred square feet of

floor area or for each two seats which ever results in the greater amount. Restaurants are covered under a different paragraph. Theaters, auditoriums, churches, stadiums and other places of assembly are what they are addressing.

Mr Webb asked if they are asking those to be doubled.

Mr Piros and Mr Bednar answered correct.

Mr Webb asked what is the reason behind it?

Mr Piros explained when this was put in the rules it was years ago and there weren't as many cars on the road and they are trying to update the parking facilities.

Mr Webb stated that he was hoping they weren't trying to push businesses out of the community and make us not favorable to attract new businesses.

Mr Piros stated that they are in a different category.

Michael Swiatkwich, 2445 Niles-Cortland Road. He is speaking toward the same amendment and didn't realize it was restricted to those businesses. But the same points that Ted made are valid points and should be taken into consideration. Even though there are vehicles on the road, with gas prices peaking at four dollars a gallon, people are car pooling. It seems that this is in anticipation of a potential problem. Is he correct in assuming that we haven't actually had a problem.

Mr Piros stated that we haven't and are looking to the future.

Mr Swiatkwich explained that Bazetta Township is still a community that has families. He explained any restriction or any change to the parking amendment as it stands right now would be not to the Township's best interest for the same points that Ted had mentioned. We don't really want to do anything to dissuade potential businesses from locating in Bazetta Township. Our tax base is pretty much out the window. So if a theater or some other gathering place chose to locate to this area, they might not because of the parking requirements.

Mr Piros said they will take this into consideration.

Kenton Anderson, 305 and Hoagland -Blackstub Road. They purchased the property recently and started the process of preparing the site and getting their requirements in line with what we need to do to build our church. Recently these

changes came to his attention. He is interested in the reason for the changes. As a new neighbor he wants to make sure he is clear about some of that purpose and is it truly going to materialize? We think we have a good plan and these are making it more difficult to build our church. We would like to understand a little bit better why. He just heard of the retention pond issue today. We have a civil engineer and if he would want to get the proper drainage that is a concern to the neighbors, he didn't know that your requirement for one pond would fit with his site plan for proper drainage on the property. It may. We have a large lot size, larger than the maximum is right now. With some of the concerns of the neighbors it seems that the larger lot size would enable us to really meet their concerns and having more land to work with we'd have a buffer to work with. It just seems more sensible that a larger lot size would actually benefit the intent of. Another issue is the parking spaces he wanted to reiterate what was said before. The maximum will imply that we will have a full building and we may have two services. He doesn't know what the future will hold for them but that is a big change in building requirements. He doesn't know that he can address it to the extent of the Board's concerns, if it is for future use he doesn't see how it will promote the benefit of this building going forward. He doesn't see the connection right now. He wants to understand better and since they're in the process he wants to work with the process and practical issues here to line up with the intent of zoning changes, the desires of the neighbors and the purpose of building of the church. He would like to work with that purpose if you can allow that.

Mr Piros that this Board, at this Hearing can not make a decision. This is a Hearing. This Board has twenty days after this hearing to render a decision on the Zoning Board's recommendations. We will definitely take into consideration the questions you have. We in particular as a Board, if I may speak for the Board, have had concerns with the ponds from citizens that have come to the Board at our regular meetings where their land has been flooded and all kinds of issues. That's the reason I can speak for the ponds. We've had those issues here. The parking issue, we will definitely take into consideration. The Board may take these one at a time and vote on these one at a time. That is something the Board will consider. The Board will not render any decision today on these recommendations. We are asking for your input.

Mr Anderson asked what more will it take? A meeting, discussion? Mr Piros explained that they will advertize when the Board will take action on these. There probably will have to be a special meeting in twenty days. Twenty days from now would not reach the next regular meeting. It's not till mid September. We will have a special meeting before that. It will be announced both

in the paper and on our web site, when the Board will take action on this.

Mr Anderson asked if that special meeting will be for discussing and better understanding the intend of the changes so he can better address their circumstances and understand the practicality of this.

Mr Piros explained that they may have someone from the Zoning Board here to answer those questions for you.

Mr Swiatkwich added that here is an example of a church wanting to relocate into the area, and addressing specifically the parking and acreage as an issue. They've expanded the three to five acres to ten acres as far as the Zoning Regs. At the same stroke, doubled its parking requirements. So the gains that the organization may have made as far as acreage, had just been eliminated by the parking changes. We heard the case twice and he would applaud and give him that for at least going through the due process and being patient.

Mr Piros asked for any other comments on the proposed Zone change?

Roger Coe. You mentioned the ponds, you said half acre or more?

Several people interjected about the pond size, lot size and minimum distance from property lines.

Mr Bednar explained that the intent was that no permit would be required for a pond under the half acre. It reads the minimum pond surface must be one half acre to be considered for a permit. You might read this that you can't build a pond unless it's a half acre.

Mr Coe explained that if you have a minimum five acres he doesn't see where you would have to do with it and you could have fifty acres and put a pond in or small lake and if it's not engineered correct it's still a threat. It needs to be basically engineered properly.

Mr Piros asked if it goes through Soil and Water? Mr Bednar answered yes, that's part of the requirement.

Mr Coe asked if they inspect it and give you any kind of direction?

Mr Bednar explained it's pretty stringent requirements.

Mr Coe asked if we had that in the past.

Mr Bednar answered no.

Mr Webb addressed the retention ponds and gave examples and explained that if a business wanted to construct a building, the County requires some sort of retention area and they are building it on two acres and the building required that area for control and they don't have five acres and they don't have one hundred feet on each side, and the pond is not going to be a half acre it's only going to be a hundred by thirty is that going to stop the construction of a commercial business coming into Bazetta. Is it classified as a pond or is it classified as a retention ditch. What are we going to call it.

Mr Piros asked if they gave a clarification on that?

Mr Bednar said no and that he is not on the Board he is the inspector but he attended a lot of the meetings that they had on this and that they received a recommendation from a lady that started this whole thing on ponds. Retention ponds were never discussed at any of the meetings at all. You bring up a good point about the retention ponds but I don't think that this was geared to retention ponds, This is more like recreational ponds.

Mr Webb stated that it doesn't say that.

Mr Bednar explained the reason that we have these kinds of meetings with these kinds of questions because it opens it up to anybody in the public community that can bring forth these ideas. We can really tailor these regulations.

Someone stated that we should define retention ponds as opposed to recreational ponds.

Mr Piros stated correct.

Mr Bednar stated that in his opinion retention ponds would not fall into this criteria. Retention ponds don't always have water in them. Basically are designed dry, That was not the intent of this regulation.

Mr Piros stated that the point is that it can be construed either way.

Mr Swiatwich explained that there is landscaping involved in some of you higher end homes it can be a real asset. I think there should be some distinction as to those types of ponds and landscape architecture.

Mr Piros stated they will take those things into consideration.

Mr Swiatwich questioned if the Soil and Water have input as to the size of the ponds to the size of the lot?

Mr Bednar explained that he gathered the regulations from the Soil and Water and gave info to the board.

Mr Swiatwich if he bought three acres for example. If he didn't want to cut grass and put in a pond, according to the Zoning Regs, He couldn't put in a pond. Even if he had the clearance and stuff like that. If you're talking a half acre pond and a three acre lot is a pretty nice size building lot and a half acre pond. What he's looking for is some way to assess the impact of the pond in regard to the land and the land around it. He explained the Soil and Water could give some input to the minimum acreage and the size of the pond. As to the pond size of an half an acre, he thinks is reasonable anything smaller than that it doesn't seem that you could get the depth certainly not enough to maintain the ponds integrity. It seems the half acre might be the way to go. It seems the five acres would have to comply. (Not sure if that was the word-comply) If you had three acres with out interfering with the surrounding properties and things like that. Just a verbal distinction for landscaping it's just language there. Not sure if you need to offer restrictions as far as size. It would seem that you need some sort of designation between the large pond and small pond in the back yard with a waterfall.

Mr Bednar explained that was the point of discussion and the reasoning for the half an acre pond would be that anything you're talking about like landscapes with the waterfalls and so forth, the thought was that those would be less than a half acre without being regulated. Those would be permitted and he would have no jurisdiction over those. Permit those by charging no fee. You can put those in all that you want to in your two or thee acres or whatever. But if you build a half acre or larger pond, then you need a permit and at least five acres to do that. Mr Swiatwich if the Trustees and the Zoning Board are comfortable with that it's fine, it's just another thought that possibly three acres could handle a half acre.

Mr Bednar said that would we could make it clearer.

Mr Coe said that is what he was referring to because he has two acres and if he wants to put in a little coy pond, in this little area would it limit something like that? If someone is building a large house and they want to put in a pond in they could put a half acre pond in as long as it was well engineered he wouldn't see an issue with that.

Mr Piros stated that those are good points.

Mr Webb asked when is the cut off if someone was to go a sixteenth of an acre we'd be ok with that? What dictates when and where and so forth? Do we go fifteen thirty seconds of an acre?

Mr Bednar stated he will be the guy who handles that as the Zoning Inspector.

Several people interjected making comments on how closely it would be regulated.

Mr Bednar stated if it is a half acre and upwards it will be regulated. The whole issue started with a pond being built and you see the other comment being the pond level should not be above the original land grade. A pond was built and a dam was made above the ground level. Other properties now sit below the pond water level. This was not approved by Soil and Water or anything. Now we've got an issue when heavy rains come. This has the threat of over flowing, the dam breaking. as a result flooding down stream and flooding properties that are below this level of water. The idea was that if you're going to build a pond in Bazetta Township, if it's going to be larger than a half acre. Anything smaller wouldn't be a threat to the surrounding home owners. You are going to have to dig the pond. You're not allowed to dam the water. That was some of the thinking around this.

Mr Piros asked for any other comments. Then he asked if the Board had any comments.

Mr Glancy stated that nobody mentioned a farm pond. I have a pond. I could not put in because my lot is only on hundred eighty five feet wide but I'm three thousand feet deep. Nobody could put in a pond. Andy Yount couldn't put his in. I could think of five ponds that could not be put in now.

Someone said most of those ponds were used as fire ponds.

Mr Glancy said what about farm ponds. There is some discussion that needs to be done here. He said this was brought to their attention because it was a threat to the

neighborhood kids. His pond was there when he bought his place in 1969. All Souls Cemetery has a beautiful pond right by the road. They couldn't put that in today because it's too close.

Several people injected about various ponds at various locations that could not be put in with this zone change.

Mr Glancy stated that whoever brought up the fire ponds had a good point. Everywhere in this township doesn't have water. Some of these ponds right by the road are the only source of water. If he made a pond a half acre he could make it five hundred feet deep. He knows that sounds ridiculous but it could be done and that would be a danger. He knows where this came from the lady was worried about her children and she should be.

Mr Swiatwich stated that if it's above grade it's a problem.

Mr Piros stated that you have a dam rather than a pond. There are some things we have to discuss. That's the purpose of the hearing.

Mr Glancy stated that they don't have ponds on the east side like they do on the west side. Mr Glancy asked Mr Anderson if there was a pond on the property that used to be a farm. They explained that there is no pond there.

People kept discussing where there were ponds through out the township.

Mr Glancy stated that his problem with a pond is that if he had a farm he would want a pond and he would want it were he could use it. We have to discuss it.

Several people discussed all the rain we had and some flooding.

Someone asked if we went out to other townships and looked at what they do.

Mr Piros stated that normally they do. He asked if there were any more comments and there were none. He advised that there would be notification in th paper when the next hearing would be.

Mr Piros adjourned the meeting at 5:40 PM.



Mr Piros asked for the last time for any one for the Zone Change. He then asked for testimony against the Zone Change.

Linda Goldberg, 1054 Bristol Champion Townline Road, Warren, Ohio stated I am the owner of B & K Farm Market, My husband and I have been there for nineteen and a half years. Kenny is going to be managing this new property even though it's in his mother's name. He used to rent from us. He rented from us for seven years. He's caused nothing but problems. He wants to now open up a business across the street from me. He doesn't have the permits he needs. He doesn't have the zoning he needs. I don't think it's a very good idea he open over there. He used to have the Greenery over on forty-six if he still has it I don't know. There was a lot of problems with the Greenery over there. You as Trustees should know what kind of problems he had over there. He has police records against him. He hasn't applied with the Health Department on his septic. I pay my bills. I pay my workman-comp taxes, everything. He doesn't. I don't think it's fair he open up. I pay for septic permits and all kind of stuff and I don't think it's fair. You guys got a letter from the Health Department asking you to hold off on his classification until he meets with those requirements. He says he will but Kenny's never met any of the requirements that he's supposed to. So he thinks that he is above the law and he can do anything he wants to do. And I don't think it's fair that he open a business in Cortland or Bazetta Township with that kind of an attitude. I'm all for Elm Road building. In fact I'd like to get the sewage through there. But I don't want people like that in our town. I think that you know, we have a lot of good businesses there, I think Elm Road could build a lot, but not with people like that. He just doesn't follow the rules, he doesn't do what he's supposed to do. He doesn't pay his taxes, he doesn't pay workman's comp, he doesn't carry unemployment. That's just good business sense things you're supposed to have when you run a business. I think if we all have to apply to that it also applies to him. He's not above the law. I had to take him to court because he didn't pay his rent. He rented from me fro seven years. After he was seven months late I took him to court. We won the court hearing. He has still not paid me. When I took him to court he, I took him just for his rent. Well, in the process he damaged my property. He tore down fences, tore wells out, did alot of destructive things to my property. I did win the case the court awarded me the money to pay his rent and to pay for the damage he did. He's never paid it. It's been a year and a half and I have to take him to court again this week to get some kind of resolution to this. He's not a trust worthy person. I don't think we need him in our township.

Mr Piros asked for anyone else to speak against the Zone Change?

Mr David Agues, 5065 Cory Hunt, Bristolville, Ohio stated I am the owner-operator of Bedrock Landscape supply on Elm Road. I am the gentleman that inherited this. (He then gave the Trustees a poster board of photographs) You will hear from Mr Flack and Mr Flack will tell you that he was going to clean this mess up. He made this mess with no intentions of cleaning it up. He had to be escorted off the property by the police. He doesn't play by the rules. He has his own set of rules. I'm all for friendly competition. But I don't think that you need this in your township. He you take a look down Elm road, Talyor rentals, B & K Market, my own place. Everyone around there is trying to clean up

and make it look better, not this. There's also trouble on forty on the property he's renting now. Even though his parents have got this property, he's going to be the one operating it. Hopefully he'll make a good decision. That's all I have to say.

Mr Piros asked one final time for anyone else to speak against the Zone Change. There was no one else. He then explained asked the Board if there was any discussion from the Trustees and there were none. He then explained that the decision will be done in a regular session with a motion on December 8th at noon after the work session. The Board will take into consideration the information they have been given this evening. It will be publicized in the paper and on the web-site.

Someone asked when it will come into affect and Mr Piros answered in thirty days after the decision.

A Public Hearing of the Bazetta Township Trustees was held on the \Im of December 2008 at the Township Hall. The purpose of this meeting was to hear public comment and testimony regarding amendments proposed by the Bazetta Township Zoning Commission.

Members present: Michael Piros, William Glancy and Paul Hovis.

Also present: Larry Bednar, Deanna Boggess and Theodore Webb.

Mr. Piros called the hearing to order at 7:00. He explained the purpose and procedures.

Mr. Piros asked Mr. Webb if he was going to testify to anything tonight.

Mr. Webb answered that he was there more or less to answer questions from the Trustees.

Mr. Piros stated, let's cover these one at a time.

The first proposed amendment to be addressed was section 30 definitions of add of #13. Lot Area; See Lot.

Mr. Piros asked, Larry can you enlighten us on that? I was trying to find this in the zoning book.

Mr. Bednar answered, under section 30, page 76 #33 lot. He then read the definition from the book.

Mr. Piros asked, so what are we actually saying here? So what actually are we saying here? Lot area, so we're defining lot area or we're added lot area to that? I'm not sure I understand.

Mr. Webb said there was a conversation about the word area and what the word meant. We had side yard area, lot area, parking lot area so I think what they, Larry, please correct me if I'm wrong but I think the Commission is going to re-examine this in our January meetings, on trying to find a more appropriate definition of the word area. So I think what we're doing right now is, the notes I have is we're removing the word area from the word lot area. Deanna is that the way you saw it too?

Mrs. Boggess said, actually we, the first time we presented the recommendations to the Trustees we were just going to add area and when we read the letter from the Planning Commission they wanted us to further define all the different areas. And so the members discussed with the people who had been here at the previous meetings, that actually it

was lot area that was brought up they were trying to make decisions on other matters, that kept coming up. What is an area what is you know. Somebody wanted to know what a lot area was, they said we already have a definition for that in lot.

Mr. Piros asked, so what you're saying is lot area refers to number 33 on page 76? Lot?

Mrs. Boggess answered, exactly.

Mr. Bednar asked if Mr. Piros read the minutes Deanna typed on the conversations that were held? It went on for a page and a half and it still doesn't make that clear.

Mr. Glancy said people in the audience were making too much noise right?

Mrs. Boggess answered, everybody kept talking over each other. It was hard to...

Mr. Glancy asked, can't the guy who runs the show say hey quiet?

Mr. Webb said we tried that.

Mrs. Boggess said yeah

Mr. Webb said it's confusing just exactly what we were trying to accomplish here.

Mr. Glancy said I was wondering how she was taking minutes, every other thing is too much noise coming from the audience.

Mrs. Boggess said exactly.

Mr. Glancy continued, you can't hear two conversations, I don't care who you are.

Mrs. Boggess said I brought that up at our different boards because it was happening with both boards.

Mr. Glancy asked same people?

Mrs. Boggess answered not always.

Mr. Glancy responded, okay, that's good.

Mr. Piros said okay, you guys approved putting lot area in lot? Is that it?

Mr. Webb as part of that definition as meaning the word lot, as using that definition under the word lot in number 33 on page 76.

Mr. Piros asked, well, it will say lot area?

Mr. Webb answered, lot area, yes.

Mr. Piros asked, any questions from the Board?

Mr. Glancy said, I still don't understand, is that a building lot? I know a building lot is ruled actually by the Planning Commission right?

Mr. Bednar said well, I hate to speak for anybody but...

Mr. Glancy said speak.

Mr. Bednar said, this whole thing started going back to the issues with the church and it says in here, not just the church that's what prompted this whole thing it says. Here the minimum lot area should be three acres and the maximum lot area shall be five acres. Well there was a lot of confusion being batted around as to what lot area meant. Does it mean the parcel of property? Does it mean the area of the parking? Somebody construed that to mean the area of the parking lot. And that was the initial thing on this whole thing was the parking lot.

Mrs. Boggess said that's exactly what they discussed.

Mr. Hovis said should they define whether it's a parking lot, building lot, I think that's the question Bill's asking. What area are they talking about?

Mr. Bednar said, well, I ruled out parking lot because I went back and told them I said as far as that goes we have that section in there that tells you that your, that a government, churches and schools must have one parking space for each four seats to be accommodated. So if you have a hundred seat church or whatever you accommodate that to one to four.

Mr. Glancy said if we don't know exactly what the guys mean we can't vote for it. I can't vote for it. You know it could come back and kick us in the head.

Mr. Webb said according to the Trumbull Planning Commission they're saying section 30 definitions proposed, they say add area to the list of definitions and reference lot as its definition. According to my notes, it says remove the word area and that I had as proposed we had proposed to add the word area added to the word lot area so I think what we were gonna do we were just gonna drop what we had originally proposed we had lot area and we were just gonna say lot. As apposed to lot area so we didn't have that contradict and confusion.

Mr. Hovis said, Well it's still not clear. And the way I understand it you guys were gonna structure... (Inaudible people talking at the same time) We can sit and talk about this all night.

Mr. Piros said, well we just asked a question.

Mr. Hovis said, well they're gonna work on it.

Mr. Webb said on the January session were gonna try and take what zoning commission or the planning commission said add area to the list of definitions. I think what we have to do is we have to define what we mean by area before we can use it in a reference in lot area before we make reference to the word area, so we haven't done that yet.

Mr. Glancy said, I can give you my opinion, I've known you a long time. I think the people that are moving in to Bazetta, and I'm not degrading the older ones that have been here. We've got some very, very intelligent people moving in. They want to know for sure exactly, before they buy that farm they want to know exactly doing. Am I right? Some of these people coming in are very intelligent. They gotta right to know if they're gonna spend their money.

Mr. Webb said, Not only that but we don't have all our i's dotted and t's crossed they're gonna take us to court on it.

Mr. Hovis said, exactly right

Mr. Glancy said, exactly right. You'll have chicken farms again.

Mr. Piros said, alright, let's move on to section 5 prohibited use waist containers. He then read the proposed amendment. He then asked, so you were going to add that to section five?

Mr. Glancy said, I had something cross my mind.

Mr. Piros said, go ahead.

Mr. Glancy continued, temporary waste containers are permitted for a period of construction permit. Could that be garbage cans? Nothing here of size. I mean, I spent a lot of time in court when I was working and I've seen things like this come up. Can that be a garbage can?

Mr. Bednar said, that's a temporary waste container.

Mr. Glancy said, that's a temporary waste container.

Mr. Webb said, we probably should state a size and... (Inaudible)

Mr. Glancy said, my first experience Ted, with dotting the i's and that with this Board was Andrews Drive. They wanted to stop the trucks from going down there on a detour till they came to the meeting and you know the garbage trucks, school buses they're all heavier than that truck was? Remember?

Mr. Webb answered I do remember.

Mr. Glancy said, so they can't go down there either. That was my first.

Mr. Piros asked, you're saying that a waste container is not defined?

Mr. Glancy replied, a waste container is not defined.

Mr. Hovis said, size, and then it says temporary waste containers no more than thirty days. Like I said, if you have a thing out there and you have a fire in your house, there gonna be there for six or seven months. This says that you can only have it there thirty days so, how can that be?

Mrs. Boggess said, I remember the board members discussing it and they said usually they all usually have a building permit when they have something like that's going on.

Mr. Hovis said, the building permit is only ninety days correct?

Mr. Bednar said, well yeah, ninety days to start your building permit. There's no wording in here that says you have to have your job done and built in a certain period of time. You could take two years to build.

Mr. Webb said, temporary waste containers are good for the period of a construction permit so as long as your having construction on your, I mean it could be up to two years I guess.

Mr. Glancy said, a good example is the water department in Warren.

(Inaudible)

Mr. Hovis said, this house in Cortland was burnt, two hundred thousand dollars worth of damage. Everything was internal. The garbage dumpster was there for six months.

Mr. Glancy added, Bill Dawson's was like that, almost a year.

Mr. Hovis continued, so where does this come into effect on a situation like that cause you actually don't get a building permit. You're not building.

Mr. Glancy said, I have a question for you Larry, maybe you can help me. A residential R-1 district it says you can't, like on Bazetta Road, you got residential and then you got a duplex. That was re-zoned. So you could build a duplex, but still is that a residential.

Mr. Bednar said, that would be an R-2.

Mr. Glancy asked, just that one house?

Mr. Bednar said, maybe that was re-zoned an R-2.

Mr. Glancy said, cause it says here R-1 District.

Mr. Bednar said, yeah, or if you've got an R-2 District which would be an apartment or a duplex, you can have that commercial dumpster.

Mr. Piros asked, are you taking some notes to take back? We appreciate you being here. (Mr. Webb)

Mr. Glancy asked, you guys know where Cheryl lives? Next two duplexes next to her have dumpsters. That's why it confused me cause across the street has dumpsters

Mr. Webb said, on oh I can't think of the name on Bazetta road there where he has that park behind him, oh gees, I can't think of the name of him. Maffitt Meadows he has those duplexes there. He's got the dumpsters behind his two duplexes there.

Mr. Bednar said, there's a couple on Durst Clagg um.

Mr. Glancy said, there's eleven on the west side that I counted. I don't know how many I didn't see.

Mr. Webb said, right there across the street on Johnson Plank across from the school there's two sets of duplexes there. They would be eligible for dumpsters there. You know those two duplexes right there.

Mr. Glancy said, Menzy's had one there for a hundred years. Right? Menzy's got one. That guy right there's got one.

Mr. Webb said, right there south of the (Inaudible)

Mr. Glancy said, no, right here.

Mr. Piros said, that needs defined.

Mr. Glancy said, he answered my question on that,

Mr. Webb asked, so we need to re-define the size of the container?

Mr. Glancy said, I would have to say you have to because I'll tell you honestly, I called.

Mr. Piros asked, to find what's permanent?

Mr. Glancy said, I called Sunburst to find out what's permanent and commercial. First of all they gotta be nailed down to before they're commercial.

Mr. Bednar said, the other thing that I could run into if I go out to enforce this you know, let's say BFI. BFI may say that that small one, probably about as big as that table here, like the kind we have down here and the ones up here, we're talking about those kinds, they may say those are residential and not commercial units. There, then in that definition here, I couldn't enforce it.

Mr. Webb said, you couldn't enforce it. Right.

Mr. Piros asked, its part of their garbage pick up id that what you're saying?

Mr. Bednar answered, if they determine those to be residential units and not commercial units, I would have nothing to...

Mr. Glancy said, well, to me a temporary waste container could be a garbage can.

Mr. Bednar said, I think define the size.

Mr. Glancy said, that's all size in regards...

Mr. Piros said, you know what? If we don't define it before it gets to be a resolution...

Mr. Glancy interjected, we're in trouble.

Mr. Piros said, because what happens is that we're arguing about this with the people. And we have no leg to stand on because we don't even know what it is. Alright, let's move on to item three, section 19.2 A. He then read the parking space recommendation. And that refers, where did I see that? Larry, where is that at in that book?

Mr. Bednar replied, nineteen two...

Mr. Piros asked, is that page 48 under theaters and churches A? Section A?

Mr. Hovis said, any new business coming in now they have to have so may parking spaces.

Mr. Bednar read the parking space regulations from the zoning book.

Mr. Piros asked, so you increased, did I interpret that right?

Mr. Webb explained, the original proposal was to get it down to two.

Mr. Bednar said, so that you'd have a bigger parking lot.

Mr. Webb continued, right. That was rejected by this board. Back in August, I believe it was.

Mr. Piros said, yeah, so, question becomes, if I hear you correctly, is because I drive a stake in, does that mean that it'd permanent? Because I drove a stake in the ground?

Mr. Glancy said, if it's fastened down, That's my question.

Mr. Piros asked, Ted, do you understand?

Mr. Webb said, what's stated here is regulated in chapter thirty- one of the Ohio Building Code. I don't have a copy of that Ohio Building Code to define what a temporary membrane or permanent membrane structure. Larry, do you have that?

Mr. Glancy said, we'll have to look it up that's all.

Mr. Bednar answered, I don't but let me interject here one thing. Under our definitions section thirty, number forty-seven. For the purpose of this Resolution, a structure or building is anything erected, constructed or reconstructed on a foundation, posts, piles, blocks, skids, sills, or any other support, whether such foundations, posts, piles, blocks, skids, sills, or other support is or is not permanently located in or attached to the soil.

Mr. Glancy asked, so it's gotta have a foundation?

Mr. Bednar answered, (inaudible) a structure is what I understand.

Mr. Glancy asked, if it doesn't' have a foundation.

Mr. Bednar said yeah, because you just put it on a like a (inaudible) or attach it to posts or pile, blocks, skids, sills or any other support is or is not permanently attached to the soil.

Mr. Glancy asked, so you would need a permit then?

Mr. Bednar answered, you would need a permit for them, yeah.

Mr. Glancy said, that answered the question.

Mr. Bednar said, that's the way I read that. What we would do with the word membrane structure...

Mr. Glancy interjected, right, everything's a matter of interpretation.

Mr. Bednar said, right. Do we consider them temporary or permanent?

Mr. Webb said, well I think is actually defined by the Ohio Building Code then.

Mr. Glancy said, I think so.

Mr. Webb continued, at that point there, that, that definition under the Ohio Building Code whether it's a permanent or temporary structure.

Mr. Glancy said, you know what the trouble is Ted, there's a lot of new things coming up. Fives years ago, nobody had them.

Mrs. Boggess said, the Trumbull County Planning Commission refers to that also.

Mr. Glancy asked, oh did they?

Mrs. Boggess replied, yeah, they said with the following suggestions, permanent and temporary structures are defined and regulated as defined under Chapter thirty-one of the Ohio Building Code, both of which require plan approval from the Trumbull County Building Official. And then it goes on.

Mr. Glancy asked, did we get a copy of that?

Mrs. Boggess answered, I gave you guys all copies, I can make more.

Mr. Glancy asked, you what?

Mrs. Boggess answered, I gave you guys a copy...yeah...

Mr. Glancy asked, this is what I have right here?

Mrs. Boggess, answered, yeah.

Mr. Glancy asked, is that this packet here you gave us?

Mrs. Boggess answered, should be, everything that, I did give this all to you guys.

Mr. Piros asked, any other questions on temporary or membrane structures?

Mr. Bednar said, permanent.

Mr. Piros asked, what's that?

Mr. Bednar replied, I said that's permanent not temporary. What are we going to do with temporary?

Mr. Glancy said, temporary's not under...right here.

Mr. Piros said right.

Mr. Piros said, not to exceed. Well are you considering a temporary membrane structure as a tent?

Mr. Webb answered, well, not taking into consideration tents. Tents would be a completely different structure. In our conversation that was one of the questions like, Burnett Pools when they have a tent sale, they construct a tent for the weekend, we would not consider that a membrane structure. Membrane structures was a, there's a definite definition, a very defined definition for a membrane structure its completely different than a tent. Isn't that the way we had that discussion Larry?

Mr. Bednar answered yeah. But I still... you know...

Mr. Piros said, well we don't...

Mr. Bednar continued, I have, to me its not clear cut to how I have to enforce it.

Mr. Webb said, right yeah that's the question how you enforce it. Do they still apply for a ...

Mr. Piros interjected, what's the definition of a membrane structure?

Mr. Webb, again, we have to go to that Ohio, I would think we have to go to that definition in the Ohio Building Code on that. I don't know, as to how it's defined as to what a temporary structure is, a temporary membrane structure is.

Mr. Bednar said, it has to meet certain fire codes and so forth it doesn't define materials or what it's made out of. It could be made of plastic or vinyl or canvas or...

Mr. Piros asked, I mean how do you enforce that? My question is if you're coming to me and saying I have a membrane, by that building code thing, it does say that you know, I got canvas or I've got... it's aluminum. I'm gonna park a car in there, store whatever. Does it define any membrane structure?

Mr. Glancy said, I'll tell you what the problem is (inaudible)

Mr. Piros said yeah.

Mr. Webb said, so what we need to do then as a board, is...

Mr. Piros interjected, as a board, we need to define what a membrane structure is. Whether we consider a membrane structure. Then that defines it a little clearer when you go out.

Mr. Bednar said, that, permanent and temporary. Because if a guy puts one up to cover his motor-home for the winter, I go up tell him he can't do that, in a R-1 or R-2 because it's a permanent membrane structure he says, oh no, it's temporary. As soon as the weather breaks then that take it down and put it away then takes it out next year.

Mr. Piros said, so we need to clearly define that then? Okay. Any other comments on that? All right we'll move on. Let's move on to item six regarding churches and other religious buildings. He then read the proposed amendment.

Mr. Glancy asked, there's that word lot area again right?

Mr. Webb said yeah.

Mr. Glancy asked, does that mean everything. The building, the grounds?

Mr. Piros asked, isn't that what we got into an argument over last time? Lot and Lot Area?

Mr. Glancy answered, yep you're right.

Mrs. Boggess said, that's why they addressed it in the definitions in the first recommendation.

Mr. Glancy asked, if you want to put a church up you can't use no more than ten acres?

Mr. Webb said, right now our zoning regulation is five acres so we're actually giving, we're doubling what they're actually allowing them to do now. I don't know whether it's a mute point or not because Federal Law may super-cede what we have written.

Mr. Glancy said, well, they always do. How many churches in Bazetta Township have over ten acres?

Mr. Webb answered, none but...

Mr. Glancy asked, how about six of them?

Mr. Webb said, but I mean if you go down to Houston Texas they have these mega churches where you could have...

Mr. Glancy said, we're not in Houston Texas.

Mr. Webb said, but I mean Federal Court... if someone wanted to bring one here in to Bazetta Township and build one that could house twenty thousand people, we're stuck.

Mr. Glancy said, my problem is this, you know I belong to Bazetta Christian. They took our youth program out because we don't have no room for them. I mean we got room for the kids inside but we didn't have room for them to play ball because we put a play ground in for the little ones in the nursery it's gone you know, no base ball teams no nothing, because the kids don't have room for it. I though that's what churches were about. The old and the kids. Where's Santa gonna bring his sled down?

Mr. Webb said, fairgrounds.

Mr. Glancy said, oh they don't go under zoning.

Mr. Piros asked if there were any other questions?

Mr. Glancy answered no I don't.

Mr. Bednar said I think we ought to address this minimum of three, maximum. I don't know if ought to spell it out (inaudible)

Mr. Piros said, Okay telecommunication towers is handled under Ohio Revised Code.

Mr. Webb said, that all came about in September. The Ohio Revised Code kind of took it out of our hands.

Mr. Glancy said they're putting a new one up now on forty-six?

Mr. Piros asked, where at on forty-six?

Mr. Glancy answered, back of the golf course I saw it going back, backing up there on a semi the other day. I'd like to have about three of them in my back yard.

Mr. Piros said, yeah, I heard they pay the landowner a thousand dollars a month.

Mr. Piros asked if there were any other questions on this? That concludes the hearing.

Mr. Webb said as a board we need to examine area or redefine area. And waste containers, we need to re-examine that again as far the, consider what is permanent and also the size of the containers. Parking spaces right now till we get your response to that I don't have anything to do on that. Section 32 on ponds we will wait for your evaluation on that. Membrane structures looks like we have a little more work to do on that defining what a membrane structure is and what a permanent and temporary structure is. Section 4 on churches and other religious buildings no questions at this point of course again we need to tighten up the definition of area is. Telecommunication towers that's no required.

Mr. Bednar said, on that church thing let's look at the minimum of three, maximum of five also.

Mr. Webb asked, what do you mean minimum of three, maximum of five?
